Dear Parishioners,

During these summer months, many couples choose to get married, but unfortunately many of these same couples do not marry in the Church in the Sacrament of Matrimony. I would like to share the following article from the website: coolcatholics.org, entitled "**Why Catholics Should Get Married in Church**". *"For Catholics, getting married in the Church is not just a tradition but a profound and meaningful choice to consecrate their love before God, receive His blessings and grace, and embark on a journey guided by faith. Marriage is a profound and sacred institution in the Catholic faith. For Catholics, the decision to get married in Church holds deep spiritual significance, representing a covenant with God. In this article, we will explore the reasons why Catholics should choose to have their weddings in the hallowed walls of a church. A Covenant with God - At the heart of the Catholic faith is the belief in the sacredness of marriage. When Catholics choose to marry in Church, they are not just entering into a legal contract but a covenant with God. In the eyes of the Church, marriage is a vocation, a calling, and a divine plan. By exchanging vows before God, couples acknowledge the presence of the divine in their union, reinforcing their commitment to living out their marriage according to God's design. A Sacrament - Marriage is considered one of the seven sacraments in the Catholic Church, along-side baptism, confirmation, the Eucharist, reconciliation, anointing of the sick, and holy orders. A sacrament is a visible sign of God's grace, a way for Catholics to encounter the divine in their daily lives. By getting married in Church, couples not only receive the sacrament but also invite the blessings and grace of God into their marital journey. For this reason, a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to*

his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. This is a great mystery, and I mean in reference to Christ and the Church.' (Ephesians 5:31-32) This passage highlights the profound connection between marriage and the Church, emphasizing the spiritual significance of marriage." “OH, NOTHING”

“He instructed them to take nothing.” —
Mark 6:8

In our culture, we say: “Ready; get set; go.” Jesus says something different: “Ready; don’t be ‘set upon the things of this world’ (Phil 3:19), and go.” To get ready to go for Jesus doesn’t mean that we pack our bags; rather, it means that we get rid of our baggage. Jesus “instructed them to take nothing on their journey but a walking stick — no food, no traveling bag, not a coin in the purses in their belts” (Mk 6:8).

Jesus practiced what He preached. He went out with nothing. When God became a man, He emptied Himself (Phil 2:7). When He was born, there was no room for Him except in a stable (Lk 2:7). When Jesus did His public ministry, He had nowhere to lay His head (Lk 9:58).

How does this apply to us? For example, if you have three children, the Lord obviously does not want you to be homeless, penniless, and without food and clothes. However, He does want you to go on mission for Him, and he wants you to go in the simplicity, austerity, and poverty appropriate to having been crucified to the world (Gal 6:14). Today’s Gospel reading applies to all of us. In love, truth, and freedom, apply it.

Prayer: Father, may I let You free me.

Promise: “You were sealed with the Holy Spirit Who had been promised. He is the Pledge of our inheritance, the first Payment against the full redemption of a people God has made His own, to praise His glory.” —
Eph 1:13-14

Praise: “Praised be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Who has bestowed on us in Christ every spiritual blessing in the heavens!” (Eph 1:3)

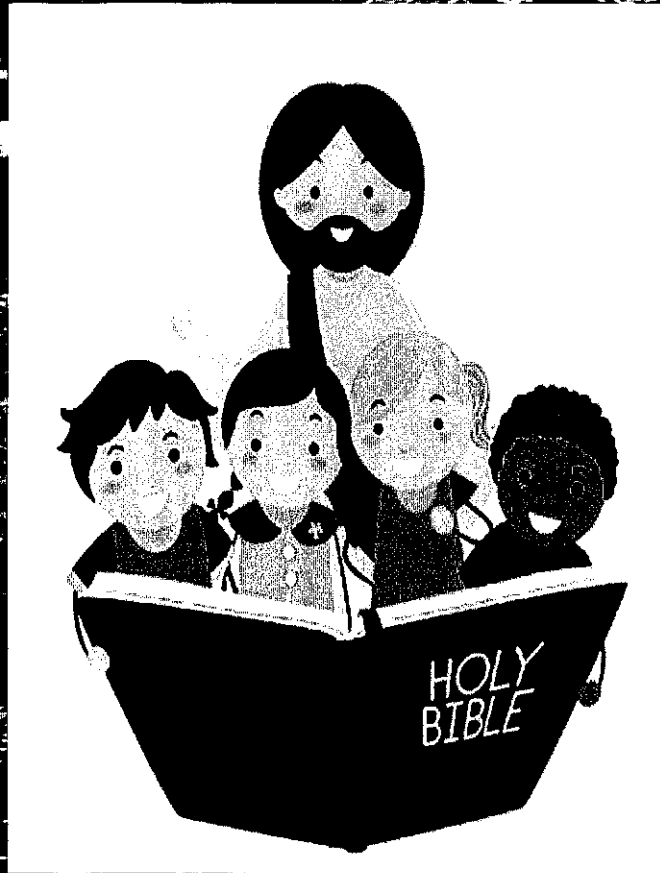

Durante estos meses de verano, muchas parejas optan por casarse, pero lamentablemente muchas de estas mismas parejas no se casan por la Iglesia en el Sacramento del Matrimonio. Me gustaría compartir el siguiente artículo del sitio web: coolcatholics.org, titulado **"Por qué los católicos deberían casarse en la iglesia"**. *"Para los católicos, casarse en la Iglesia no es sólo una tradición sino una elección profunda y significativa para consagrar su amor ante Dios, recibir Sus bendiciones y gracia y embarcarse en un viaje guiado por la fe. El matrimonio es una institución profunda y sagrada en la fe católica. Para los católicos, la decisión de casarse por la Iglesia tiene un profundo significado espiritual, ya que representa una alianza con Dios. En este artículo, exploraremos las razones por las que los católicos deberían elegir celebrar sus bodas en los muros sagrados de una iglesia. Un pacto con Dios - En el corazón de la fe católica está la creencia en el carácter sagrado del matrimonio. Un sacramento: el matrimonio se considera uno de los siete sacramentos de la Iglesia Católica, junto con el bautismo, la confirmación, la Eucaristía, la reconciliación, la unción de los enfermos y el orden sagrado. Un sacramento es un signo visible de la gracia de Dios, una manera para que los católicos encuentren lo divino en su vida diaria. Al casarse por la Iglesia, las parejas no sólo reciben el sacramento, sino que también invitan a las bendiciones y la gracia de Dios a su viaje matrimonial. 'Por esto el hombre dejará a su padre y a su madre y se unirá a su mujer, y los dos serán una sola carne. Este es un gran misterio, y me refiero a Cristo y la Iglesia.' (Efesios 5:31-32) Este pasaje resalta la profunda conexión entre el matrimonio y la Iglesia, enfatizando el significado espiritual del*

(Marcos 6:8).**

En nuestra cultura, decimos: “Preparados, listos, ya” Jesús nos dice algo diferente: “Preparados, pero no os fijéis en las cosas de tierra” (Fil 3:19), ya. Prepararse para ir con Jesús no quiere decir que empaquemos nuestras maletas; sino que nos deshagamos de nuestro equipaje. Jesús “les ordenó que no llevaran más que un bastón para el camino; ni pan, ni alforja, ni dinero” (Mc 6:8).

Jesús practicó con su ejemplo. Salía sin nada. Cuando Dios se hizo hombre, se anodado a Si Mismo (Fil 2:7). Cuando nació, no había lugar para Él sino en un establo (Lc 2:7). Durante su ministerio público Jesús no tenía donde reclinar la cabeza (Lc 9:58).

¿Cómo se puede aplicar esto a nosotros? Por ejemplo, si tienes tres hijos, obviamente el Señor quiere que tengan hogar, dinero, comida y ropa. Sin embargo, Él quiere que salgas en misión con Él, y quiere que salgas en la sencillez, austeridad, y pobreza apropiada de haberse crucificado al mundo (Gál 6:14). La lectura del evangelio de hoy día se aplica a todos nosotros. Practica esto con amor, verdad, y libertad.

Oración: Padre, te permito liberarme.

Promesa: “Ustedes han sido marcados con un sello por el Espíritu Santo prometido. Ese Espíritu es el anticipo de nuestra herencia y prepara la redención del pueblo que Dios adquirió para sí, para alabanza de Su gloria” (Ef 1:13-14).

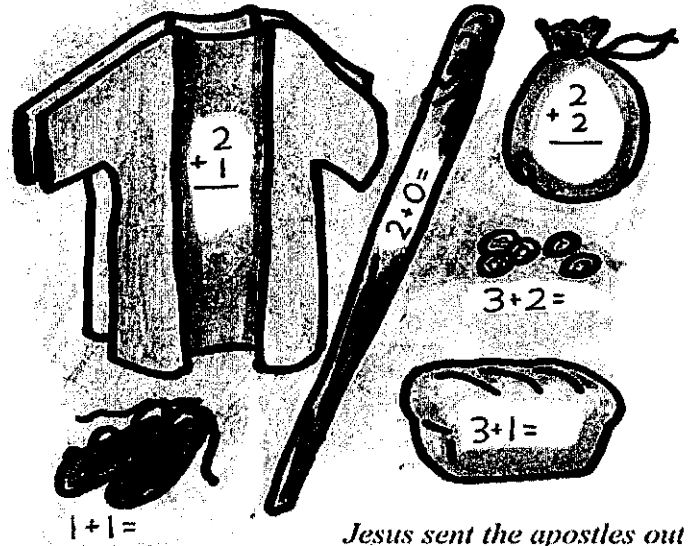
