Fourth Sunday of Advent

December 24, 2023

Dear Parishioners,

As we prepare to celebrate the beautiful feast of **Christmas**, I would like to share with you the following meditation from the Diary of St. Maria Faustina Kowalska. St. Faustina is the Polish Nun that Jesus appeared to in the 1930's with the Divine Mercy Image, as well as giving her numerous revelations and messages about His Divine Mercy. On Christmas Eve in 1937, St Faustina wrote of one such encounter with the Holy Child: *"When I arrived at Midnight Mass, from the very beginning I steeped myself in deep recollection, during which time I saw the stable of Bethlehem filled with great radiance. The Blessed Virgin, all lost in the deepest of love, was wrapping Jesus in swaddling clothes, but Saint Joseph was still asleep. Only after the Mother of God put Jesus in the manger did the light of God awaken Joseph, who also prayed. But after a while, I was left alone with the Infant Jesus who stretched out His little hands to me, and I understood that I was to take Him in my arms. Jesus pressed His head against my heart and gave me to know, by His profound gaze, how good He found it to be next to my heart"* (Diary of St Faustina, 1442). This beautiful experience that St. Faustina had with Jesus can also happen to us, as we take time to meditate and contemplate what Christmas is all about: that God Himself loves each one of us SO MUCH, that He became a little Child for us, to open up the way of salvation for us. Christmas is all about CHRIST'S MASS, and every time that we come to the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and allow ourselves to truly enter into it, we can also experience a personal, loving relationship with Jesus Christ, like St. Faustina describes in her above reflection. God Bless and Merry Christmas!

A “MARY,” MERRY CHRISTMAS

“Mary said to the angel, ‘How can this be...?’ ” —Luke 1:34

To have a true Christmas, to meet Christ at Mass in a new, glorious way during the Christmas season, we must have a “Mary” Christmas and love Jesus as Mary does. To have a “Mary” Christmas, we should:

not fear (Lk 1:30),
be filled with God’s grace (Lk 1:30),
have “the Holy Spirit...come upon” us (Lk 1:35),
believe that “nothing is impossible with God” (Lk 1:37),
rejoice in being the Lord’s servants, that is, the slaves of the Lord (Lk 1:38),
“let it be done” to us according to God’s Word (Lk 1:38),
trust “that the Lord’s words” to us will “be fulfilled” (Lk 1:45),
proclaim “the greatness of the Lord” and find “joy in God” our Savior (Lk 1:46-47),
“be pierced with a sword” of sorrow (Lk 2:35),
“do whatever [Jesus] tells” us and tell others to do the same (Jn 2:5),
be at the foot of Jesus’ cross (Jn 19:25), and together devote ourselves to constant prayer for a new Pentecost (Acts 1:14).
A “Mary” Christmas is a Christmas of faith, joy, self-sacrifice, obedience, evangelistic zeal, redemptive suffering, praise-filled worship, and constant prayer in the Holy Spirit.

“Mary” Christmas!

Prayer: Jesus, may You get what You want for Christmas.

Promise: “The favors of the Lord I will sing forever; through all generations my mouth shall proclaim Your faithfulness.” — Ps 89:2

Praise: “Blessed be the Lord the God of Israel because He has visited and ransomed His people” (Lk 1:68).



Cuarto Domingo de Adviento

24 de Diciembre, 2023

Queridos feligreses,

Mientras nos preparamos para celebrar la hermosa fiesta de la **Navidad**, me gustaría compartir con ustedes la siguiente meditación del Diario de Santa María Faustina Kowalska. Santa Faustina es la Monja polaca a la que Jesús se le apareció en la década de 1930 con la Imagen de la Divina Misericordia, además de darle numerosas revelaciones y mensajes sobre Su Divina Misericordia. En la víspera de Navidad de 1937, Santa Faustina escribió sobre uno de esos encuentros con el Santo Niño: "*Cuando llegué a la Misa de medianoche, desde el principio me sumergí en un profundo recuerdo, durante el cual vi el estable de Belén lleno de gran resplandor. La Santísima Virgen, toda perdida en lo más profundo del amor, envolvía a Jesús en pañales, pero San José seguía dormido. Solo después de que la Madre de Dios puso a Jesús en el pesebre, la luz de Dios despertó a José, quien también oraba. Pero después de un tiempo, me quedé solo con el Niño Jesús que extendió sus pequeñas manos hacia mí, y comprendí que debía tomarlo en mis brazos. Jesús presionó su cabeza contra mi corazón y me dio a conocer, con Su mirada profunda, lo bueno que encontró estar junto a mi corazón*"(Diario de Santa Faustina, 1442). Esta hermosa experiencia que Santa Faustina tuvo con Jesús también nos puede suceder a nosotros, cuando nos tomamos un tiempo para meditar y contemplar de qué se trata la Navidad: que Dios mismo nos ama a cada uno de nosotros TANTO, que se convirtió en un pequeño Niño para nosotros, para abrirnos el camino de la salvación. La Navidad se trata de la MISA DE CRISTO, y cada vez que venimos al Santo Sacrificio de la Misa y nos permitimos entrar verdaderamente en el, también podemos experimentar una relación personal y amorosa con Jesucristo, como Santa Faustina describe en su reflexión. Dios los bendiga y Feliz Navidad! Padre Sistare

"hacer lo que [Jesús] nos diga" y decir a los demás que hagan lo mismo (**Jn 2:5**),
estar al pie de la cruz de Jesús (**Jn 19:25**), y juntos nos dedicarnos a la oración constante por un nuevo Pentecostés (**Hch 1:14**).

Una Navidad como la de María es una Navidad de fe, gozo, sacrificio, obediencia, celo evangelístico, sufrimiento redentor, adoración llena de alabanza y oración constante en el Espíritu Santo.

Christmas is almost here!




