FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT DECEMBER 19, 2021

Dear Parishioners,

As we prepare to celebrate the beautiful feast of **Christmas** at the end of this week, I would like to share with you the following meditation from the Diary of St. Maria Faustina Kowalska. St. Faustina is the Polish Nun that Jesus appeared to in the 1930's with the Divine Mercy Image, as well as giving her numerous revelations and messages about His Divine Mercy. On Christmas Eve in 1937, St Faustina wrote of one such encounter with the Holy Child: *"When I arrived at Midnight Mass, from the very beginning I steeped myself in deep recollection, during which time I saw the stable of Bethlehem filled with great radiance. The Blessed Virgin, all lost in the deepest of love, was wrapping Jesus in swaddling clothes, but Saint Joseph was still asleep. Only after the Mother of God put Jesus in the manger did the light of God awaken Joseph, who also prayed. But after a while, I was left alone with the Infant Jesus who stretched out His little hands to me, and I understood that I was to take Him in my arms. Jesus pressed His head against my heart and gave me to know, by His profound gaze, how good He found it to be next to my heart"* (Diary of St Faustina, 1442). This beautiful experience that St. Faustina had with Jesus can also happen to us, as we take time to meditate and contemplate what Christmas is all about: that God Himself loves each one of us SO MUCH, that He became a little Child for us, to open up the way of salvation for us. Christmas is all about CHRIST'S MASS, and every time that we come to the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and allow ourselves to truly enter into it, we can also experience a personal, loving relationship with Jesus Christ, like St. Faustina describes in her above reflection. God Bless and Merry Christmas!





THE LONG-AWAITED ONE

"Who am I that the mother of my Lord should come to me?" —Luke 1:43 During the days of the prophets Micah and Isaiah, things were bad and getting worse. In fact, He is our Lord and God (see Jn 20:28). This Christmas, this Advent, today, isn't it time to give everything to Jesus — to live no longer for ourselves but for Him? (2 Cor 5:15; Gal 2:20) Right now, by God's grace, make the most important decision of your life. Holding nothing back, give your life to Jesus, your Ruler, Shepherd, Peace, Savior, Lord, and God.

Prayer: Father, may I not just keep Christ in Christmas but put myself and Christmas in Christ.

Promise: "By this 'will,' we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all." —Heb 10:10

Praise: "O Key of David, O royal Power of Israel controlling at Your will the gate of heaven: come, break down the prison walls of death for those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death; and lead Your captive people into freedom." Presentation Ministries

En medio de esta oscuridad, el Señor dio a su pueblo la esperanza al anunciar a través de Miqueas que algún día Alguien iba a nacer en Belén que traería la paz y sería la Paz (Miq 5:4). El pueblo de Dios esperó más de setecientos años por el Pastor Líder de Belén. Fue llamado "Jesús," es decir, "Salvador," y Él es nuestra Paz (Ef 2:14). De hecho, Él es nuestro Señor y Dios (ver Jn 20:28). Esta Navidad, este Adviento, hoy, ¿no es hora de dar todo a Jesús —a vivir no más para sí mismos, sino para Él? (2 Co 5:15; Gál 2:20) En este momento, por la gracia de Dios, toma la decisión más importante de tu vida. Sin ocultar nada, dale tu vida a Jesús, tu Líder, Pastor, Paz, Salvador, Señor y Dios.

Oración: Padre, que no sólo permanezca en Cristo esta Navidad, sino me ponga yo mismo y la Navidad en Cristo.

Promesa: "Y en virtud de esta voluntad quedamos santificados por la oblación del cuerpo de Jesucristo, hecha de una vez para siempre" (Heb 10:10).

Alabanza: "Oh Llave de David, Oh Poder real de Israel controlando a Tu voluntad la puerta del cielo: ven, derriba los muros de la prisión de la muerte para aquéllos que viven en tinieblas y en la sombra de la muerte; y lleva Tu pueblo cautivo a la libertad."

TERCER DOMINGO DE ADVIENTO DICIEMBRE 12, 2021

Queridos feligreses,

Mientras nos preparamos para celebrar la hermosa fiesta de **Navidad** en el final de esta semana, me gustaría compartir con ustedes la siguiente meditación del Diario de Santa María Faustina Kowalska. Santa Faustina es la Monja polaca a la que Jesús se apareció en la década de 1930 con la Imagen de la Divina Misericordia, además de darle numerosas revelaciones y mensajes sobre Su Divina Misericordia. En la víspera de Navidad de 1937, Santa Faustina escribió sobre uno de esos encuentros con el Santo Niño: *"Cuando llegué a la Misa de medianoche, desde el principio me sumergí en un profundo recuerdo, durante el cual vi el establo de Belén lleno de gran resplandor. La Santísima Virgen, toda perdida en lo más profundo del amor, envolvía a Jesús en pañales, pero San José seguía dormido. Solo después de que la Madre de Dios puso a Jesús en el pesebre, la luz de Dios despertó a José, quien también oró. Pero después de un tiempo, me quedé solo con el Niño Jesús que extendió sus pequeñas manos hacia mí, y entendí que debía tomarlo en mis brazos. Jesús presionó su cabeza contra mi corazón y me dio a conocer, por Su mirada profunda, lo bueno que se sentía estar al lado de mi corazón"*(Diario de Santa Faustina, 1442). Esta hermosa experiencia que Santa Faustina tuvo con Jesús también puede sucedernos, ya que nos tomamos el tiempo para meditar y contemplar qué Navidad se trata de que Dios mismo nos ama a cada uno de nosotros TANTO, que se convirtió en un niño pequeño para nosotros, para abrirnos el camino de salvación. La Navidad se trata de la MISA DE CRISTO, y cada vez que venimos al Santo Sacrificio de la Misa y nos permitimos entrar verdaderamente en ella, también podemos experimentar una relación personal y amorosa con Jesucristo, como Santa Faustina describe en su reflexión. Dios les bendiga y Feliz Navidad!






