Dear Parishioners,

Happy and Blessed Labor Day weekend! Here is part of an article by Monsignor Charles Pope about Labor Day from a Catholic perspective: *“As we celebrate Labor Day in the United States, it seems good to reflect on some teachings about human labor from the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC). **Human labor precedes Original Sin and hence is not an imposition due to sin but rather part of our original dignity.** God places man in the garden. There he lives ‘to till it and keep it.’ Work is not yet a burden, but rather the collaboration of man and woman with God in perfecting the visible creation (#378). **Human work is a duty and prolongs the work of creation.** Human work proceeds directly from persons created in the image of God and called to prolong the work of creation by subduing the earth, both with and for one another. Hence work is a duty: ‘If anyone will not work, let him not eat’ (2 Thes 3:10). Work honors the Creator’s gifts and the talents received from him (#2427). **Work can be sanctifying and redemptive.** Work can also be redemptive. By enduring the hardship of work in union with Jesus, the carpenter of Nazareth and the one crucified on Calvary, man collaborates in a certain fashion with the Son of God in his redemptive work. He shows himself to be a disciple of Christ by carrying the cross, daily, in the work he is called to accomplish. Work can be a means of sanctification and a way of animating earthly realities with the Spirit of Christ (#2427). **Work is an acceptable sacrifice to God.** For all their works, prayers, and apostolic undertakings, family and married life, daily work, relaxation of mind and body, if they are accomplished in the Spirit - indeed even the hardships of life if patiently borne - all these become spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. In the celebration of the Eucharist these may most fittingly be offered to the Father along with the body of the Lord (#901). **To work is to participate in the common good.** Participation in the common good is achieved first of all by taking charge of the areas for which one assumes personal*

*responsibility: by the care taken for the education of his family, by conscientious work, and so forth, man participates in the good of others and of society (#1914).” God Bless! **Saint Joseph the Worker, pray for us!***

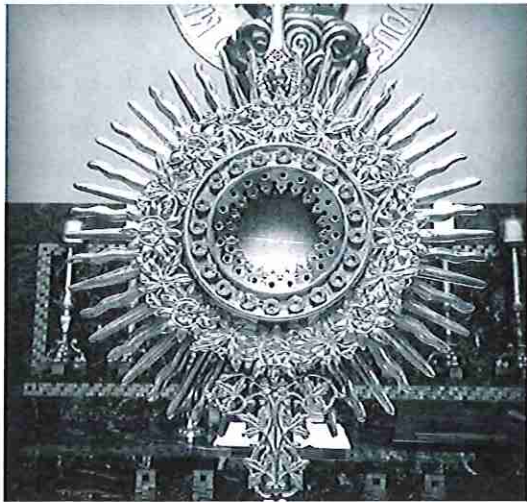

Queridos feligreses,

¡Feliz y bendito fin de semana del Día del Trabajo! Aquí hay un artículo de Monseñor Charles Pope sobre el Día del Trabajo desde una perspectiva Católica: *“Como celebramos el Día del Trabajo en los Estados Unidos, parece bueno reflexionar sobre algunas enseñanzas sobre el trabajo humano del Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica (CIC). El trabajo humano precede al pecado original y, por tanto, no es una imposición debida al pecado, sino más bien parte de nuestra dignidad original. Dios coloca al hombre en el jardín. Allí vive ‘para labrarlo y conservarlo’. El trabajo no es todavía una carga, sino la colaboración del hombre y la mujer con Dios en el perfeccionamiento de la creación visible (n. 378). El trabajo humano es un deber y prolonga el trabajo de creación. El trabajo humano procede directamente de personas creadas a imagen de Dios y llamadas a prolongar el trabajo de la creación sometiendo la tierra, tanto con los demás como entre ellos. Por tanto, el trabajo es un deber: ‘Si alguno no quiere trabajar, no coma’ (2 Ts 3:10). El trabajo honra los dones del Creador y los talentos que recibió de él (# 2427). El trabajo puede ser santificador y redentor. El trabajo también puede ser redentor. Al soportar las penurias del trabajo en unión con Jesús, el carpintero de Nazaret y el crucificado en el Calvario, el hombre colabora de cierta manera con el Hijo de Dios en su obra redentora. Se muestra discípulo de Cristo al llevar la cruz, diariamente, en la obra que está llamado a realizar. El trabajo puede ser un medio de santificación y una forma de animar las realidades terrenales con el Espíritu de Cristo (# 2427). El trabajo es un sacrificio aceptable para Dios. A pesar de todas sus obras, oraciones y empresas apostólicas, la vida familiar y matrimonial, el trabajo diario, la relajación de la mente y el cuerpo, si se realizan en el*

*Espíritu, incluso las dificultades de la vida si se soportan con paciencia, todos estos se convierten en sacrificios espirituales aceptables para todos. Dios a través de Jesucristo. En la celebración de la Eucaristía, estos se pueden ofrecer al Padre junto con el cuerpo del Señor (n. 901). Trabajar es participar del bien común. La participación en el bien común se logra ante todo haciéndose cargo de los ámbitos en los que se asume la responsabilidad personal: por el cuidado de la educación de su familia, por el trabajo concienzudo, etc., el hombre participa del bien de los demás y de la sociedad (#1914)”.

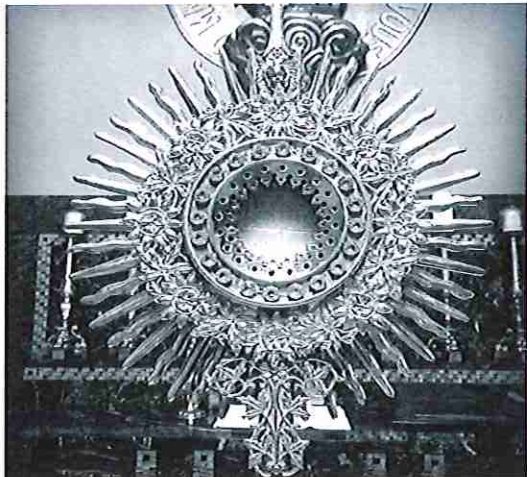

Misa de Aniversario de Bodas

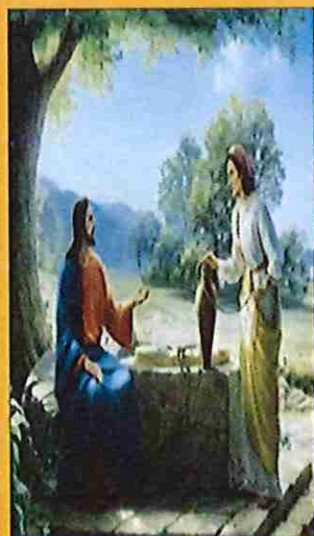

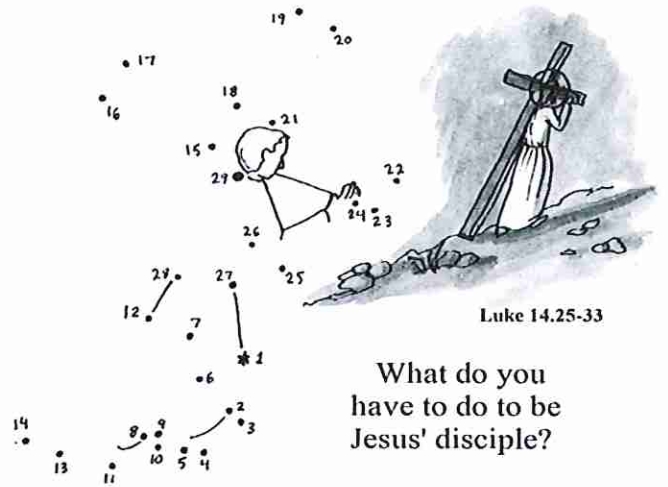

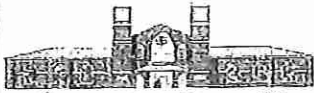


A THOUSAND YEARS in thy sight are but as YESTERDAY when it is past, or as a WATCH in the NIGHT.
