Second Sunday of Easter ***April 16, 2023***


Dear Parishioners,
 Happy and Blessed Feast of Divine Mercy!!!
 This weekend is the Second Sunday of Easter, also known as “**Divine Mercy Sunday**”. Before St. Pope John Paul II died back in 2005, he officially made this Sunday the “Sunday of Divine Mercy”, named after the revelations that Jesus Himself gave to a Polish nun St. Maria Faustina Kowalska less than a century ago. St. Faustina lived from 1905 to 1938. In Jesus’ Messages to Sr. Faustina, He asked that an image of His Divine Mercy be painted, showing how full of love and mercy He is for His people. You can see this beautiful Image below this article. Notice the blood and water which is flowing from Jesus’ Heart. The Blood represents the Blood of Christ in the Eucharist, and the water represents the Sacrament of Baptism. Jesus’ left hand is pointing to His Merciful Heart, and His right hand is giving a blessing. My brothers and sisters, God is so merciful toward us. The whole Bible speaks of His Mercy and Love toward us, even though we have turned away from Him and His commandments time and time again. Let us come to His Mercy, seeking forgiveness from our sins, and let us not be afraid to tell others about His mercy for them. God Bless!

CONSUMED BY MERCY (HEB 12:29)

“My Lord and my God!” —John 20:28
God is “rich in mercy” (Eph 2:4). Jesus was consumed by Divine Mercy (see Heb 12:29). This mercy poured out of Him during His public ministry. In those three years, Jesus performed all the spiritual and corporal works of mercy, healing, and teaching, persevering despite opposition. Yet this outpouring of the works of mercy was not enough to satisfy Him. The restlessness of Divine Mercy flowing through His body led Him to offer Himself as a sacrifice on the Cross to atone for all the sins of mankind.

Jesus was in anguish until His mercy could be poured out (Lk 12:50). Even hanging in agony on the Cross, Jesus’ desire to give mercy came forth from His lips, as He exclaimed: “I am thirsty” (Jn 19:28). The image of Divine Mercy depicts the twin rays of mercy streaming from the heart of Jesus, signifying blood and water that issued from His pierced side.

Will you satisfy Jesus’ thirst by receiving His mercy? There is a cost to receiving mercy; once received, you must freely give mercy (Mt 10:8). Mercy is the treasure, the pearl of great price (Mt 13:44-46); it will consume you and cost all you have (Heb 12:29). As with Jesus, mercy cannot rest until it bursts forth from you to the world. Satisfy Jesus’ thirst. Drink from the fountain of His mercy and let Him transform you into His ambassador of mercy for a sinful, wounded world.

Prayer: Lord of Mercy, may your priests be ambassadors of Divine Mercy to Your people. Pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy for priests.

Promise: “His mercy endures forever.”
—Ps 118:2

Praise: “The Lord is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and of great kindness” (Ps 145:8). Risen Jesus, Your mercy sustains us.




Eucharistic Adoration



 ¡Feliz y bendita fiesta de la Divina Misericordia! Este fin de semana es el Segundo Domingo de Pascua, también conocido como “**Domingo de la Divina Misericordia**”. Antes de que el Papa San Juan Pablo Segundo muriera en 2005, hizo oficialmente este domingo el "Domingo de la Divina Misericordia", llamado así por las revelaciones que Jesús mismo dio a una monja polaca, Santa María Faustina Kowalska, hace menos de un siglo. Santa Faustina vivió de 1905 a 1938. En los Mensajes de Jesús a Santa Faustina, pidió que se pintara una imagen de Su Divina Misericordia, que muestra cuán lleno de amor y misericordia está para Su pueblo. Puede ver esta hermosa Imagen debajo de este artículo. Observe la sangre y el agua que fluye del Corazón de Jesús. La Sangre representa la Sangre de Cristo en la Eucaristía, y el agua representa el Sacramento del Bautismo. La mano izquierda de Jesús está apuntando a Su Corazón misericordioso y Su mano derecha está dando una bendición. Mis hermanos y hermanas, Dios es tan misericordioso con nosotros. Toda la Biblia habla de Su Misericordia y Amor hacia nosotros, aunque nos hemos apartado de Él y Sus mandamientos una y otra vez. Vayamos a Su Misericordia, buscando el perdón de nuestros pecados, y no tengamos miedo de decirles a otros acerca de Su misericordia para ellos. ¡Dios les bendiga! Padre Sístare

Jesús, en Ti Confío

CONSUMIDOS POR LA MISERICORDIA (HEB 12:29)

“¡Señor mío y Dios mío!” (Juan 20:28)

Dios es “rico en misericordia” (Ef 2:4). Jesús fue consumido por la Divina Misericordia (ver Heb 12:29). Esta misericordia se derramó de Él durante Su ministerio público. En esos tres años, Jesús realizó todas las obras espirituales y corporales de misericordia, curación y enseñanza, perseverando a pesar de la oposición. Sin embargo, este derramamiento de las obras de misericordia no fue suficiente para satisfacerlo. La abundancia de la Divina Misericordia fluyendo por Su cuerpo lo llevó a ofrecerse como sacrificio en la cruz para expiar todos los pecados de la humanidad.

Jesús estaba en angustia hasta que su misericordia pudiera ser derramada (Lc 12:50). Incluso colgado en la agonía de la cruz, el deseo de Jesús de dar misericordia brotó de Sus labios, mientras exclamaba: “Tengo sed” (Jn 19:28). La imagen de la Divina Misericordia representa los rayos gemelos de la misericordia que brotan del corazón de Jesús, lo que significa sangre y agua que brotaron de Su costado traspasado.

¿Saciarás la sed de Jesús al recibir Su misericordia? Hay un costo por recibir misericordia; una vez recibido, debes dar misericordia gratuitamente (Mt 10:8). La misericordia es el tesoro, la perla preciosa (Mt 13:44-46); te consumirá y te costará todo lo que tienes (Heb 12:29). Como con Jesús, la misericordia

no puede descansar hasta que brota de ti al mundo. Sacia la sed de Jesús. Bebe de la fuente de Su misericordia y deja que Él te transforme en Su embajador de misericordia para un mundo pecador y herido.

Oración: Señor de la Misericordia, que tus sacerdotes sean embajadores de la Divina Misericordia para Tu pueblo. Reza la Coronilla de la Divina Misericordia por los sacerdotes.

Promesa: “¡Es eterno Su amor!” (Sal 118:2).

Alabanza: “El Señor es bondadoso y compasivo, lento para enojarse y de gran misericordia” (Sal 145:8). Jesús resucitado, Tu misericordia nos sostiene.


