Third Sunday of Easter

April 19, 2026

Peace and Good! Dear brothers and sisters in our Lord Jesus Christ.

Introduction

The liturgical texts of the Easter season seek to illuminate the horizon of the Christian faith through a series of truthful and credible testimonies from those who emphatically confess: **"It is true! The Lord has risen!"** These are living experiences that, from various perspectives, gradually draw back the curtain from our eyes, opening them to the transcendent—as unexpected as it is enigmatic—world beyond death.

The first two readings present the public testimony of Peter—the authoritative spokesman for the Twelve—and his exhortation to live in accordance with faith in the God who raised Christ from the dead. The Gospel, for its part, draws the reader and listener into the vivid and fervent testimony of the two pilgrims of Emmaus (disciples).

Biblical Commentary on the Readings

The First Reading for this Sunday (Acts 2:14, 22–33) is taken from *Peter's* discourse on the day of Pentecost; it serves as the prototype for the *first proclamation* (**kerygma**) that the Apostles proclaimed before the Jews and before all people. It consisted of presenting to the world **the death on the cross and the Resurrection of Jesus of Nazareth as the most significant event in the history of salvation.** Specifically, this discourse is organized into three parts: (a) An invitation to listen: ***"Listen, Israelites"*** (v. 22a); (b) An exposition of the foundational event: God raised Jesus of Nazareth (vv. 22b–24); (c) A scriptural support or testimony, drawn from Psalm 16:8–11 (vv. 25–28).

Therefore, when speaking of the power of the Word of God among the early Christians, that power consisted of nothing other than the very power inherent in **the death and resurrection of Jesus himself.** It is a force that changes hearts, and if it changes hearts, it also changes history; for in the death of Jesus—specifically on the cross, that ignominious death reserved for slaves and revolu-

tionaries—the fullness of God's love for us is revealed; **and in the Resurrection, God's power over the death of Jesus, and over the death of all humanity, is made manifest.**

The Second Reading, taken from the *First Letter of Peter* (1:17–21), powerfully emphasizes the **kerygma**—the proclamation—of the Paschal mystery: the death and Resurrection of Jesus. It posits that it is neither gold nor power that will change the course of history, even though many people believe that these are the forces that drive this world. Gold, power, and weaponry bring tragedy upon our peoples—specifically, war and divisive nationalisms. Yet, within the Paschal mystery—which is, in essence, the mystery of "powerlessness"—everything opens up to hope and to a life that endures forever.

The Gospel reading (*Luke* 24:13–35) recounts one of the scenes depicting the appearances of the Risen Lord that resonated most deeply with the early Christian communities. We can readily structure this narrative around two principal scenes, each introduced by the same distinctive phrase: (a) *Luke* 24:15: ***"And it happened that, while they were conversing..."***; (b) *Luke* 24:30: ***"And it happened that, while he sat at table..."*** Many have recognized that *Saint Luke the Evangelist*, in this passage, points to the two essential moments of Christian liturgy: **The Word and the Sacrament—that is, the hearing of the Scriptures and the Eucharistic liturgy.**

The ***"breaking of the bread"*** (as the early Christian community called the Eucharist) is the sign they needed to understand what had taken place. There remains, however, the task of articulating the conclusion of this decisive moment. This is precisely what is described in verse 31—a description that stands in direct contrast to what was expressed in verse 16 (where their eyes were closed, held back, and without light).

Verse 32 holds an indispensable significance within the Gospel narrative. It is the key: ***"And they said to one another, 'Did not our hearts burn within us while he spoke to us on the way and opened the Scriptures to us?'"***

Brothers and sisters, this Sunday I wish to invite you to embrace the journey to Emmaus as a formative experience within our own Christian walk. The burdens and weariness in our lives—regardless of the specific vocation to which we have responded, be it marriage, the single life, or consecrated life—can sometimes prevent

our eyes from recognizing the Risen Lord within those very vocations. Nevertheless, God walks in the midst of His people; He does not remain detached from our painful experiences, for He Himself suffered during His Passion (He was scourged, despised, and died upon the wood of the Cross). I invite you, therefore, to rediscover the Lord through the daily reading of the Word and through the Eucharist. I encourage you to participate in the Holy Eucharist during the week, *so that our hearts may burn* just as they did more than two thousand years ago for those two disciples on the road to Emmaus.

Saint John the Baptist / Pray for us.

Thank you in advance for the desserts you have brought this Sunday (this is a communal effort for the Church), and I encourage your participation in the \$5 raffle traditionally held in our parish to celebrate the Feast of our patron saint, Saint John the Baptist.

Tercer Domingo de Pascua

19 de Abril, 2026

¡Paz y Bien! Estimados hermanos y hermanas en nuestro Señor Jesucristo.

Introducción

Los textos litúrgicos del tiempo pascual buscan iluminar el horizonte de la fe cristiana mediante una serie de testimonios veraces y dignos de crédito de quienes confiesan rotundamente: *¡es verdad, el Señor ha resucitado!* Son experiencias vivas que, desde diferentes miradas, van descorriendo la cortina de nuestros ojos para abrirlos al mundo trascendente, tan insospechado como enigmático, del más allá de la muerte.

Las dos primeras lecturas recogen el testimonio público de Pedro, portavoz autorizado de los Doce, y su exhortación a vivir acordes con la fe en el Dios que resucitó a Cristo de entre los muertos. El evangelio, por su parte, adentra al lector oyente en el vivo y encendido testimonio de los dos peregrinos de Emaús (discípulos).

Comentario bíblico de las lecturas

La Iª Lectura de este Domingo (Hechos 2,14.22-33) se toma del discurso de *Pedro* el día de Pentecostés y es el prototipo del primer anuncio (*kerygma*) que los apóstoles proclamaban ante los judíos, y ante todos los hombres. Consistía en proponer al mundo *la muerte en la cruz y la Resurrección de Jesús de Nazaret como el acontecimiento más importante de la historia de la salvación.* Este discurso concretamente está organizado en tres partes: (a) Invitación a escuchar: "*Escuchad Israelitas*" (v. 22a); (b) Exposición del acontecimiento fundamental: Dios ha resucitado a Jesús el Nazareno (v. 22b-24); (c) Un apoyo o testimonio en la Escritura, que es el *Sal.* 16,8-11 (vv. 25-28).

Por ello, cuando se habla de la fuerza de la Palabra de Dios en los primeros cristianos, esa fuerza no consistía en otra cosa que en la fuerza que tenía la misma *muerte y resurrección de Jesús.* Es una fuerza que cambia los corazones y, si cambia los corazones, cambia también la historia; porque en la muerte de Jesús, en la cruz concretamente, la muerte ignominio-

sa de esclavos y revolucionarios, se revela todo el amor de Dios por nosotros; y en la *Resurrección se revela el poder de Dios sobre la muerte de Jesús y sobre la de todos los hombres.*

La IIª Lectura, de la *carta Iª de Pedro* (1,17-21) insiste poderosamente en el kerygma (anuncio), del misterio de la Pascua, de la muerte y la Resurrección de Jesús. Propone, que no es el oro y el poder lo que cambiará la historia, aunque muchos hombres consideren que eso es lo que moviliza este mundo. El oro, el poder, las armas, traen la tragedia a nuestros pueblos: la guerra y los nacionalismos. Pero en el misterio de la Pascua, que es el misterio del «sin poder», se abre todo a la esperanza y a la vida que permanece para siempre.

El evangelio (*Lucas* 24,13-35) es una de las escenas de las apariciones del Resucitado que más han calado en las primeras comunidades cristianas. Bien podemos articular esta narración en torno a dos escenas principales introducidas por la misma expresión: (a) *Lc. 24,15: "Y sucedió mientras conversaban...";* (b) *Lc. 24,30: "Y sucedió mientras se sentó a la mesa ..."*. Muchos han reconocido que *San Lucas evangelista*, indica los dos momentos esenciales de la liturgia cristiana: la *palabra y el sacramento, escucha de las Escrituras y liturgia eucarística.*

La "*fracción del pan*" (así le llamaba la comunidad cristiana primitiva a la Eucaristía), es el signo que necesitaban para saber lo que había pasado. Queda, no obstante, por formular el remate de este momento decisivo. Es lo que se describe ajustadamente en el v. 31, y que es lo contrario de lo que se ha expresado en el v. 16 (sus ojos estaban cerrados, retenidos, sin luz).

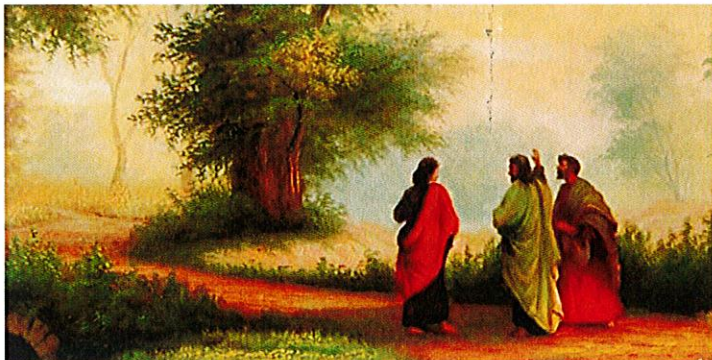
El v. 32 tiene un sentido irrenunciable en la narración del evangelio. Es la clave: "*¿y se decían el uno al otro: ¿no ardía nuestro corazón cuando por el camino nos hablaba y nos explicaba (nos habría) las Escrituras?*".

Hermanos y hermanas, deseo invitarles este domingo a vivir el camino de Emaús como una experiencia pedagógica, en nuestro caminar cristiano. El peso y la

fatiga en nuestras vidas, según a la vocación a la que hemos respondido: matrimonio, soltería o vida consagrada, puede hacer que nuestros ojos nos vean al Señor Resucitado en nuestras vocaciones. Sin embargo, Dios camina en medio de su pueblo y no pasa desapercibido de nuestras experiencias dolorosas, pues el sufrió en su pasión (fue azotado, despreciado y murió en el madero de la cruz), les invito a redescubrir al Señor, en la lectura diaria de la Palabra y la Eucaristía. Les ánimo a participar entre semana de la Santa Eucaristía, para que **arda nuestro corazón** como sucedió hace más de dos mil años con aquellos dos discípulos de Emaús.

San Juan Bautista / Ruega por nosotros.

Gracias de antemano por los postres que han traídos este domingo (es un esfuerzo comunitario para la Iglesia), y les ánimo en la cooperación de la rifa de \$5 que tradicionalmente se realiza en nuestra parroquia, con ocasión de la Fiesta de nuestro Santo patrón San Juan Bautista.

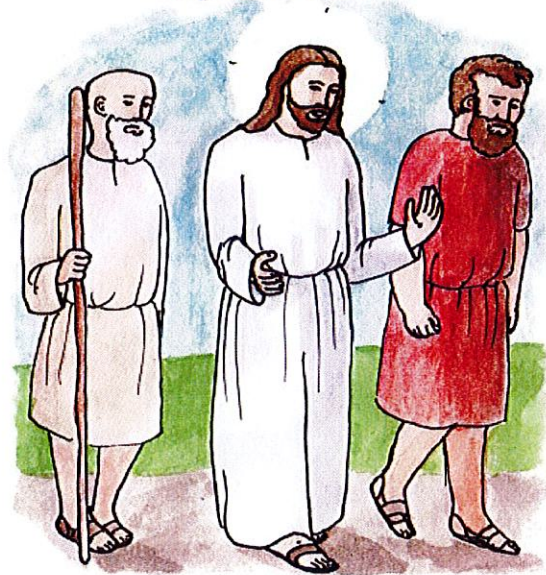

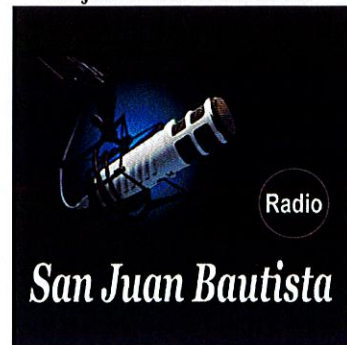
