Second Sunday of Ordinary Time, January 16, 2022

Dear Parishioners,

In this weekend's Gospel, we hear about the wedding feast at Cana, in which Jesus performed a miracle by turning water into wine. The last line of the Gospel says: "*Jesus did this as the beginning of His signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed His glory, and His disciples began to believe in Him*".

"And His disciples began to believe in Him". This is what the Lord wants of us - His bride, the Church.

He wants us to have faith in Him, to walk with Him, and to constantly seek His help. We are in a marital relationship with the Lord, and the Lord desires our fidelity toward Him. This fidelity includes the willingness to allow the Lord to change us, just like He changed the water into wine. My brothers and sisters, what do we need to change in our lives, so as to be more faithful in our marriage to our Lord? What areas of our lives do we need to invite the Lord into, so that He can change the water into wine - the old and ordinary parts of our lives into something new and extraordinary? Some practical suggestions include *giving more time for prayer, studying more about our beautiful Catholic Faith, being more public with our witnessing for Jesus, and even making a commitment to share our Catholic Faith with others - to evangelize.* Let us entrust all of our changes to our Blessed Mother. At the Wedding Feast, it was our Blessed Mother who noticed that the wine was running short, and she went to Jesus with the problem. Her intercession for the wedding couple helped them avoid the embarrassment of running out of wine at their wedding feast. At first, Jesus seems to ignore His mother's intercession, but notice Mary's patient waiting in prayer, and then the beautiful advice that she gives to the servers, "*to do whatever He tells you*". These words of our Blessed Mother serve as great advice for our marriage with the Lord - to do whatever Jesus asks of us, through listening to His word, allowing it to change us, and then putting it into practice in our lives, until we have finally arrived at the wedding Feast of Heaven. *Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death, God Bless!*





MLC is a crisis pregnancy center that offers free ultrasounds, pregnancy tests, parenting classes, and baby products to mothers in crisis pregnancies. LFH offers free housing to mothers in crisis pregnancies.





NO MORE?

“They have no more wine.” —John 2:3

We also say we have no more money, no more time, no more hope, peace, joy, etc. Although the Lord has promised to provide all our needs, we sometimes seem to be lacking our “daily bread” (Mt 6:11). When we have “no more,” we should listen to Mary and do whatever Jesus tells us (Jn 2:5). If we simply obey Him, He will take the water of our insufficiency and transform it into the wine of His plenty. Jesus has given us hundreds of commandments, and by His grace we can obey them all. At the center of all these commandments are those which Jesus gave us a few hours before His death on the cross. Jesus gave four commands at the Last Supper: Take, eat, drink, and do the Last Supper in memory of Him (Mt 26:26-27; Lk 22:19). If we do these commands, we will make present Jesus’ sacrifice on the cross. From the crucified Christ, blood and water flow, providing the needs of all people (see Jn 19:34). Do whatever Jesus tells you. Live the Mass. Make it the center of your life. Receive everything you need. Be deprived “no more.”

Prayer: Father, may I let You provide for me royally (see Phil 4:19).

Promise: “It is one and the same Spirit Who produces all these gifts, distributing them to each as He wills.” —1 Cor 12:11

Praise: Through faith, we know “that He who raised up the Lord Jesus will raise us up along with Jesus and place both us and you in His presence” (2 Cor 4:14). Alleluia! Presentation Ministries

¿NO MÁS?

“No tienen vino” (Juan 2:3). También decimos que no tenemos más dinero, tiempo, esperanza, paz, alegría. Aunque el Señor ha prometido suplir todas nuestras necesidades, a veces parece que nos falta nuestro “pan de cada día” (Mt 6:11). Cuando “no tenemos más”, debemos escuchar a María y hacer lo que Jesús nos diga (Jn 2:5). Si simplemente lo obedecemos, Él tomará el agua de nuestra insuficiencia y la transformará en el vino de Su abundancia. Jesús nos ha dado cientos de mandamientos, y por Su gracia podemos obedecerlos todos. En el centro de todos estos mandamientos están los que Jesús nos dio unas horas antes de Su muerte en la cruz. Jesús dio cuatro mandamientos en la Última Cena: tomen y coman, beban y cumplan la Última Cena en memoria de Él (Mt 26:26-27; Lc 22:19). Si cumplimos estos mandamientos, haremos presente el sacrificio de Jesús en la cruz. Del Cristo crucificado fluyen sangre y agua, que abastecen las necesidades de todas las personas (ver Jn 19:34). Haz lo que Jesús te dice. Vive la Misa. Hazla el centro de tu vida. Recibe todo lo que necesitas. “No” te lo niegues “más”.

Oración: Padre, que te deje colmarme regiamente (ver Fil 4:19).

Promesa: “Es el mismo y único Espíritu el que actúa, distribuyendo sus dones a cada uno en particular como Él quiere” (1 Co 12:11).

Alabanza: Por la fe sabemos que “Aquel que resucitó al Señor Jesús nos resucitará con Él y nos reunirá a su lado junto con ustedes” (2 Co 4:14).

Segundo Domingo de Tiempo Ordinario Enero 16, 2022

Queridos feligreses,

En el Evangelio de este fin de semana, escuchamos sobre la fiesta de bodas en Caná, en las que Jesús realizó un milagro al convertir el agua en vino. La última línea del Evangelio dice: *“Jesús hizo esto como el comienzo de sus señales en Caná de Galilea y así reveló su gloria, y sus discípulos comenzaron a creer en él”*. *“Y sus discípulos comenzaron a creer en él”*. Esto es lo que el Señor quiere de nosotros, Su novia, la Iglesia. **Él quiere que tengamos fe en Él, que caminemos con Él y que busquemos constantemente Su ayuda.** Estamos en una relación matrimonial con el Señor, y el Señor desea nuestra fidelidad hacia Él. Esta fidelidad incluye la disposición a dejar que el Señor nos cambie, como Él cambió el agua en vino. Mis hermanos y hermanas, ¿qué necesitamos cambiar en nuestra vida, para ser más fieles en nuestro matrimonio con nuestro Señor? ¿A qué áreas de nuestras vidas necesitamos invitar al Señor, para que Él pueda cambiar el agua en vino, las partes viejas y ordinarias de nuestras vidas en algo nuevo y extraordinario? *Algunas sugerencias prácticas incluyen dedicar más tiempo a la oración, estudiar más sobre nuestra hermosa Fe Católica, ser más públicos con nuestro testimonio de Jesús e incluso comprometernos a compartir nuestra Fe Católica con otros - evangelizar.* Confiemos todos nuestros cambios a nuestra Santísima Madre. En la Fiesta de Bodas, fue nuestra Santísima Madre quien notó que el vino se estaba acabando, y ella fue a Jesús con el problema. Su intercesión por la pareja de novios les ayudó a evitar la vergüenza de quedarse sin vino en su fiesta de bodas. Al principio, Jesús parece ignorar la intercesión de su madre, pero noten la espera paciente de María en oración, y luego el hermoso consejo que les da a los servidores, *“hagan lo que Él les diga”*. Estas palabras de nuestra Santísima Madre sirven como un gran consejo para nuestro matrimonio con el Señor: hacer lo que Jesús nos pida, escuchando Su palabra, permitiéndole cambiarnos, y luego poniéndola en práctica en nuestras vidas, hasta que lleguemos finalmente a la fiesta de bodas del cielo. *Santa María, Madre de Dios, ruega por nosotros pecadores, ahora y en la hora de nuestra muerte.* ¡Dios les bendiga!



Haha! Sebastian was a Christian all along! SLAM! BUT THEN HE WAS ARRESTED AND IMPRISONED!


ACCORDING TO HIS LEGEND HE WAS SHOT WITH ARROWS AND LEFT FOR DEAD.
