Dear Parishioners,

Last Monday, the "Christmas Season" officially ended with the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord. The Christmas decorations, the poinsettias, and the creche were taken down, leaving our sanctuaries and churches less "festive looking" and more "ordinary". This is the season in the Church that we have now entered into - "**Ordinary Time**". Although as Christians, we know that nothing is really "ordinary" if we are truly following our leader Jesus Christ, who is *extraordinary*. Jesus is the Second Divine Person of the Most Holy Trinity, with the Father and the Holy Spirit. Jesus became a little baby in the womb of Mary, and grew up under the care of His parents Joseph and Mary. Jesus preached and taught the Good News, calling everyone to repent of their sins and thus be saved. Jesus suffered, died, and rose from the dead, for our salvation. *Jesus Christ is extraordinary*, and thus our lives also become *extraordinary* when we are united to Him: through receiving His Body and Blood in Holy Communion every weekend at Mass (and even every day if we want to); through receiving Jesus' forgiveness, mercy, and love in the Sacrament of Confession; and through being a public witness to our beautiful Catholic Faith as His disciples, especially in our pagan culture that we find ourselves in on a daily basis. My brothers and sisters, as we enter into this "ordinary" time in the church, let us strive even more to be *extraordinary disciples of Jesus Christ*. God Bless!

BAPTIZED IN THE SPIRIT

**“It is He Who is to baptize with the Holy Spirit.”
—John 1:33**

Many people talk about being “baptized in the Spirit.” By this, they usually mean having a renewal of their life in the Spirit. However, the Bible considers being baptized in the Spirit to be the same as being baptized, and not a renewal of life in the Spirit. Thus, many people use the phrase, “baptized in the Spirit,” in an un-Biblical way.

Although these people are wrongly using biblical terminology, they are “correct” pastorally. We have a great need to renew our being baptized in the Spirit. Through sin and selfishness, many baptized people have stifled (1 Thes 5:19) and saddened the Holy Spirit (Eph 4:30). If we are to live the Christian life as the Lord intended it to be lived, we must stir into flame the gift of the Holy Spirit (2 Tm 1:6-7).

Today's Scriptural readings invite us to renew our life in the Spirit. Look at Jesus, the Lamb of God (Jn 1:29). Let Him free you as He freed the Israelites from slavery in Egypt. Let Him take away your sins and the sins of the world (Jn 1:29). “Follow the Lamb wherever He goes”; be pure and uncompromising with the ways of the world (see Rv 14:4). Receive a renewal of being baptized in the Spirit today.

Prayer: Father, may I want the Spirit as much as I want to breathe. Revive the graces of my Baptism and Confirmation.

Promise: “I will make you a light to the nations, that My salvation may reach to the ends of the earth.” —Is 49:6

Praise: “I will proclaim Your name to my brethren; in the midst of the assembly I will praise You” (Ps 22:23). Risen Jesus, You are worthy of our praise.

BAUTIZADOS EN EL ESPÍRITU

**“Ese es el que bautiza en el Espíritu Santo”
(Juan 1:33).**

Muchos hablan de ser "bautizados en el Espíritu". Con esto, por lo general se refieren a tener una renovación de su vida en el Espíritu. Sin embargo, la Biblia considera que ser bautizado en el Espíritu es lo mismo que ser bautizado y no una renovación de la vida en el Espíritu. Por lo tanto, usan la frase "bautizados en el Espíritu" sin justificación bíblica.

Aunque estas personas utilizan incorrectamente la terminología bíblica, son "correctas" pastoralmente. Tenemos una gran necesidad de renovar nuestro bautizo en el Espíritu. Por el pecado y el egoísmo, muchos bautizados han ahogado (1 Tes 5:19) y entristecido al Espíritu Santo (Ef 4:30). Si vamos a vivir la vida cristiana como el Señor quiso que se viviera, debemos avivar el fuego del don del Espíritu Santo (2 Tim 1:6-7).

Las lecturas bíblicas de hoy nos invitan a renovar nuestra vida en el Espíritu. Mira a Jesús, el Cordero de Dios (Jn 1:29). Deja que te libere como liberó a los israelitas de la esclavitud en Egipto. Deja que Él quite tus pecados y los pecados del mundo (Jn 1:29). “Ellos siguen al Cordero donde quiera que vaya”; mantente puro e intransigente con los caminos del mundo (ver Ap 14:4). Recibe hoy, la renovación del bautismo en el Espíritu.

Oración: Padre, concédeme querer al Espíritu tanto como quiero respirar. Revive las gracias de mi Bautismo y Confirmación.

Promesa: “Yo te destino a ser la luz de las naciones, para que llegue mi salvación hasta los confines de la tierra” (Is 49:6).






