Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Let me introduce myself to each of you. My name is Fr. Mauricio Antonio Romero Viquez, a Costa Rican national, born on April 2, 1978. I am the eldest son of two siblings (Pablo and Alejandra). I grew up in a simple Catholic family in Cartago, Costa Rica. My parents' names are Fernando Romero Camacho and Miriam Viquez Garita. From a very early age, I felt the call to the priestly vocation (around the age of seven). I entered the Order of Friars Minor Capuchin in 1997, professed my simple vows in 1999, made my perpetual profession in 2004, and was ordained a deacon in December 2005 and a priest on July 1, 2006. I currently have special permission from my Capuchin Order to serve pastorally in the Diocese of Providence, which I have served since March 2023, initially as chaplain to the Hispanic and Italian Community at Holy Ghost (Providence) and chaplain to the Hispanic Community at St. Joseph (Newport). On July 1st, he was appointed pastor of St. John the Baptist (Pawtucket) and simultaneously chaplain of the Hispanic Community of St. Joseph (Newport). This means that I must divide my pastoral service from Sunday afternoon to Tuesday morning at St. Joseph, Newport, and the rest of the week at St. John the Baptist. I must be very sincere with each of you, brothers and sisters, like St. Augustine of Hippo (Book of Confessions), in which he recounts his personal experience (Sin - Grace). This is my first experience as a parish priest. During my 19 years of priesthood, I served in the Capuchin Order as a trainer and university professor in different seminaries (Nicaragua, Costa Rica). I was twice a pastoral administrator of two beautiful parishes in Nicaragua (briefly). The rest of my time was devoted to my studies: Moral Theology (Rome, 2006-2009), Master's in Franciscan Formation (Rome, 2009-2010), first semester of Biblical Diploma (Jerusalem, 2011), and Bachelor's degree in Psychology (Costa Rica, 2012-2015). Before traveling to the USA, I had the opportunity to work pastorally in a mission parish in Nicaragua, in Rama (San Isidro Labrador Parish). It was a wonderful opportunity and a personal challenge, as it was a parish with 100 communities that were visited three times a year (a summer tour, a winter tour, and, if possible, to celebrate their patron saint). It was quite an odyssey to reach these mountain communities. The missionary would leave on Mondays at 7 a.m. by boat (a four-hour journey upriver). Upon arrival at the landing point, a "baquiano" (a local resident) would accompany the missionary. Then a two-hour horseback ride would

take place. Upon arrival at the chapel, there would be a meeting with the pastoral workers (catechists, delegates of the Word), followed by catechism, followed by Holy Mass (where the sacraments were celebrated, if any: baptisms, first communions, and marriages). Then confessions, and finally, a visit to the sick (sometimes a two-hour ride from the chapel, in the middle of the mountains). The next day, the missionary would bathe in the river and have breakfast.... Thus, the mission continued on horseback to visit another community in the mountains (on horseback, by boat, "in a car where it was possible," or on foot). The tour ended on Saturday and Sunday, when the parish and the chapels surrounding the city would be attended to. It was a wonderful experience of spiritual growth (for me personally), of faith, and of the witness of these people. Continuing with my "confessions," my English is not fluent (I can understand, speak a little, and celebrate the sacraments), so I ask for your understanding and, at the same time, that you can be my teachers in correcting and forgiving me for any misunderstandings regarding pronunciation and the celebration of the sacraments.

Regarding my pastoral service, I wish to assume my Franciscan charism of being a brother among you, aware of a pastoral responsibility, who desires to journey, accompany, and encourage in the faith as a brother, in the celebration of the sacraments and in formation. I wish to echo the words of the Holy Father Francis: "a Church that goes forth." That is, I am available to assist you in confession, spiritual direction, and visiting the sick (anointing of the sick), according to your possibilities (because in my short experience, it is easier for me to adapt to your schedule than for you to adapt to office hours), and to accompany pastoral groups. I fondly remember my years of study at the Alphonsian Academy (Rome), where I had the opportunity to learn about the life of Saint Alphonsus Maria de Liguori (founder of the Redemptorists). What is theology? It is done through pastoral experience (closeness to the community) and the roles with which the saintly moralist described the office of the Confessor: Father (charity toward the penitent), Physician (informing oneself about the penitent's situation), Doctor (a man of science, up-to-date with what is happening in the world), and Judge (a man who listens, examines, and then delivers judgment with charity). I thank Father Sistare, who was kind enough to welcome me as a brother and for his patience in introducing me to the parish life of St. John the Baptist (pastoral and financial). May God bless him and accompany him in

(pastoral and financial). May God bless him and accompany him in his priestly ministry in the new mission that the diocese has entrusted to him. I also thank Sue Carlino for her kindness in explaining to me step by step the current economic situation in the parish and the steps to follow in this transition. May we imitate our patron saint, St. John the Baptist, as the evangelist St. John describes him: "He must increase, but I must decrease" (John 3:30). St. John the Baptist, pray for us.

CAN GOD COMFORT YOU?

"As a mother comforts her son, so will I comfort you." —Isaiah 66:13

In today's first reading, Isaiah prophesies that the Lord longs to comfort His people as a mother longs to comfort her infant: "Oh, that you may suck fully of the milk of her comfort, that you may nurse with delight at her abundant breasts!" (Is 66:11; see also Is 40:1) Will we relax and trust God's providential care for us? Or will we resist and stiffen, refusing God's comfort?

Jesus plans to send us out as His workers and missionaries. For us to be effective in the mission field, we must trust completely in our Father's care. Jesus calls us to be "lambs in the midst of wolves" (Lk 10:3). Consider that God the Father sent His Son Jesus to earth as an infant Lamb in the midst of wolves. Jesus totally trusted Mary and Joseph to care for Him, even though wolves such as King Herod sought to put Him to death (Mt 2:16-18).

Jesus wants us to be missionaries who trust the Father as infants trust their parents. He sends us out without "walking staff or traveling bag" so we cannot trust in our own provisions, but only in what the Father provides (Lk 10:4). He tells us not to move from house to house and to eat whatever is set before us (Lk 10:7). This is so we won't seek comfort in lodging and food; instead we imitate children who eat what their parents put on the table. Thus we can focus not on our own needs, but on comforting God's people as He has comforted us (see 2 Cor 1:3-7). Relax and trust God as an infant trusts its mother.

Prayer: Father, do in me whatever You want so that You may do through me whatever You will.

Promise: "All that matters is that one is created anew." —Gal 6:15

Praise: All praise to You, risen Jesus, Lord of the Universe. Alleluia!

Estimados Hermanos

Permítame presentarme a cada uno de ustedes. Mi nombre es Fr. Mauricio Antonio Romero Víquez, de nacionalidad costarricense (Costa Rica), nacido el 02 de abril de 1978. Soy el hijo mayor de dos hermanos (Pablo y Alejandra), crecí en el seno de una familia católica y sencilla, en Cartago, Costa Rica, mis padres se llaman: Fernando Romero Camacho y Miriam Víquez Garita. Desde muy temprana edad sentí la llamada a la vocación sacerdotal (alrededor de los siete años). Ingresé a la Orden de los Frailes Menores Capuchinos en 1997, profesé mis votos simples en 1999, hice mi profesión perpetua en 2004 y fui ordenado diácono en diciembre del 2005 y ordenado sacerdote el 01 de julio del 2006. Actualmente tengo un permiso especial de mi Orden Capuchina, para servir pastoralmente en la Diócesis de Providence, la cual sirvo desde marzo del 2023, en un primer momento como capellán de la Comunidad Hispana e Italiana en Holy Ghost (Providence), y capellán de la Comunidad Hispana en St. Joseph (Newport). El 01 de julio fui nombrado párroco de St. John the Baptist (Pawtucket) y al mismo tiempo capellán de la Comunidad Hispana de St. Joseph (Newport), lo que indica que debo dividir mi servicio pastoral de domingo de medio día a martes por la mañana en St. Joseph, Newport y el resto de la semana en St. John the Baptist.

Debo ser muy sincero con cada uno de ustedes hermanos, a modo de san Agustín de Hipona (Libro de las Confesiones), en la que relata su experiencia personal (Pecado - Gracia). Es mi primera experiencia como párroco, pues en mis 19 años de sacerdocio serví en la Orden Capuchina como formador y profesor universitario en diferentes Seminarios (Nicaragua, Costa Rica), en dos ocasiones fui administrador pastoral de dos hermosas parroquias en Nicaragua (breve tiempo) y el resto del tiempo lo dediqué a los estudios: Teología Moral (Roma 2006 - 2009), Master en Formación Franciscana (Roma, 2009 - 2010), I semestre Diploma Bíblico (Jerusalén 2011), Bachiller en Psicología (Costa Rica 2012 - 2015). Antes de viajar a los USA, tuve la oportunidad de trabajar pastoralmente en una parroquia de misión en Nicaragua, en Rama (Parroquia San Isidro Labrador), fue una hermosa ocasión y desafío personal, pues era una parroquia que tenía 100 comunidades a las cuales se visitaba tres veces al año (gira de verano, invierno y si era posible para celebrar su santo patrono), era toda una odisea para llegar a estas comunidades en la montaña. Se salía lunes a las 7

am en bote (cuatro horas río arriba), al llegar al punto de desembarque había un “baquiano” (lugareño de la zona que acompañaba al misionero), luego dos horas a caballo y al llegar a la capilla se realizaba un encuentro con los agentes pastorales (catequistas, delegados de la Palabra), luego una catequesis, seguido la Santa Misa (en donde se celebraban los sacramentos si habían: bautismos, primeras comuniones y matrimonios), luego confesiones y por último la visita de enfermos (en ocasiones dos horas a caballo de la capilla, en medio de la montaña), al día siguiente el misionero se bañaba en el río y desayunaba Así proseguía la misión a caballo para visitar otra comunidad en la montaña (en caballo, en bote, “en carro don-de se podía llegar” o caminando), la gira terminada el día sábado y domingo se atendía la parroquia y las capillas aledañas a la ciudad. Fue una experiencia maravillosa y de crecimiento espiritual (para mi persona), de la fe y testimonio de estas personas. Prosiguiendo como mis “confesiones”, mi inglés no es fluido (puedo entender, hablar un poco y celebrar los sacramentos), a lo que pido su comprensión y al mismo tiempo puedan ser mis maestros en corregirme y perdonarme, algún malentendido en cuanto la pronunciación y en la celebración de los sacramentos. En cuanto a mi servicio pastoral deseo asumir mi carisma franciscano de ser un hermano entre ustedes, consiente de una responsabilidad pastoral, que desea caminar, acompañar y animar en la fe como un hermano, en la celebración de los sacramentos y la formación. Deseo hacer eco a las palabras del Santo Padre Francisco: “una Iglesia en salida”. Es decir, estoy a la disposición de atenderles en la confesión, la dirección espiritual y la visita de enfermos (unción de los enfermos), según sus posibilidades (pues en mi corta experiencia es más fácil adaptarme a sus horarios que ustedes se adapten a un horario de oficina) y el acompañamiento de los grupos pastorales. Recuerdo con cariño los años de estudio en la Academia Alfonsiana (Roma), en donde tuve la oportunidad de conocer la vida de San Alfonso María de Liguori (fundador de los Redentoristas), ¿qué hacer teología?, se hace desde la experiencia pastoral (cercanía con la comunidad) y los roles con que el santo moralista describía el oficio del Confesor: Padre (caridad con el penitente), Médico (informarse de la situación del penitente), Doctor (hombre de ciencia, actualizado con lo que pasa en el mundo) y Juez (hombre de escucha, examinar y luego dar la sentencia con caridad).

Agradezco al Padre Sistare, que tuvo la gentileza de recibirme como un hermano y su paciencia al introducirme en la vida parroquial de St. John the Baptist (pastoral - económica), que Dios le bendiga y acompañe en su ministerio sacerdotal en su nueva misión, que la diócesis le ha encomendado y a Sue Carlino, por su gentileza de explicarme paso a paso, el acontecer Económico-parroquial y los pasos a seguir en esta transición.

Que podamos imitar a nuestro Santo Patrón San Juan Bautista, como lo describe el evangelista San Juan “es preciso que él crezca y que yo disminuya” (Jn 3, 30). San Juan Bautista, Ruega por nosotros.

¿PUEDE DIOS CONSOLARTE?

“Como un hombre es consolado por su madre, así Yo los consolaré a ustedes” (Isaías 66:13).

En la primera lectura de hoy, Isaías profetiza que el Señor desea consolar a Su pueblo como una madre desea consolar a su hijo: ... “¡para ser amamantados y saciados, y... se deleitarán en sus pechos gloriosos!” (Is 66:11; ver también Is 40:1) ¿Nos relajaremos y confiaremos en el cuidado providencial que Dios tiene de nosotros? ¿O nos resistiremos y nos pondremos rígidos, rechazando el consuelo de Dios?

Jesús planea enviarnos como sus obreros y misioneros. Para que seamos eficaces en el campo misionero, debemos confiar completamente en el cuidado de nuestro Padre. Jesús nos llama a ser “ovejas en medio de lobos” (Lc 10:3). Considere que Dios Padre envió a Su Hijo Jesús a la tierra como un Cordero infante en medio de lobos. Jesús confió totalmente en María y José para que lo cuidaran, a pesar de que lobos como el rey Herodes intentaron matarlo (Mt 2:16-18).

Jesús quiere que seamos misioneros que confíen en el Padre como los niños confían en sus padres. Él nos envía sin "bastón ni alforja" para que no podamos confiar en nuestras propias provisiones, sino solo en lo que el Padre provee (Lc 10:4). Nos dice que no vayamos de casa en casa y que comamos lo que se nos sirvan (Lc 10:7). Esto es para que no busquemos comodidad en el alojamiento y la comida; En cambio, imitamos a los niños que comen lo que sus padres ponen en la mesa. Por lo tanto, podemos centrarnos no en nuestras propias necesidades, sino en consolar al pueblo de Dios como Él nos ha consolado (ver 2 Co 1: 3-7). Relájate y confía en Dios como un bebé confía en su madre.

Oración: Padre, haz en mí lo que quieras para que puedas hacer Tu voluntad por medio de mí.

Promesa: “Lo que importa es ser una nueva criatura” (Gál 6:15).

Alabanza: Toda alabanza a Ti, Jesús resucitado, Señor del Universo. ¡Aleluya!
