Sixth Sunday of Ordinary Time

Dear Parishioners,

This week, we begin the season of **LENT** with **Ash Wednesday**. Lent lasts 40 days in honor of our Lord who spent 40 days in the desert, all the while being tempted by the devil. Lent is a grace filled time in which we can draw closer to our Lord through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. There are **three “pillars” of Lent**, that can help us defeat the devil and all the ways that he tries to make us stumble and fall. **PRAYER:** We will have *Mass in English at 8am and a Bilingual Mass at 7pm on Ash Wednesday*. There is the usual *daily Masses during the week, as well as Eucharistic Adoration every Friday from 9am to 6pm (concluding with Benediction)*. There will be *Bilingual Stations of the Cross every Friday at 6:15pm*. There are *Confessions every Saturday, from 3:30-4:20pm, and then again from 5:30-5:50pm*. **FASTING:** Abstinence from meat *and meat products* is required of all those 14 years old and over on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is required of those between the ages of 18 and 59 on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, but is a good practice of self-control and self-denial on any day of Lent, especially on Fridays when we commemorate in a particular way the Lord’s Passion and Death for us on the Cross. *Fasting means no eating between meals, eating only one full meal, and trying to eat less*. Fasting also includes other sacrifices, such as spending more time with our families, spending less time on the computer and replacing that time with more prayer, or the best fast - avoiding sin and the occasions of sin. **ALMSGIVING:** Giving financially to the *Catholic Charity Appeal, continuing to pay on your pledge to our Diocesan Capital Campaign (with 40% of the funds coming back to our parish), and giving to other charities (especially pro-life ones)*, are great ways to give alms, as well as simply *spending “our” time with others*, thus giving of ourselves. Let us pray for one another during this beautiful season of Lent, that we spend these next 40 days in a close relationship with Jesus, so that come Easter, we will be able to celebrate the joy of His Resurrection. God bless!

AN EPIDEMIC OF LEPROSY

“A leper approached Him with a request.”
—**Mark 1:40**

Our society and churches are filled with lepers. These people don't have physical leprosy, which is Hanson's disease, but the spiritual leprosy of self-hatred. They continually “cry out ‘Unclean, Unclean!’ ” (Lv 13:45) They do things to turn people away from them. They even tell God to stay away from them. They wallow in depression and degrade themselves through self-destructive compulsions such as overeating, alcoholism, drug abuse, gambling, addiction to TV and handheld electronic devices, sexual promiscuity, pornography, masturbation, gossip, etc.

Only one Person can cure spiritual leprosy — Jesus. In our leprous condition, we must kneel down and make an act of faith in Jesus, saying: “If You will to do so, You can cure” us (Mk 1:40). He will have mercy on us, stretch out His hand, touch us, and say: “I do will it. Be cured” (Mk 1:41). Then God's grace can begin to free us from years of self-hatred and self-destruction. We will no longer be degraded by the tyranny of doing what feels good. We will be truly free and fully alive.

Then we should testify to our healing to whomever the Lord leads us. These people may also be lepers. They may have been discouraged by the lepers in their family and church. By sharing our healing, we will open them to Jesus. They will no longer tell Jesus to stay away from them, but will let Him touch them.

Prayer: Father, may I repent of self-hatred and let Jesus touch me in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Promise: “Whether you eat or drink — whatever you do — you should do all for the glory of God.” —1 Cor 10:31

Praise: To You, risen Lord Jesus, be highest glory and praise for ever. Alleluia!

Esta semana, comenzamos la temporada de

CUARESMA con el **Miércoles de Ceniza**. La

Cuaresma dura 40 días en honor a nuestro Señor, que pasó 40 días en el desierto, mientras era tentado por el diablo. La Cuaresma es un tiempo lleno de gracia en el que podemos acercarnos a nuestro Señor a través de la oración, el ayuno y la limosna. Hay **tres "pilares" de la Cuaresma**, que nos ayudan a vencer al diablo y todas las formas en que trata de hacernos tropezar y caer. **ORACIÓN:** Tendremos *una Misa en inglés a las 8am y una Misa bilingüe a las 7pm el Miércoles de Ceniza*. Hay *Misas diarias* habituales durante la semana, así como *Adoración Eucarística todos los viernes de 9am a 6pm* (concluyendo con la Bendición).

Habrà *Estaciones de la Cruz Bilingües todos los viernes a las 6:15pm*. Hay *Confesiones todos los sábados, de 3:30-4:20pm, y nuevamente de 5:30-5:50pm*. **AYUNO:** Se requiere la abstinencia de carne y productos cárnicos de todos los mayores de 14 años el Miércoles de Ceniza y todos los viernes de Cuaresma. Se requiere el ayuno de las personas de entre 18 y 59 años el Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo, pero es una buena práctica de autocontrol y abnegación en cualquier día de la Cuaresma,

especialmente los viernes cuando conmemoramos de una manera particular la Pasión y la Muerte del Señor por nosotros en la Cruz. *Ayunar significa no comer entre comidas, comer solo una comida completa e intentar comer menos*. El ayuno también incluye otros sacrificios, como pasar más tiempo con nuestras familias, pasar menos tiempo en la computadora y reemplazar ese tiempo con más oración, o el mejor ayuno, evitando el pecado y las ocasiones de pecado.

LIMOSNA: Contribuir financieramente a *Catholic Charity Appeal*, continuar pagando su compromiso con nuestra *Campaña Diocesana de Capital* (con el 40% de los fondos que regresan a nuestra parroquia), y dando a *otras organizaciones benéficas* (especialmente las pro-vida), son excelentes maneras de dar limosna, así como simplemente *pasar "nuestro" tiempo con los demás*, dando así de nosotros mismos. Vamos a rezar unos por otros durante esta hermosa temporada de Cuaresma, que pasemos estos próximos 40 días en una relación cercana con Jesús, para que cuando llegue la Pascua, podamos celebrar la alegría de Su Resurrección. ¡Dios los bendiga!

UNA EPIDEMIA DE LEPROA

“Se le acercó un leproso para pedirle ayuda” (Marcos 1:40).

Nuestra sociedad e iglesias están llenas de leproso. Estas personas no tienen lepra física, que es la enfermedad de Hanson, sino la lepra espiritual del odio a sí mismos. Continuamente gritan: “¡Impuro, impuro!” (Lv 13:45). Hacen cosas para alejar a la gente de ellos. Incluso le dicen a Dios que se aleje de ellos. Se revuelcan en la depresión y se degradan a sí mismos por medio de compulsiones autodestructivas como comer en exceso, alcoholismo, abuso de drogas, juegos de azar, adicción a la televisión, dispositivos electrónicos portátiles, promiscuidad sexual, pornografía, masturbación.

Solo una Persona puede curar la lepra espiritual: Jesús. En nuestra condición leprosa, debemos arrodillarnos y hacer un acto de fe en Jesús, diciendo: “Si quieres, puedes purificarme” (Mc 1:40). Él tendrá misericordia de nosotros, extenderá Su mano, nos tocará y dirá: “Lo quiero, queda purificado” (Mc 1:41). Entonces la gracia de Dios puede comenzar a liberarnos de años de autodesprecio y autodestrucción. Ya no seremos degradados por la tiranía de hacer lo que se siente bien. Seremos verdaderamente libres y estaremos plenamente vivos.

Entonces deberemos dar testimonio de nuestra sanación a quienquiera que el Señor nos guíe. Estas personas también pueden ser leproso. Es posible que hayan sido desalentados por los leproso en su familia e iglesia. Al compartir nuestra sanación, los abriremos a Jesús. Ya no le dirán a Jesús que se aleje de ellos, sino que dejarán que los toque.

Oración: Padre, que me arrepiento del desprecio hacia mí mismo y que Jesús me toque en el Sacramento de la Reconciliación.

Promesa: “Sea que ustedes coman, sea que beban, o cualquier cosa que hagan, háganlo todo para la gloria de Dios” (1 Co 10:31).

Alabanza: A ti, Señor Jesús resucitado, sea la altísima gloria y alabanza por los siglos. ¡Aleluya!

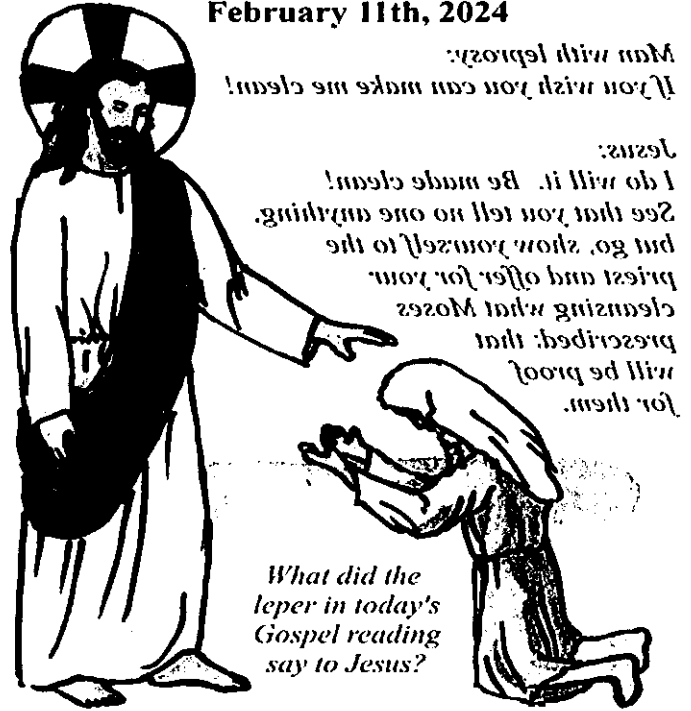

I will tell her ladyship you are here to meet her!

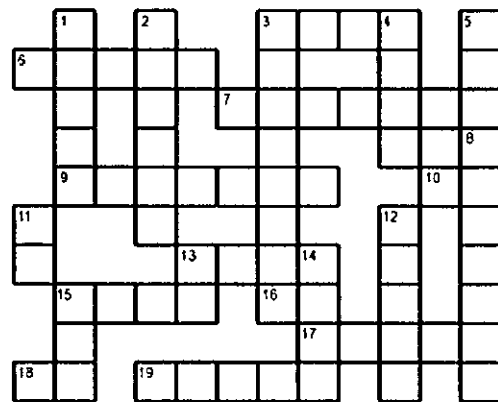
