Dear Parishioners,

Happy and Blessed Easter!!! "Christ is Risen, indeed He is Risen!" These beautiful words are known as a traditional greeting and response to the beautiful mystery that we are celebrating. St. Paul says, *"If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all men most to be pitied. But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep"* (1Cor 15:19-20). The Resurrection of Jesus from the dead means everything to us as Christians. If Jesus didn't rise from the dead, then there would be no hope for any of us. There would be no point of going to Mass each weekend, or receiving God's forgiveness in the Sacrament of Confession, or praying each day, or even for that matter, doing good towards others, if Jesus did not rise from the dead. If there were no Resurrection, when we die, we would just be buried in the ground and that would be it. **Yet, we know that Jesus did rise from the dead.** We know this FACT through the Sacred Scriptures, and through the gift of faith that the Lord has given us. **Today, we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead, which gives meaning to our whole existence.** We were made by God and for God. Let us always live in this hope. Let us celebrate *today, the next 49 days of the Easter season, and for the rest of our earthly lives*, that Jesus Christ is risen from the dead. Let us also not be afraid to share this Good News with all we meet. God Bless!

RISEN LIFE IN JESUS

"Since you have been raised up in company with Christ, set your heart on what pertains to higher realms where Christ is seated at God's right hand. Be intent on things above rather than on things of earth." —Colossians 3:1-2

Alleluia! Jesus is risen! His tomb is empty! "Death has no more power over Him" (Rm 6:9). Alleluia!

Because we've been baptized into Christ, we have died with Him (Rm 6:4). "If we have been united with Him through likeness to His death, so shall we be through a like resurrection" (Rm 6:5). This very day we have already "been raised up" with Jesus to share in His glorious, heavenly, risen life (Col 3:1).

For many in the United States, the joy of Easter means returning to the things we gave up for Lent. It's back to chocolate, sweets, soft drinks, ice cream, etc. Yes, we do have to "celebrate and rejoice" on Easter (Lk 15:32), and these treats help us to celebrate. However, if we find our joy simply in returning to the old life we lived before Lent, we will have missed Easter.

Jesus is the Reason for the season! He is risen! We are invited to a risen life with Him so new, powerful, and exciting that we can't sufficiently celebrate it with the "old yeast," that is, our old joys and lifestyle (1 Cor 5:7). Let us "be intent on things above rather than on things of earth" (Col 3:2). Let's celebrate the fifty-day Easter season by immersing ourselves in God's Word, which is sweeter than the tastiest candy (Ps 119:103), and in the Eucharist, the "bread of sincerity and truth" (1 Cor 5:8).

Prayer: Father, give me fresh, risen ways to celebrate "this new life" (Acts 5:20). Praise and glory to You, risen Jesus!

Promise: "He saw and believed." —Jn 20:8

Praise: "This is the day the Lord has made; let us be glad and rejoice in it" (Ps 118:24). Jesus is risen! Alleluia!




Eucharistic Adoration

Feliz y Bendecida Pascua!!! "¡Cristo ha resucitado, ciertamente ha resucitado!" Estas hermosas palabras se conocen como saludo tradicional y respuesta al hermoso misterio que estamos celebrando. San Pablo dice: "Si para esta vida solamente hemos esperado en Cristo, somos de todos los hombres los más dignos de lástima. Pero, de hecho, Cristo ha resucitado de entre los muertos, las primicias de los que han dormido." (1Cor. 15:19-20). Sabemos este HECHO a través de las Sagradas Escrituras, y a través del don de la fe que el Señor nos ha dado. **Hoy, celebramos la Resurrección de Jesús de entre los muertos, que da sentido a toda nuestra existencia.**

Fuimos hechos por Dios y para Dios. Vivamos siempre en esta esperanza. Celebremos hoy, los próximos 49 días de la temporada de Pascua, y por el resto de nuestras vidas terrenales, que Jesucristo ha resucitado de entre los muertos. No tengamos miedo tampoco de compartir esta Buena Nueva con todos los que encontramos.

LA VIDA RESUCITADA EN JESÚS

“Ya que ustedes han resucitado con Cristo, busquen los bienes del cielo donde Cristo está sentado a la derecha de Dios. Tengan el pensamiento puesto en las cosas celestiales y no en las de la tierra” (Colosenses 3:1-2).

¡Aleluya! ¡Jesús ha resucitado! ¡Su tumba está vacía! “La muerte ya no tiene poder sobre Él” (Rom 6:9). ¡Aleluya!

Debido a que hemos sido bautizados en Cristo, hemos muerto con Él (Rom 6:4). “Porque si nos hemos identificado con Cristo por una muerte semejante a la suya, también nos identificaremos con Él en la resurrección” (Rom 6:5). Este mismo día ya hemos “resucitado” con Jesús para compartir Su vida gloriosa, celestial y resucitada (Col 3:1).

Para muchos en los Estados Unidos, la alegría de la Pascua significa volver a las cosas que renunciamos en Cuaresma. Vuelve el chocolate, los dulces, los refrescos, los helados. Sí, “es justo que haya fiesta y alegría” en Pascua (Lc 15:32), y estas golosinas nos ayudan a celebrar. Sin embargo, si encontramos nuestra alegría simplemente en regresar a la antigua vida que vivíamos antes de la Cuaresma, habremos perdido la Pascua.

¡Jesús es la Razón de la temporada! ¡Ha resucitado! Estamos invitados a una vida resucitada con Él tan nueva, poderosa y emocionante que no podemos celebrarla lo suficiente con la “vieja levadura”, es decir, nuestras viejas alegrías y estilo de vida

(1 Co 5:7). Tengamos “el pensamiento puesto en las cosas celestiales y no en las de la tierra” (Col 3:2). Celebremos los cincuenta días de Pascua sumergiéndonos en la Palabra de Dios, que es más dulce que la miel (Sal 119:103), y en la Eucaristía, el pan “de la pureza y la verdad” (1 Co 5:8).

Oración: Padre, dame formas frescas y elevadas de celebrar “esta nueva vida” (Hch 5:20). ¡Alabanza y gloria a Ti, Jesús resucitado!

Promesa: “Él también vio y creyó” (Jn 20:8).

Alabanza: “Este es el día que hizo el Señor: alegrémonos y regocijémonos en Él” (Sal 118:24). ¡Jesús ha resucitado! ¡Aleluya!



JESUS IS ALIVE!*





EARLY ON THE SUNDAY MORNING SOME WOMEN WENT TO JESUS' TOMB...




