Second Sunday of Lent

February 25, 2024

Dear Parishioners,
 Here is a beautiful article entitled: **“Journey to the Foot of the Cross - 10 Things to Remember for Lent”**, by Bishop David L. Ricken of Green Bay, Wisconsin. Here are the first five:
 “(1) *Remember the formula.* The Church does a good job capturing certain truths with easy-to-remember lists and formulas: 10 Commandments, 7 sacraments, 3 persons in the Trinity. For Lent, the Church gives us almost a slogan - ***Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving*** - as the three things we need to work on during the season.
 (2) It’s a time of *prayer*. Lent is essentially an act of prayer spread out over 40 days. As we pray, we go on a journey, one that hopefully brings us closer to Christ and leaves us changed by the encounter with him.
 (3) It’s a time to *fast*. With the fasts of Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, meatless Fridays, and our personal disciplines interspersed, Lent is the only time many Catholics these days actually fast. And maybe that’s why it gets all the attention. “What are you giving up for Lent? Hotdogs? Beer? Jelly beans?” It’s almost a game for some of us, but fasting is actually a form of penance, which helps us turn away from sin and toward Christ.
 (4) *It’s a time to work on discipline.* The 40 days of Lent are also a good, set time to work on personal discipline in general. Instead of giving something up, it can be doing something positive. “I’m going to exercise more. I’m going to pray more. I’m going to be nicer to my family, friends and coworkers.”
 (5) *It’s about dying to yourself.* The more serious side of Lenten discipline is that it’s about more than self-control – it’s about finding aspects of yourself that are less than Christ-like and letting them die. The suffering and death of Christ are foremost on our minds during Lent,

and we join in these mysteries by suffering, dying with Christ and being resurrected in a purified form.” Let’s continue to have a fruitful Lent, encouraging and praying for one another. God Bless!

“SHALL I GIVE MY FIRST-BORN?” (SEE MI 6:7)

“Take your son, Isaac, your only one, whom you love...” —Genesis 22:2

God the Father asked Abraham to sacrifice his only son, the one whom he loved (Gn 22:2). God the Father Did Himself What He asked Abraham to do. For the Father, Jesus was His “Isaac,” His only Son, His well-beloved (Mk 9:7). Nonetheless, the Father did sacrifice Jesus, “His Beloved” (Mt 17:5).

God spared Abraham and Isaac, yet He “did not spare His own Son but handed Him over for the sake of us all” (Rm 8:32). Scripture says that God “laid upon [Jesus] the guilt of us all” (Is 53:6). Just as Abraham had laid the wood upon Isaac’s shoulders (Gn 22:6), God the Father allowed the wood of the cross and the sins of the world to be laid upon His Son’s shoulders.

Therefore, realize to the depths of your soul that God is for you. “If God is for us, who can be against us?” (Rm 8:31) God the Father so loves you that He sent His only Son, that by believing in Jesus, you might have eternal life with Him in heaven (Jn 3:16). What God asks of you is to surrender your all to Him (Lk 10:27). Yet God first gave His all to you, His very heart, His Son Whom He loved (Mk 9:7).

Therefore, love the Lord with all your heart, soul, strength, and mind (Lk 10:27). Give your life generously to Him Who has given so generously to you.

Prayer: Father, You have never held anything back from me. Show me what I am holding back from You. I beg for the grace to give everything to You.

Promise: “My vows to the Lord I will pay in the presence of all His people.” —Ps 116:18

Praise: Praise and honor to You, Lord Jesus! You take us to the desert to speak to our hearts (Hos 2:16). We offer You our lives as a sacrifice of praise (Ps 50:23).

Segundo Domingo de Cuaresma ***25 de febrero, 2024***

Queridos feligreses,

Aquí hay un hermoso artículo titulado: “Viaje al pie de la cruz: 10 cosas para recordar durante la Cuaresma”, del obispo David L. Ricken de Green Bay, Wisconsin. Aquí están los primeros cinco: “(1) **Recuerda la fórmula.** La Iglesia hace un buen trabajo capturando ciertas verdades con listas y fórmulas fáciles de recordar: 10 Mandamientos, 7 sacramentos, 3 personas en la Trinidad. Para la Cuaresma, la Iglesia nos da casi un lema: **Oración, Ayuno y Limosna**, como las tres cosas en las que debemos trabajar durante el tiempo. (2) **Es un tiempo de oración.** La Cuaresma es esencialmente un acto de oración que se extiende a lo largo de 40 días. Mientras oramos, emprendemos un viaje que, con suerte, nos acerca a Cristo y nos deja transformados por el encuentro con él. (3) **Es tiempo de ayunar.** Con los ayunos del Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo, los viernes sin carne y nuestras disciplinas personales intercaladas, la Cuaresma es el único momento en que muchos Católicos en estos días realmente ayunan. Y tal vez por eso recibe toda la atención. “¿A qué estás renunciando durante la Cuaresma? ¿Perros calientes? ¿Cerveza? ¿Frijolitos confitados?” Es casi un juego para algunos de nosotros, pero el ayuno es en realidad una forma de penitencia que nos ayuda a alejarnos del pecado y acercarnos a Cristo. (4) **Es un momento para trabajar en la disciplina.** Los 40 días de Cuaresma también son un buen tiempo para trabajar la disciplina personal en general. En lugar de renunciar a algo, puede hacer algo positivo. “Voy a hacer más ejercicio. Voy a orar más. Voy a ser más amable con mi familia, amigos y compañeros de trabajo”. (5) **Se trata de morir a uno mismo.** El lado más serio de la disciplina de Cuaresma es que se trata de algo más que autocontrol: se trata de encontrar aspectos de uno mismo que no se parecen a Cristo y dejarlos morir. El sufrimiento y la muerte de Cristo son lo más importante en nuestras mentes durante la Cuaresma, y nos unimos a estos misterios sufriendo, muriendo con Cristo y resucitando en una forma purificada”. Sigamos teniendo una Cuaresma fructífera, animándonos y orando unos por otros. ¡Dios los bendiga! Padre Sistare

¿OFRECERÉ A MI PRIMOGÉNITO? (VER MIQ 6:7)

“Toma a tu hijo único, el que tanto amas, a Isaac” (Génesis 22:2).

Dios Padre pidió a Abraham que sacrificara a su único hijo, al que amaba (Gn 22:2). Dios Padre hizo por sí mismo lo que le pidió a Abraham que hiciera. Para el Padre, Jesús era su “Isaac”, Su Hijo único, Su amado (Mc 9:7). Sin embargo, el Padre sacrificó a Jesús, “Su Amado” (Mt 17:5).

Dios perdonó a Abraham e Isaac, pero “no escatimó a Su propio Hijo, sino que lo entregó por todos nosotros” (Rom 8:32). La Escritura dice que Dios “hizo recaer sobre Él [Jesús] las iniquidades de todos nosotros” (Is 53:6). Así como Abraham había puesto la leña sobre los hombros de Isaac (Gn 22:6), Dios Padre permitió que la leña de la cruz y los pecados del mundo fueran puestos sobre los hombros de Su Hijo.

Por lo tanto, date cuenta en lo más profundo de tu alma que Dios es para ti. “Si Dios está con nosotros, ¿quién estará contra nosotros?” (Rom 8:31) Dios Padre os ama tanto que envió a Su Hijo único, para que creyendo en Jesús tengáis vida eterna con Él en el cielo (Jn 3:16). Lo que Dios te pide es que le entregues todo a Él (Lc 10:27). Sin embargo, Dios primero te dio todo a ti, Su mismo corazón, Su Hijo a Quien amaba (Mc 9:7).

Por tanto, ama al Señor con todo tu corazón, alma, fuerzas y mente (Lc 10:27). Entrega tu vida generosamente a Aquel que tan generosamente te la ha dado.

Oración: Padre, nunca me has ocultado nada. Muéstrame lo que te estoy ocultando. Te pido la gracia de darte todo a Ti.

Promesa: “Cumpliré mis votos al Señor, en presencia de todo Su pueblo” (Sal 116:18).

Alabanza: ¡Alabanza y honor a Ti, Señor Jesús! Nos llevas al desierto para hablar a nuestros corazones (Os 2:16). Te ofrecemos nuestras vidas como sacrificio de alabanza (Sal 50:23).
