Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parishioners,

Happy and Blessed Father's Day to all the men of our parish! Yes, I believe that all the men of our parish are fathers, whether it be biologically, or through adoption, or spiritually. ***First of all, to our biological and adoptive fathers***, thank you for your fatherhood to your children. It is such an important and vital role that you play in their lives. I think back to my own childhood, and how much I learned from my dad. He was the head of the household, who lead the way, and protected the whole family. He was a teacher, who led by both word and example. He was a spiritual father, making sure that his children were being brought up in the Catholic Faith, taking us to Mass EVERY Sunday, and teaching us the difference between right and wrong. At times, tough love was needed, so that we would stay on the right path. And even now, with his children all grown up, my dad continues to be a role model, example, and father to us. On the Feast of St. Joseph (March 19th, 2014), Pope Francis gave this advice to all the fathers of the world: *"Be close to your children.... they need you. Just as St. Joseph was close to Jesus in his physical, psychological and spiritual growth, you too must be guardians in age, wisdom and grace"*. ***Then, there are our spiritual fathers, which first and foremost includes our priests.*** Yes, priests are fathers. Through our very vocation, we have many spiritual children. Here are some beautiful words from one of our spiritual fathers - our Holy Father Pope Francis: *"The innate desire to be a father, he said, is ingrained in all men, even priests, in giving their lives and protecting their spiritual children. Fatherhood is giving life to others, giving life, giving life...For us, it is pastoral paternity, spiritual fatherhood, but this is still giving life, this is still becoming fathers."* (June 26, 2013). ***Our other spiritual fathers also***

include our godfathers, and other men who have led us closer to Christ through their word and example of living the Faith. On this Father's Day Weekend, let us thank God the Father for all of the fathers in our lives. ***St. Joseph, pray for us!***

WITHER-PROOF

“I, the Lord...wither up the green tree, and make the withered tree bloom.” —Ezekiel 17:24

Once Jesus looked for fruit on a fig tree. The tree had no fruit, only leaves. Jesus cursed that fig tree and it “withered up instantly” to its roots (Mt 21:19; Mk 11:20). It didn’t bear fruit, for it was not yet the season for figs (Mk 11:13). This could be Jesus’ way of indicating that the kingdom of God was now at hand. The time of Jesus’ visitation came (Lk 19:44), and there was no fruit to be found after “three years” of ministry (see Lk 13:6-9).

In the natural world, some seasons are for bearing fruit and others for being dormant. In the kingdom of God, however, we are to bear fruit “in season and out of season” (2 Tm 4:2, RSV-CE). In God’s kingdom, the trees bear fruit every month of the year (Rv 22:2); there is no off-season.

We may be weak and tiny, yet the Lord can make us bloom “and bear fruit” for His Kingdom (Ez 17:23). Though we may be old and “withered,” He will make “the withered tree bloom” (Ez 17:24). Jesus heals the withered (see Lk 6:6).

Rooted in the Word of God, we will be a tree planted by streams of water, yielding constant fruit without withering (Ps 1:3, RSV-CE; see also Ez 47:12, RSV-CE). We will bear fruit even in old age when our bodies would normally wither (Ps 92:15; Is 40:29-31).

A time will come when we must bear fruit (see Lk 13:9; Jn 15:2-6). If we bear no fruit, we will be “like a withered, rejected branch, picked up to be thrown in the fire and burnt” (Jn 15:6). Be wither-proof. Stay rooted in Jesus.

Prayer: Father, give me such a hunger for Your Word that I will become wither-proof and bear the abundant fruit You seek.

Promise: “We walk by faith, not by sight.” —2 Cor 5:7

Praise: Alleluia! Jesus will come again in glory. Praise be to Jesus!

Décimo primero Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

16 de Junio, 2024

Queridos feligreses,

¡Feliz y Bendecido Día del Padre a todos los hombres de nuestra parroquia! Sí, creo que todos los hombres de nuestra parroquia son padres, ya sea biológicamente, o por adopción, o espiritualmente. ***En primer lugar, a nuestros padres biológicos y adoptivos,*** gracias por su paternidad a sus hijos. Es un papel tan importante y vital que juegas en sus vidas. Pienso en mi propia infancia y en todo lo que aprendí de mi padre. Él era el cabeza de familia, quien marcaba el camino y protegía a toda la familia. Era un maestro, que dirigía tanto con la palabra como con el ejemplo. Era un padre espiritual, asegurándose de que sus hijos fueran criados en la fe católica, llevándonos a Misa TODOS los domingos y enseñándonos la diferencia entre el bien y el mal. A veces, se necesitaba un amor duro para permanecer en el camino correcto. E incluso ahora, con sus hijos todos crecidos, mi papá sigue siendo un modelo a seguir, un ejemplo y un padre para nosotros. En la fiesta de San José (19 de marzo de 2014), el Papa Francisco dio este consejo a todos los padres del mundo: *"Estén cerca de sus hijos... ellos se necesitan. Así como San José estuvo cerca de Jesús en su crecimiento físico, psíquico y espiritual, también ustedes deben ser guardianes en edad, sabiduría y gracia".* ***Luego, están nuestros padres espirituales, que ante todo incluyen a nuestros sacerdotes.*** Sí, los sacerdotes son padres. Por nuestra misma vocación, tenemos muchos hijos espirituales. Aquí hay algunas hermosas palabras de uno de nuestros padres espirituales, nuestro Santo Padre, el Papa Francisco: *"El deseo innato de ser padre, dijo, está arraigado en todos los hombres, incluso en los sacerdotes, al dar su vida y proteger a sus hijos espirituales. Paternidad es dar vida a los demás, dar vida, dar vida...Para nosotros*

es paternidad pastoral, paternidad espiritual, pero esto es aún dar vida, esto es aún ser padres" (26 de junio de 2013). ***Nuestros otros padres espirituales también incluyen nuestros padrinos y otros hombres que nos han acercado a Cristo a través de su palabra y ejemplo de vivir la Fe.*** En este fin de semana del Día del Padre, demos gracias a Dios Padre por todos los padres en nuestras vidas. ***¡San José, ruega por nosotros!***

PRUEBA INMARCESIBLE

“Yo, el Señor, ... hago secar el árbol verde y reverdecer al árbol seco” (Ezequiel 17:24).

Una vez Jesús buscó fruto en una higuera. El árbol no tenía fruto, solo hojas. Jesús maldijo esa higuera y "se marchitó instantáneamente" hasta sus raíces (Mt 21:19; Mc 11:20). No dio fruto, porque no era la época de los higos (Mc 11:13). Esta podría ser la manera en que Jesús indica que el reino de Dios estaba ahora cerca. Llegó el momento de la visita de Jesús (Lc 19:44), y no se encontró fruto después de "tres años" de ministerio (ver Lc 13:6-9).

En el mundo natural, algunas estaciones son para dar fruto y otras para estar latentes. En el reino de Dios, sin embargo, debemos dar fruto "con ocasión o sin ella" (2 Tim 4:2). En el reino de Dios, los árboles dan fruto cada mes del año (Ap 22:2); No hay temporada baja.

Podemos ser débiles y pequeños, pero el Señor puede hacernos florecer "y dar fruto" para Su Reino (Ez 17:23). Aunque seamos viejos y "marchitos", Él hará florecer "el árbol marchito" (Ez 17:24). Jesús sana a los marchitos (ver Lc 6:6).

Arraigados en la Palabra de Dios, seremos un árbol plantado junto a corrientes de agua, dando fruto constante sin marchitarse (Sal 1:3; ver también Ez 47:12). Daremos fruto siendo adultos mayores, cuando nuestros cuerpos normalmente se marchitarían (Sal 92:15; Is 40:29-31).

Llegará un tiempo en que tendremos que dar fruto (ver Lc 13:9; Jn 15:2-6). Si no damos fruto, seremos "como el sarmiento que se tira y se seca; después se recoge, se arroja al fuego y arde" (Jn 15:6). Sé una prueba inmarcesible. Mantente arraigado en Jesús.

Oración: Padre, dame tal hambre de Tu Palabra que me pueda convertir en una prueba

sin mancha y llevaré el fruto abundante que buscas.

Promesa: “Porque nosotros caminamos en la fe y todavía no vemos claramente” (2 Co 5:7).

Alabanza: ¡Aleluya! Jesús vendrá de nuevo en gloria. ¡Alabado sea Jesús!

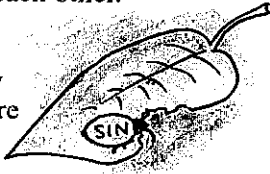

the kingdom of heaven

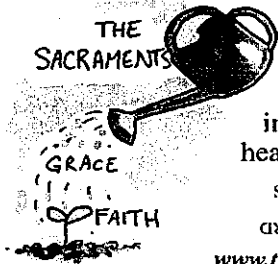
