Dear Parishioners,

This Tuesday is the Feast of **Saint John Vianney**, the patron saint of parish priests. We have a statue of him in our church, next to the door that leads to the rectory. Born in Lyons, France, in 1786, Saint John Vianney heard the Lord calling him to the vocation to the priesthood as a young man. Once he entered the seminary, he struggled with his studies, specifically in learning Latin. Instead of giving up, he sought out help in private tutoring. He persevered through this difficulty and was ordained a priest. Fr. Vianney's first parish assignment was to a church in the little town of Ars, France. It was a very difficult assignment because the people had become indifferent and quite comfortable with their style of living. They didn't seem to want to grow in their relationship with the Lord. Through his preaching, his mortification, prayer and good works, Fr. Vianney won over the hearts of his parishioners, enkindling within them a desire to give themselves more to the Lord. In the winter months, he would hear Confessions for almost twelve hours a day, and during the summer months, he would be there for sixteen hours a day. He ate and slept very little, doing penance for his sins and for the sins of others. With the help of two women, he established a home for girls called "La Providence". Many people came back to the Lord through Saint John Vianney. From "The Saint of the Day" publication: "*Indifference toward religion, coupled with a love for material comfort, seem to be common signs of our times. A person from another planet observing us would not likely judge us to be pilgrim people, on our way to somewhere else. John Vianney, on the other hand, was a man on a journey with his goal before him at all times.*" My brothers and sisters, let us always remember that we are a pilgrim people, on a journey to Heaven. Let us allow the Lord to work in our lives, making time for Him each day through prayer, through weekly reception of His Body and Blood at Mass, and frequent reception of His forgiveness in the Sacrament of Confession. May Saint John Vianney enkindle within each one of us the desire to grow in our relationship with the Lord, and may he intercede for all of us who are priests (especially yours truly), that we may always be faithful in our vocations in serving you as the people God. God bless!


Food Bank

Mary at the Crossroads of History

STRETCHING EXERCISES

"Jesus said to them: 'There is no need for them to disperse. Give them something to eat yourselves.' " —Matthew 14:16 A large crowd, a deserted place, and a shortage of food — Jesus' disciples recognize that a problem is developing. In fact, they have even worked out a reasonable solution (Mt 14:15). They want Jesus to fix the problem according to their plan. But Jesus has a different approach. He says, "Give them something to eat yourselves" (Mt 14:16). Jesus wants His disciples to fix the problem according to His plan. Jesus' plan was to multiply loaves and fish to feed the hungry crowd. Before He would stretch the food, however, He wanted to stretch His disciples (see Jn 6:6). Jesus increases faith by stretching His followers to be larger vessels able to contain more faith. However, you don't have to wait for a problem to develop before your faith is increased. You can work with Jesus in advance by: repenting of sins so that you may be a larger, "distinguished vessel" (2 Tm 2:21), daily reading of "that gracious word of His which can enlarge you" (Acts 20:32), and frequent reception of the Eucharist. When Mary said "Yes" to God's plan, her womb was stretched as the Infant Jesus grew within her. Even more, her subsequent daily life with Jesus constantly stretched her. As we receive Jesus in reconciliation, word, and Eucharist, we carry His body within us, and He will stretch us. Open yourself to Jesus, and He will multiply your faith.

Prayer: Jesus, stretch me any way You choose so that I may increase in faith (see Lk 17:5).

Promise: "All those present ate their fill. The fragments remaining, when gathered up, filled twelve baskets." —Mt 14:20

Praise: St. Alphonsus, suffering himself from severe, crippling rheumatism, founded his congregation for "the most abandoned."

EJERCICIOS DE EXPANSIÓN

"Pero Jesús les dijo: 'No es necesario que se vayan, denles de comer ustedes mismos'" (Mateo 14:16).

Una gran multitud, un lugar inhabitado y falta de comida — los discípulos de Jesús reconocen que hay un problema en desarrollo. Hasta tienen una solución razonable (Mt 14:15). Ellos quieren que Jesús resuelva el problema de acuerdo con sus planes. Pero Jesús tiene otro plan. Él les dice, "denles de comer ustedes" (Mt 14:16). Jesús quiere que Sus discípulos solucionen el problema conforme a Su plan. El plan de Jesús era multiplicar los panes y los pescados para alimentar a la multitud hambrienta. Pero antes de aumentar la comida, Él quería ampliar la comprensión de los discípulos (ver Jn 6:6). Jesús incrementa la fe al ampliar el corazón de Sus discípulos para que sean vasos más grandes que puedan contener más fe. Sin embargo, no tienes que esperar que se presente un problema para desarrollar tu fe. De antemano, puedes trabajar con Jesús: arrepintiéndote de los pecados, para ser un "vaso distinguido" más grande (2 Tim 2:21), leyendo diariamente "la Palabra de su gracia que tiene poder para construir el edificio"

(Hch 20:32), y recibiendo la Eucaristía frecuentemente. Cuando María dijo "sí" al plan de Dios, su vientre se ensanchó a medida que el Niño Jesús crecía dentro de ella. Es más, de ahí en adelante, su vida con Jesús constantemente se amplió. Al recibir a Jesús en la reconciliación, la palabra y la Eucaristía, llevamos su cuerpo en nosotros y Él nos ensancha. Ábrete a Jesús y Él multiplicará tu fe.

Oración: Jesús, expándeme como Tú deseas para aumentar mi fe (ver Lc 17:5).

Promesa: "Todos comieron hasta saciarse y con los pedazos que sobraron se llenaron doce canastas" (Mt 14:20).

Alabanza: San Alfonso, sufriendo de un severo y lisiado caso de reuma, fundó su congregación para los más abandonados.

Domingo 18 del Tiempo Ordinario

Queridos feligreses,

Este martes es la fiesta de **San Juan Vianney**, el santo patrón de los párrocos. Tenemos una estatua de él en nuestra iglesia, al lado de la puerta que conduce a la rectoría. Nació en Lyon, Francia, en 1786, San Juan Vianney escuchó al Señor que lo llamaba a la vocación al sacerdocio cuando era joven. Una vez que ingresó al seminario, luchó con sus estudios, específicamente en el aprendizaje del latín. En lugar de darse por vencido, buscó ayuda en clases particulares. Perseveró a través de esta dificultad y fue ordenado sacerdote. La primera asignación parroquial de Padre Juan Vianney fue a una iglesia en el pequeño pueblo de Ars, Francia. Fue una tarea muy difícil porque la gente se había vuelto indiferente y bastante cómoda con su estilo de vida. No parecían querer crecer en su relación con el Señor. A través de su predicación, su mortificación, oración y buenas obras, el Padre Vianney se ganó los corazones de sus feligreses, encendiendo en ellos el deseo de entregarse más al Señor. En los meses de invierno, escuchaba Confesiones durante casi doce horas al día, y durante los meses de verano, estaba allí durante diecisésis horas al día. Comió y durmió muy poco, haciendo penitencia por sus pecados y por los pecados de los demás. Con la ayuda de dos mujeres, estableció un hogar para niñas llamado "La Providence". Muchas personas volvieron al Señor a través de San Juan Vianney. De la publicación "El Santo del Día": "*La indiferencia hacia la religión, junto con el amor por la comodidad material, parecen ser signos comunes de nuestros tiempos. Es probable que una persona de otro planeta que nos observa no nos juzgue como personas peregrinas, de camino a otro lugar. Juan Vianney, por otro lado, era un hombre en un viaje con su objetivo delante de él en todo momento.*". Mis hermanos y hermanas, recordemos siempre que somos un pueblo peregrino, en un viaje al cielo. Permitamos que el Señor trabaje en nuestras vidas, haciendo tiempo para Él cada día a través de la oración, recibiendo semanalmente Su Cuerpo y Sangre en la Misa, y recibir frecuentemente Su perdón en el Sacramento de la Confesión. Que San Juan Vianney encienda dentro de cada uno de nosotros el deseo de crecer en nuestra relación con el Señor, y que interceda por todos los que somos sacerdotes (especialmente este servidor), para que siempre podamos ser fieles en nuestras vocaciones al servirle. como el pueblo de Dios. ¡Dios les bendiga!

Jesus Feeds Five Thousand Men


with five loaves and two fish



In today's Gospel reading, the disciples see all the hungry people who had come to listen to Our Lord and to be healed. They know that they can't feed them all, so they ask Jesus to send them to the towns to buy food. But Jesus isn't limited by nature, because He is God. He blesses a bit of bread and fish and it becomes enough to feed over five thousand people!

Our Lord was showing us that He will provide for all our needs if we listen to Him, just like it says in today's reading from the prophet Isaiah. In this story He was providing for the people's bodily needs, but He also provides for our spiritual needs.

In Holy Communion, Jesus gives Himself to us for spiritual food. Just like He could do the miracle of feeding the five thousand, He works the miracle of turning bread and wine into His Body and Blood for us at every Mass. Now He feeds millions of people all over the world with Himself!




HE BECAME AN AUGUSTINIAN PRIEST AND LIVED IN A MONASTERY FOR 9 YEARS.


