

Dear Parishioners,
This weekend, we celebrate the **Solemnity of Christ the King**. It is the last Sunday of the 2022 Liturgical Year. Next Sunday, we will begin our new Liturgical Year of 2023 with the First Sunday of Advent. What is the significance of today's Feast of Christ the King? I found the following reflection from "[CatholicCulture.org](https://www.catholicculture.org)": "The Feast of Christ the King was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925 as an antidote to secularism, a way of life which leaves God out of man's thinking and living and organizes his life as if God did not exist. *The feast is intended to proclaim in a striking and effective manner Christ's royalty over individuals, families, society, governments, and nations.*" In Pope Pius XI's own words: "*If to Christ our Lord is given all power in heaven and on earth; if all men, purchased by his precious blood, are by a new right subjected to his dominion; if this power embraces all men, it must be clear that not one of our faculties is exempt from his empire. He must reign in our minds, which should assent with perfect submission and firm belief to revealed truths and to the doctrines of Christ. He must reign in our wills, which should obey the laws and precepts of God. He must reign in our hearts, which should spurn natural desires and love God above all things, and cleave to him alone.*" (*Quas Primas*, 33). My brothers and sisters, let each of us allow Jesus Christ our King to reign in our minds, wills, and hearts. As we gather together this coming Thursday for **Thanksgiving**, let us give thanks to the Lord for all that He has done in our lives: grateful for the very gift of life - for being alive; grateful for the gift of Eternal Life - that Jesus won for us through His Passion, Death and Resurrection; grateful for our Catholic Faith and the Church that Jesus founded for us - to help guide us to Eternal Life; grateful for our Blessed Mother, the Saints, and all of the angel's (especially our guardian angels) intercession in our lives; grateful for the gift of our families, relatives, and friends - never taking these relationships for granted; grateful to the Lord for our parish family -

by which we have the opportunity to grow in our faith with like-minded individuals; and also grateful for the gift of God's creation and how He provides for us each day. God bless!



Blessed Fr. Miguel Pro was a Jesuit priest who was executed by a firing squad in Mexico for exercising his priestly ministry during the persecution of the Catholic Church in Mexico during the presidency of Elias Plutarco Calles. Fr. Pro was born into a mining family in Guadalupe, Zacatecas on January 13, 1891. He was the third of eleven children, four of whom had died as infants or young children. Two of his sisters joined a convent. He was known for his great charity and for being a playful and prayerful man. He was known for the long periods he spent in the chapel. He was known for his great joy and love, even as he suffered from years of stomach illness that resulted in having to have multiple stomach surgeries. Pro studied in Mexico until 1914 when a massive wave of governmental anti-Catholicism forced the novitiate to dissolve and the Jesuits to flee to Los Gatos, California, in the United States. He then went to study in Granada, Spain (1915–19), and from 1919 to 1922 taught in Nicaragua. On November 23, 1927, as Fr. Pro walked from his cell to the courtyard and the firing squad, he blessed the soldiers, knelt, and briefly prayed quietly. Declining a blindfold, he faced his executioners with a crucifix in one hand and a rosary in the other and held his arms out in imitation of the crucified Christ and shouted out, "*May God have mercy on you! May God bless you! Lord, Thou knowest that I am innocent! With all my heart I forgive my enemies!*" Before the firing squad was ordered to shoot, Pro raised his arms in imitation of Christ and shouted, "*Viva Cristo Rey!*" – "*Long live Christ the King!*".

Este fin de semana, celebramos la Solemnidad de Cristo Rey. Es el último domingo del año litúrgico 2022. El próximo domingo, comenzaremos nuestro nuevo año litúrgico de 2023 con el primer domingo de Adviento. ¿Cuál es el significado de la fiesta de hoy de Cristo Rey? Encontré la siguiente reflexión de "CatholicCulture.org": *"La fiesta de Cristo Rey fue establecida por el Papa Pío XI en 1925 como un antídoto contra el secularismo, una forma de vida que deja a Dios fuera del pensamiento y la vida del hombre y organiza su vida como si Dios no existiera. La fiesta pretende proclamar de manera sorprendente y efectiva la realza de Cristo sobre los individuos, las familias, la sociedad, los gobiernos y las naciones." En las propias palabras del Papa Pío XI: "Si a Cristo nuestro Señor se lo da todo poder en el cielo y en la tierra; si todos los hombres, compra-dos por su preciosa sangre, están sujetos a su dominio por un nuevo derecho; si este poder abarca a todos los hombres, debe quedar claro que ninguna de nuestras facultades está exenta de su imperio. Él debe reinar en nuestras mentes, las cuales deben asentir con perfecta sumisión y firme creencia a las verdades reveladas y a las doctrinas de Cristo. Él debe reinar en nuestras voluntades, que deben obedecer las leyes y preceptos de Dios. Él debe reinar en nuestros corazones, que deben despreciar los deseos naturales y amar a Dios sobre todas las cosas, y aferrarse solo a él."* (Quas Primas, 33). Padre Miguel A. Pro, Mártir
El Siervo de Dios, Sacerdote Jesuita, Mártir mexicano
Memoria: 23 de noviembre
Nace: 13 enero 1891 Zacatecas México –Mártir: 1927.
Beatificado por Juan Pablo II: 25 septiembre 1988
Desde pequeño fue virtuoso y alegre. Entró en el noviciado jesuita a la edad de 20 años.
Fue exiliado durante la revolución mexicana.
Ordenado en Bélgica en 1924 a la edad de 36.
Regreso a México en 1926 sabiendo que la iglesia era perseguida y corría grave peligro. Además, sufría del estómago. Ejerció un intenso ministerio bajo persecución hasta que en el 1927 fue acusado falsamente de estar involucrado en un atentado contra el dictador. Antes de que lo fusilaran perdonó a los verdugos. Murió, como muchos otros mártires mexicanos, gritando: "Viva Cristo Rey".



Make sure you do something special today to celebrate the feast of Christ the King!






