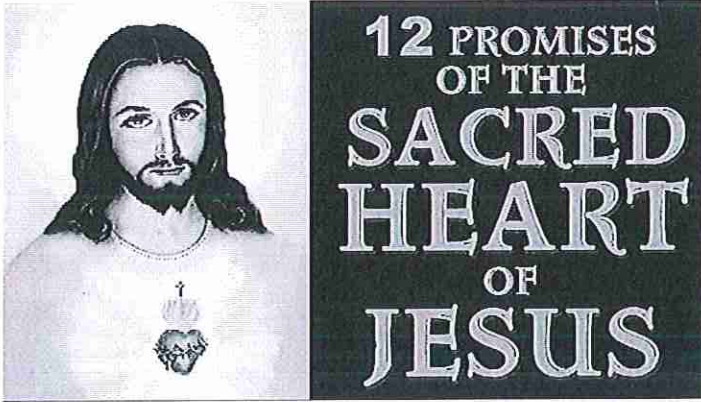

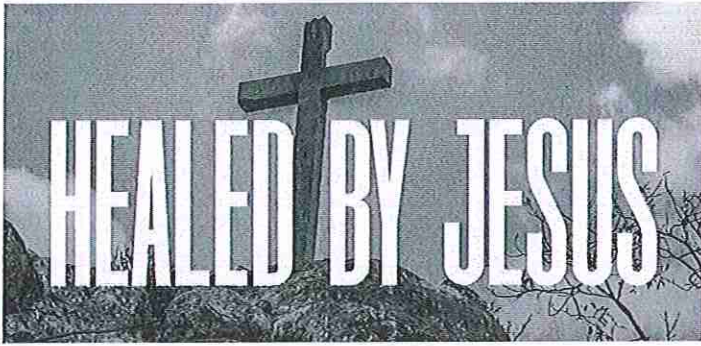

HOW TO RISE FROM THE DEAD

“God formed man to be imperishable; the image of His own nature He made him.” —Wisdom 2:23

The Lord wants us to rise from the dead. He will do this by His almighty power, but we must let it be done (see Lk 1:38). We let the Lord raise us from the dead by believing in Him. Jesus told Jairus at the news of his daughter’s death: “Fear is useless. What is needed is trust” (Mk 5:36). At the cemetery following Lazarus’ death, Jesus likewise said: “I am the Resurrection and the Life: whoever believes in Me, though he should die, will come to life” (Jn 11:25-26). We believe Jesus not only concerning the resurrection, but in everything. We believe Jesus’ words that if we feed on His Flesh and drink His Blood, we have life eternal and will be raised from the dead (Jn 6:54). We believe that, if we die with Jesus through Baptism and daily self-denial, we will live with Jesus forever (see 2 Tm 2:11). We believe that Jesus baptizes us in the Holy Spirit (Mk 1:8) and we even believe that the Spirit dwelling within us will raise us from the dead (Rm 8:11). Our resurrection from the dead is part of our salvation in Jesus. Therefore, resurrection is a free gift to be claimed by faith. Let us believe in Jesus and look forward with joy to our deaths. In Jesus, our souls will rise immediately at our death, and our bodies will rise on the last day when Jesus comes again (Catechism, 997).

Prayer: Father, give me faith to move mountains (Mt 17:20), even the mountain of death.

Promise: Just as you are rich in every respect, in faith and discourse, in knowledge, in total concern, and in the love we bear you, so may you abound in this charity.” —2 Cor 8:7

Praise: “Your father Abraham rejoiced that he might see My day. He saw it and was glad” (Jn 8:56). Praise the risen Jesus, eternal Son of God!

CÓMO RESUCITAR

“Dios creó al hombre para que fuera incorruptible y lo hizo a imagen de su propia naturaleza” (Sabiduría 2:23). El Señor quiere que resucitemos. Lo hará por su poder todopoderoso, pero debemos dejar que se haga (ver Lc 1:38). Dejamos que el Señor nos resucite de entre los muertos al creer en Él. Jesús le dijo a Jairo ante la noticia de la muerte de su hija: “No temas, basta que creas” (Mc 5:36). En el cementerio después de la muerte de Lázaro, Jesús también dijo: “Yo soy la Resurrección y la Vida. El que cree en Mí, aunque muera, vivirá” (Jn 11:25-26). Creemos a Jesús no solo con respecto a la resurrección, sino en todo. Creemos en las palabras de Jesús de que si nos alimentamos de Su carne y bebemos Su sangre, tendremos vida eterna y resucitaremos en el último día (Jn 6:54). Creemos que, si morimos con Jesús por medio del bautismo y abnegación diaria, viviremos con Jesús para siempre (ver 2 Tim 2:11). Creemos que Jesús nos bautiza en el Espíritu Santo (Mc 1:8) e incluso creemos que el Espíritu que mora en nosotros nos resucitará (Rom 8:11). Nuestra resurrección de la muerte es parte de nuestra salvación en Jesús. Por lo tanto, la resurrección es un regalo gratuito para ser reclamado por la fe. Creemos en Jesús y esperamos con alegría nuestras muertes. En Jesús, nuestras almas se levantarán inmediatamente después de nuestra muerte, y nuestros cuerpos se levantarán el último día cuando Jesús venga de nuevo (Catecismo, 997).

Oración: Padre, dame fe para mover montañas (Mt 17:20), incluso la montaña de la muerte.

Promesa: “Y ya que ustedes se distinguen en todo: en fe, en elocuencia, en ciencia, en toda clase de solicitud por los demás, y en el amor que nosotros les hemos comunicado, espero que también se distingan en generosidad” (2 Co 8:7).

Alabanza: “Abraham, el padre de ustedes, se estremeció de gozo, esperando ver mi Día: lo vio y se llenó de alegría” (Jn 8:56). ¡Alabado sea Jesús resucitado, eterno Hijo de Dios!

2. Always pray for people who are sick. Your prayers can help them get better, or they might help your sick friend to understand why God is letting them suffer.



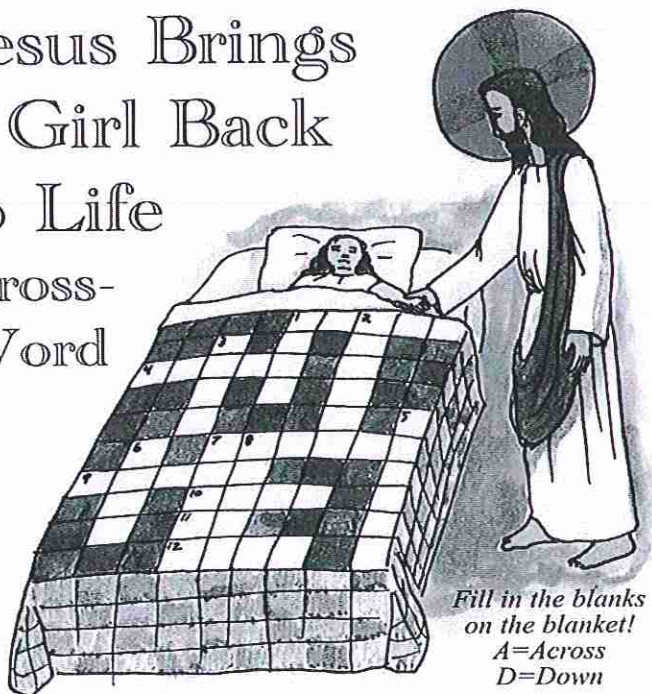
