22ND SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME AUGUST 29, 2021

Dear Parishioners,

On August 29th, the Church remembers **The Martyrdom of St John the Baptist**. From Pope Benedict XVI's address on August 29, 2012, entitled "**With love there is no compromise**" - *"With love for Christ, for his Word, for Truth, there are no compromises. This is what we learn from St John the Baptist, martyred for 'his fidelity to God's commandments, without giving in or drawing back, carrying out his mission to the very end'....John the Baptist did not limit himself to teaching repentance or conversion. Instead, in recognizing Jesus as the 'Lamb of God' who came to take away the sin of the world (Jn 1:29), he had the profound humility to hold up Jesus as the One sent by God, drawing back so that he might take the lead, and be heard and followed. As his last act the Baptist witnessed with his blood to faithfulness to God's commandments, without giving in or withdrawing, carrying out his mission to the very end. In the 9th century the Venerable Bede says in one of his Homilies: 'St John gave his life for Christ. He was not ordered to deny Jesus Christ, but was ordered to keep silent about the truth'. And he did not keep silent about the truth and thus died for Christ who is the Truth. Precisely for love of the truth he did not stoop to compromises and did not fear to address strong words to anyone who had strayed from God's path. We see this great figure, this force in the Passion, in resistance to the powerful. We wonder: what gave birth to this life, to this interiority so strong, so upright, so consistent, spent so totally for God in preparing the way for Jesus? The answer is simple: it was born from the relationship with God, from prayer, which was the thread that guided him throughout his existence...John the Baptist, however, is not only a man of prayer, in permanent contact with God, but also a guide in this relationship...celebrating the martyrdom of St John the Baptist reminds us too, Christians of this time, that with love for Christ, for his words and for the Truth, we cannot stoop to compromises. The Truth is Truth; there are no compromises. Christian life demands, so to speak, the 'martyrdom' of daily fidelity to the Gospel, the courage, that is, to let Christ grow within us and let him be the One who guides our thought and our actions. However, this can happen in our life only if we have a solid relationship with God. Prayer is not time wasted, it does not take away time from our activities, even apostolic activities, but exactly the opposite is true: only if we are able to have a faithful, constant and trusting life of prayer will God himself give us the ability and strength to live happily and serenely, to surmount difficulties and to witness courageously to him. St John the Baptist, intercede for us, that we may be ever able to preserve the primacy of God in our life."* God Bless!

22 DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO AGOSTO 29, 2021

Queridos feligreses,

El 29 de Agosto, la Iglesia recuerda **El martirio de San Juan Bautista**. Del discurso del Papa Benedicto XVI el 29 de Agosto de 2012, titulado **"Con amor no hay compromiso"** - *"Con amor a Cristo, a su Palabra, a la Verdad, no hay compromiso. Esto es lo que aprendemos de San Juan Bautista, martirizado por 'su fidelidad a los mandamientos de Dios, sin ceder ni retroceder, cumpliendo su misión hasta el final' ... Juan el Bautista no se limitó a enseñar el arrepentimiento la conversión. En cambio, al reconocer a Jesús como el 'Cordero de Dios' que vino a quitar el pecado del mundo (Jn 1:29), tuvo la profunda humildad de sostener a Jesús como el enviado de Dios, retrocediendo para que él podría tomar la iniciativa y ser escuchado y seguido. Como último acto, el Bautista testificó con su sangre la fidelidad a los mandamientos de Dios, sin ceder ni retraerse, cumpliendo su misión hasta el final. En el siglo IX, el Venerable Beda dice en una de sus Homilias: 'San Juan dio su vida por Cristo. No se le ordenó negar a Jesucristo, pero se le ordenó guardar silencio sobre la verdad'. Y no guardó silencio sobre la verdad y así murió por Cristo que es la Verdad. Precisamente por amor a la verdad, no se rebajó a compromisos y no temió dirigir palabras fuertes a cualquiera que se hubiera desviado del camino de Dios. Vemos esta gran figura, esta fuerza en la Pasión, en resistencia a los poderosos. Nos preguntamos: ¿qué dio origen a esta vida, a esta interioridad tan fuerte, tan recta, tan consistente, gastada tan totalmente por Dios en preparar el camino a Jesús? La respuesta es simple: nació de la relación con Dios, de la oración, que fue el hilo que lo guió a lo largo de su existencia... Juan el Bautista, sin embargo, no es solo un hombre de oración, en contacto permanente con Dios, sino también un guía en esta relación... celebrar el martirio de San Juan Bautista nos recuerda también a nosotros, cristianos de este tiempo, que con amor a Cristo, a sus palabras y a la Verdad, no podemos rebajarnos a compromisos. La verdad es verdad; no hay compromisos. La vida cristiana exige, por así decirlo, el 'martirio' de la fidelidad diaria al Evangelio, la valentía, es decir, dejar que Cristo crezca en nosotros y que sea él quien oriente nuestro pensamiento y nuestro actuar. Sin embargo, esto puede suceder en nuestra vida solo si tenemos una relación sólida con Dios. La oración no es una pérdida de tiempo, no quita tiempo a nuestras actividades, incluso a las apostólicas, pero es todo lo contrario: solo si somos capaces de tener una vida de oración fiel, constante y confiada, Dios mismo nos dará la capacidad y fuerza para vivir feliz y serenamente, superar las dificultades y testimoniarle valientemente. San Juan Bautista, intercede por nosotros, para que siempre podamos preservar la primacía de Dios en nuestra vida". ¡Dios les bendiga!*


Una noche para honrar a María:

Some of you have been reading this booklet, *One Bread, One Body*, for years. You have read hundreds and thousands of Scripture passages. You are greatly blessed. The Lord is not expecting us to remember all these Bible verses or to know how to interpret them all. He does expect us to live them all by His grace. Knowing God’s Word demands doing His Word. On Judgment Day, the Lord will not ask us what we know of His Word, but how we’ve lived it. “For it is not those who hear the law who are just in the sight of God; it is those who keep it who will be declared just” (Rm 2:13). So, let’s not kid ourselves. Let’s take every word of the Bible to heart and to life. “Humbly welcome the word that has taken root in you, with its power to save you” (Jas 1:21). The Lord will never give us a commandment without empowering us to do it. Jesus promised: “Anyone who hears My words and puts them into practice is like the wise man who built his house on rock” (Mt 7:24). “He is no forgetful listener, but one who carries out the law in practice. Blest will this man be in whatever he does” (Jas 1:25). Jesus also promised: “My mother and My brothers are those who hear the word of God and act upon it” (Lk 8:21). Do the Word.

Prayer: Jesus, by obeying Your Word may I be a devoted member of Your family (Mk 3:34-35).

Promise: “Now, Israel, hear the statutes and decrees which I am teaching you to observe, that you may live, and may enter in and take possession of the land which the Lord, the God of your fathers, is giving you.” —Dt 4:1

UN VERDADERO CUMPLIDOR

“Pongan en práctica la Palabra y no se contenten solo con oírla, de manera que se engañen a ustedes mismos” (Santiago 1:22). Algunos de ustedes han sido lectores habituales de nuestros devocionales: *Un Pan, Un Cuerpo*. Con los años, han leído cientos o quizás miles de pasajes de las Escrituras. Han sido muy bendecidos. El Señor no espera que recordemos todos esos versículos bíblicos o que sepamos cómo interpretarlos. Lo que el Señor espera de nosotros es vivirlos al amparo de Su Gracia. Conocer la Palabra de Dios exige cumplir Su Palabra. El día del Juicio, el Señor no nos preguntará qué sabemos sobre Su palabra sino como la hemos vivido. “Porque a los ojos de Dios, no son justos los que oyen la Ley, sino los que la practican” (Rom 2:13).

Así que, no nos engañemos. Tenemos que arraigar cada palabra de la Biblia en nuestro corazón y en la vida. “Dejen de lado, entonces, toda impureza y todo resto de maldad, y reciban con docilidad la Palabra sembrada en ustedes, que es capaz de salvarlos” (Stg 1:21). El Señor nunca va imponernos un mandamiento sin investirnos con poder para cumplirlo. Jesús nos prometió que: “Así, todo el que escucha las palabras que acabo de decir y las pone en práctica, puede compararse a un hombre sensato que edificó su casa sobre roca” (Mt 7:24). “En cambio, el que considera atentamente la Ley perfecta, que nos hace libres, y se aficiona a ella, no como un oyente distraído, sino como un verdadero cumplidor de la Ley, será feliz al practicarla” (Stg 1:25). Jesús también prometió: “Mi madre y Mis hermanos son los que escuchan la Palabra de Dios y la practican” (Lc 8:21). Practica la Palabra.

Oración: Jesús, permite que al obedecer Tu palabra pueda llegar a ser considerado un miembro devoto de Tu familia (Mc 3:34-35).

Promesa: Y ahora, Israel, escucha los preceptos y las leyes que Yo les enseño para que las pongan en práctica. Así ustedes vivirán y entrarán a tomar posesión de la tierra que les da el Señor, el Dios de sus padres” (Dt 4:1)

Alabanza: “Alegrémonos, regocijémonos y demos gloria a Dios, porque han llegado las bodas del Cordero: su esposa ya se ha preparado” (Ap 19:7). ¡Alabado sea Jesús Resucitado!



SOON OTHER WOMEN JOINED MOTHER TERESA TO HELP THE POOR AND DYING.


