Fifth Sunday of Ordinary Time, February 6, 2022

Dear Parishioners,

Last weekend, we had quite the snowstorm here in the Northeast. As many of you may have been aware, because of the impending storm, Bishop Tobin had dispensed Catholics from the Sunday Mass obligation. At the same time, both Fr. Rowley and myself were available to celebrate Mass, for those who came to the Church. Although no one came to the Sacrament of Confession or the Vigil Mass, we were still available for those Sacraments. On Sunday at Saint John the Baptist, there were 12 people present for the 9:30 morning Mass in English, and about 60 people present for the 11:30am Mass in Spanish. On Sunday at Saint Marys, there were 8 people present for the 9am Mass and 5 more people present for the 11am Mass. Having parishioners present at the Mass is one of the reasons why we will never "cancel" the Mass. Secondly, and most important, is the fact that the Mass is "the source and summit of the Christian life"(Catholic Catechism #1324)), and the Church encourages us priests to celebrate Mass daily, even if no one is present. It is that act of Christ and the Church in which priests fulfill their primary function. My brothers and sisters, may each of us never take for granted the center of our Catholic Faith, which is **the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass**. Here are some beautiful quotes by some of the Saints of our Church about the Holy Mass: *"The Mass is the most perfect form of prayer!"*(Pope Paul VI); *"The heavens open and multitudes of angels come to assist in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. It is most true that he who attends holy Mass shall be freed from many evils and from many dangers, both seen and unseen."*(Saint Gregory the Great); *"The angels surround and help the priest when he is celebrating Mass. He who devoutly hears holy Mass will receive a great vigor to enable him to resist mortal sin, and there shall be pardoned to him all venial sins which he may have committed up to that hour."*(Saint Augustine); *"If we really understood the Mass, we would die of joy. There is nothing so great as the Eucharist. If God had something more precious, He would have given it to us."*(Saint John Vianney); *"It would be easier for the world to survive without the sun than to do without Holy Mass."*(Saint Padre Pio). God Bless!

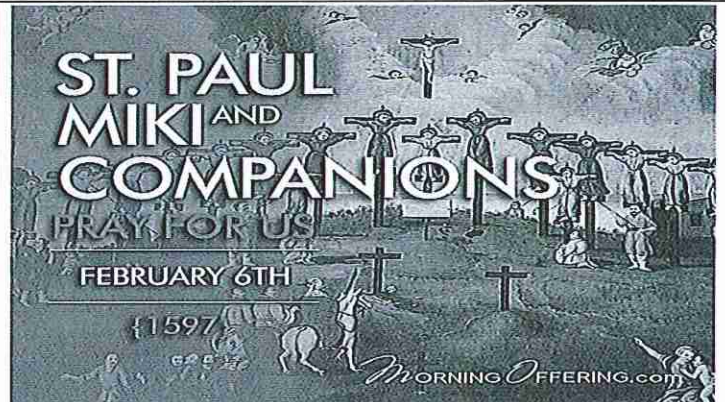
Faith Formation Convocation Saturday, March 19

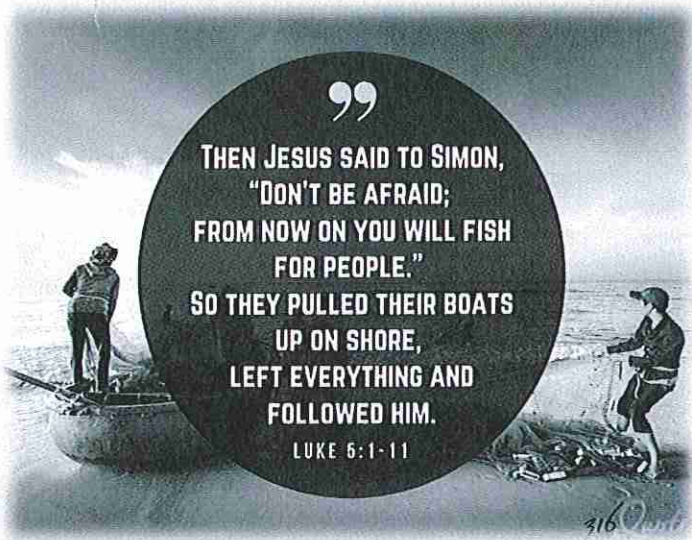

Saint Paul Miki and Companions' Story. Nagasaki, Japan, is familiar to Americans as the city on which the second atomic bomb was dropped, immediately killing over 37,000 people. Three and a half centuries before, 26 martyrs of Japan were crucified on a hill, now known as the Holy Mountain, overlooking Nagasaki. Among them were priests, brothers, and laymen, Franciscans, Jesuits, and members of the Secular Franciscan Order; there were catechists, doctors, simple artisans, and servants, old men and innocent children—all united in a common faith and love for Jesus and his Church. Brother Paul Miki, a Jesuit and a native of Japan, has become the best known among the martyrs of Japan. While hanging upon a cross, Paul Miki preached to the people gathered for the execution: "The sentence of judgment says these men came to Japan from the Philippines, but I did not come from any other country. I am a true Japanese. The only reason for my being killed is that I have taught the doctrine of Christ. I certainly did teach the doctrine of Christ. I thank God it is for this reason I die. I believe that I am telling only the truth before I die. I know you believe me and I want to say to you all once again: Ask Christ to help you to become happy. I obey Christ. After Christ's example I forgive my persecutors. I do not hate them. I ask God to have pity on all, and I hope my blood will fall on my fellow men as a fruitful rain." When missionaries returned to Japan in the 1860s, at first they found no trace of Christianity. But after establishing themselves they found that thousands of Christians lived around Nagasaki and that they had secretly preserved the faith. Beatified in 1627, the martyrs of Japan were finally canonized in 1862.

Reflection: Today, a new era has come for the Church in Japan. Although the number of Catholics is not large, the Church is respected and has total religious freedom. The spread of Christianity in the Far East is slow and difficult. Faith such as that of the 26 martyrs is needed today as much as in 1597.

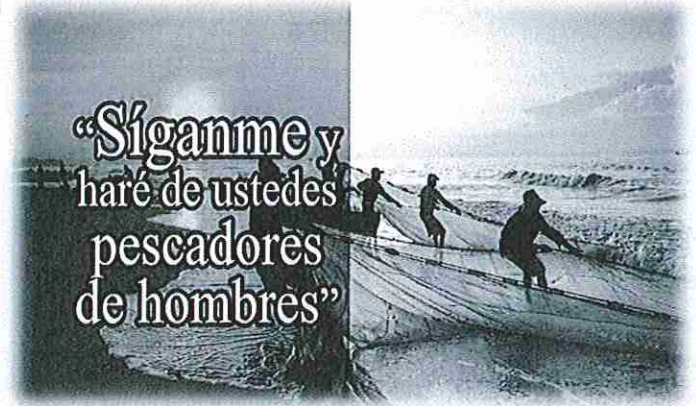
HIS CALL TO GIVE ALL

“Leave me, Lord. I am a sinful man.” —Luke 5:8
 Isaiah, St. Paul, and St. Peter were profoundly touched by an encounter with Almighty God. Each saw the glory and majesty of God and were filled with awe and fear of the Lord. They were cut to the heart, and realized both God’s holiness and their own sinfulness. God touched them, and this touch removed their sins. Thus purified, God called them, and each responded by giving his life to the Lord: “Here I am...send me!” (Is 6:8) God is creative in the ways He touches us. Peter was a professional fisherman; Jesus touched him on the job (Lk 5:3-11). Paul was actively persecuting Jesus; the Lord touched Paul in the midst of his opposition (Acts 9:1-19). Isaiah was inside the Temple in Jerusalem, presumably worshipping and serving God, when the Lord touched him (Is 6:1ff). The Lord can touch you at any moment, in any state of life, whether serving Him or opposing Him. Not everyone has such a vivid encounter with Almighty God. Nonetheless, He gives each of us the opportunity to encounter Him in many ways: the Sacraments, the Scriptures, the Church and its Catechism, the Holy Spirit, the Blessed Mother, guardian angels, other Christians, the beauty of creation, and so many more. Therefore, repent deeply. “Seek the Lord while He may be found” (Is 55:6). Open the Bible and read it. Go to Mass, daily if possible. “Seek to serve Him constantly” (Ps 105:4).

Prayer: Lord, may I “turn now ten times the more to seek” You (Bar 4:28). Touch me and convict me of my sinfulness. Grace me to hear and answer Your call. I am totally Yours.

Promise: “The Lord will complete what He has done for me.” —Ps 138:8

Pedro era un pescador profesional; Jesús lo tocó en el trabajo (Lc 5:3-11). Pablo estaba activamente persiguiendo a Jesús; el Señor tocó a Pablo en medio de su oposición (Hch 9:1-19). Isaías estaba dentro del Templo en Jerusalén, presuntamente alabando y sirviendo a Dios, cuando el Señor lo tocó (Is 6:1ss). El Señor te puede tocar a ti en cualquier momento, en cualquier estado de vida, si los sirves o si te opones a Él. No todos tienen un encuentro tan vívido con Dios Todopoderoso. Sin embargo, Él nos da a cada uno la oportunidad de encontrarlo de muchas maneras: los sacramentos, las escrituras, la Iglesia, Su Catecismo, el Espíritu Santo, María Santísima, los ángeles de la guarda, otros cristianos, la belleza de la creación, y de muchas maneras más. Por esto, arrepíentete profundamente. “Busquen al Señor mientras se deja encontrar” (Is 55:6). Abre la Biblia y léela. Ve a la Misa, diariamente si posible. “Recurran al Señor y a su poder, busquen constantemente su rostro” (Sal 105:4).

Oración: Señor, que te “busque con un empeño diez veces mayor” (Bar 4:28). Tócame y convénceme de mis pecados. Dame la gracia para oír y responder a Tu llamada. Soy Tuyo enteramente.

Promesa: “El Señor lo hará todo por mí” (Sal 138:8).

Quinto Domingo de Tiempo Ordinario

Febrero 6, 2022

Queridos feligreses,

El fin de semana pasado tuvimos una gran tormenta de nieve aquí en el noreste. Como muchos de ustedes sabrán, debido a la tormenta inminente, el obispo Tobin había excusado a los Católicos de la obligación de la Misa dominical. Al mismo tiempo, tanto Padre Rowley y yo estuvimos disponibles para celebrar Misa, para aquellos que vinieron a la Iglesia. Aunque nadie vino al Sacramento de la Confesión o la Misa de Vigilia, todavía estábamos disponibles para esos Sacramentos. El Domingo en San Juan Bautista, había 12 personas presentes para la Misa de las 9:30 de la mañana en inglés y unas 60 personas para la Misa de las 11:30 en español. El Domingo en Saint Marys, había 8 personas presentes para la Misa de las 9am y 5 personas más presentes para la Misa de las 11am. Tener feligreses presentes en la Misa es una de las razones por las que nunca "cancelaremos" la Misa. En segundo lugar, y la más importante, es el hecho de que la Misa es "la fuente y cumbre de la vida cristiana" (Catecismo Católico #1324), y la Iglesia nos anima a los sacerdotes a celebrar la Misa diariamente, incluso si no hay nadie presente. Es aquel acto de Cristo y de la Iglesia en el que los sacerdotes cumplen su función primordial. Mis hermanos y hermanas, que cada uno de nosotros nunca dé por sentado el centro de nuestra Fe Católica, que es el **Santo Sacrificio de la Misa**. Aquí hay algunas citas hermosas de algunos de los Santos de nuestra Iglesia sobre la Santa Misa: "*La Misa es la forma más perfecta de oración!*" (Papa Pablo VI); "*Los cielos se abren y multitudes de ángeles vienen a asistir en el Santo Sacrificio de la Misa. Es muy cierto que el que asiste a la Santa Misa será librado de muchos males y de muchos peligros, tanto visibles como invisibles.*" (San Gregorio); "*Los ángeles rodean y ayudan al sacerdote cuando está celebrando la Misa. El que oye la Santa Misa con devoción recibirá un gran vigor para poder resistir pecado mortal, y le serán perdonados todos los pecados veniales que haya cometido hasta esa hora.*" (San Agustín); "*Si entendiéramos realmente la Misa, moriríamos de alegría. No hay nada tan grande como la Eucaristía. Si Dios tuviera algo más precioso, nos lo habría dado.*" (San Juan Vianney; "*Sería más fácil para el mundo sobrevivir sin el sol que prescindir de la Santa Misa.*" (San Padre Pío). ¡Dios les bendiga!

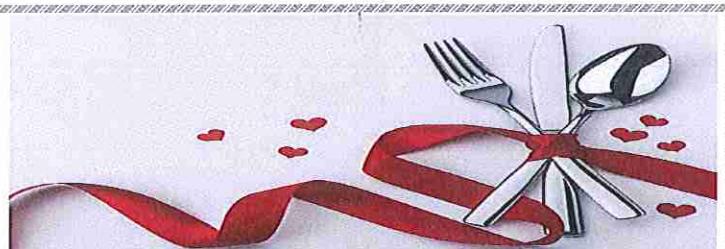
CURSO BÍBLICO

Para jóvenes adultos de 18 a 35 años

Nuestra Parroquia San Juan Bautista nos invita a participar de este nuevo curso: Aprender la importancia de la Alianza y el amor de Dios con nosotros conociendo el antiguo testamento. Temas de formación cristiana como aprender a vivir servir y amar y así poder profundizar verdaderamente la Palabra de Dios para responder a tus inquietudes de la vida. Un gran santo es San Pablo Miki, natural de Japón, que entregó su vida a la Compañía de Jesús y acabó siendo el primer japonés martirizado por predicar el Evangelio durante el s. XVI. Junto a él, otros mártires que dieron su vida hasta la sangre por anunciar a Jesús. Cuando el cristianismo empezó a propagarse por Japón a raíz de la predicación de San Francisco Javier, los líderes empezaron a perseguir al cristianismo por temerse que fuese un proceso de conquista por parte del Imperio español. Se decretó por ello la expulsión de los misioneros extranjeros en el 1587, no obstante algunos se quedaron bajo la amenaza de persecución. El gobernador Hideyoshi mandó arrestar a varios franciscanos llegados desde Filipinas hasta tierras niponas. La policía detuvo así a Pablo Miki, Diego Kisai y Juan de Goto, todos de la Compañía de Jesús. Miki era un gran orador, despertando la fe en el corazón de varios budistas en su región natal. Cuando fue arrestado, solo le quedaban dos meses para ordenarse. Los tres fueron llevados a Milyako, la actual Kyoto, donde acabaron encarcelados junto a otro grupo de franciscanos y terciarios. Fueron los 24 llevados a la plaza pública y juzgados para ser crucificados. Un mes de marcha penosa les hizo llegar a Nagasaki. En el camino, todos siguieron predicando el Evangelio entre las gentes que muchas veces les insultaban y hacían burla. Al ser llevados a la colina donde habían preparado las cruces, empezaron a cantar el Te Deum como modo de acción de gracias. Aun se oía a Pablo Miki invitando a la conversión a los verdugos que acaban con su vida. Murió junto con los otros 23 en esa colina, él, después de ser traspasado en el pecho por una lanza. Fue canonizado en 1862 por Pío IX.

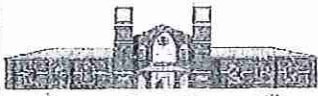
