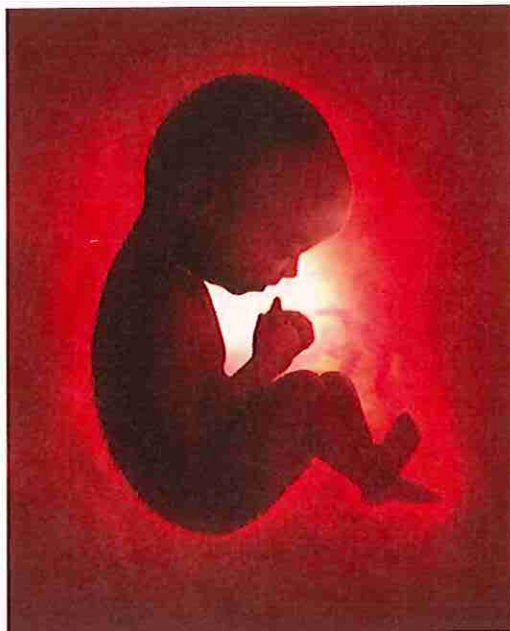

Dear Parishioners,

This Monday is Halloween, or as we Catholics call it, "**All Hollows Eve**" (the vigil of All Saints Day on November 1st). There is a clear difference between the two celebrations of Halloween and All Saints Day. As a child, I always looked forward to Halloween, dressing up in a costume, and then going "trick-or-treating" to the different houses in my neighborhood to get free candy. When the teenage years arrived, my innocent "trick-or-treating" turned to mischievous pranks and causing trouble on Halloween night. As I learned more about my Catholic Faith, especially after my "reversion" back to the Faith when I was in college, I became aware of another element of Halloween, that has to do with satanism. Halloween is considered a very important date to satanists, in which they take part in a lot of evil on that night. Regarding satanism and the occult, our Catholic Catechism says:

"All forms of divination are to be rejected: recourse to Satan or demons, conjuring up the dead or other practices falsely supposed to 'unveil' the future.

Consulting horoscopes, astrology, palm reading, interpretation of omens and lots, the phenomena of clairvoyance, and recourse to mediums all conceal a desire for power over time, history, and, in the last analysis, other human beings, as well as a wish to conciliate hidden powers. They contradict the honor, respect, and loving fear that we owe to God alone (#2116); All practices of magic or sorcery, by which one attempts to tame occult powers, so as to place them at one's service and have a supernatural power over others even if this were for the sake of restoring their health are gravely contrary to the virtue of religion. Wearing charms is also reprehensible.

Spiritism (channeling) often implies divination or magical practices; the Church for her part warns the faithful against it. Recourse to so-called traditional cures does not justify either the invocation of evil powers or the exploitation of another's credulity (#2117)." As Catholics, we must always be vigilant on the many ways that we can get mixed up in these practices mentioned above, even when some things seem so innocent. As Catholics, we do not believe that our sacramentals provide any sort of magic powers, energy etc. We do not subscribe to the idea of "Karma", and we certainly do not look to the saints as some sort of sorcerers who somehow themselves deliver us to "enlightenment." **The Holy Sacrifice of**

the Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, the Rosary, daily personal prayer with our Lord, going to Confession - these spiritual practices and devotions are all we need in order to become Saints. This is what we celebrate on "All Hollows Eve", and on All Saints day. We celebrate the men and women who lived here on earth, and despite their own shortcomings, weaknesses, and sins, they cooperated with the grace of God in living the call to holiness. The Saints were canonized by the Church because of their widespread affect that they had on so many people with their love of God and neighbor. They remain an inspiration and example to imitate in following our Lord Jesus more closely, as well as intercessors before the throne of God to help us in our journey back to the Lord in Heaven, where we hope to reign as "saints" as well. God bless!

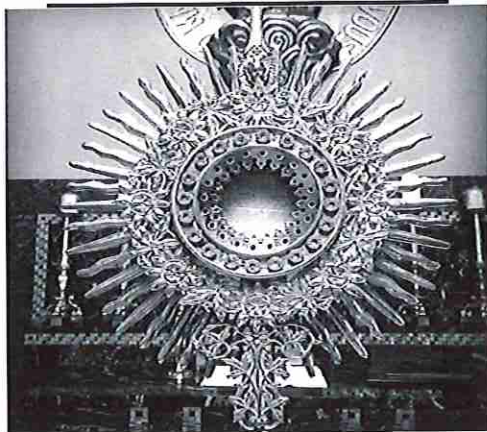

Queridos feligreses,

Este Lunes es Halloween, o como lo llamamos los Católicos, "All Hollows Eve" (la vigilia del Día de Todos los Santos el 1 de Noviembre). Hay una clara diferencia entre las dos celebraciones de Halloween y el Día de Todos los Santos. De niño, siempre esperaba Halloween, disfrazándome y luego yendo a pedir dulces a las diferentes casas de mi vecindario para obtener dulces gratis. Cuando llegaron los años de la adolescencia, mi inocente "truco o trato" me convertí en bromas traviesas y causé problemas en la noche de Halloween. A medida que aprendí más sobre mi Fe Católica, especialmente después de mi "reversión" a la fe cuando estaba en la universidad, me di cuenta de otro elemento de Halloween, que tiene que ver con satanismo. Halloween se considera una fecha muy importante para los satanistas, en la que participan en una gran cantidad de maldad esa noche. Con respecto al satanismo y lo oculto, nuestro Catecismo Católico dice: *"Todas las formas de adivinación deben ser rechazadas: recurrir a Satanás o demonios, conjurar a los muertos u otras prácticas que se supone falsamente 'revelar' el futuro. Consultar horóscopos, astrología, lectura de palma, la interpretación de presagios y suertes, los fenómenos de la clarividencia y el recurso a los medios ocultan un deseo de poder a lo largo del tiempo, la historia y, en última instancia, otros seres humanos, así como un deseo de conciliar poderes ocultos. el honor, el respeto y el temor amoroso que le debemos solo a Dios (# 2116); Todas las prácticas de magia o hechicería, mediante las cuales uno intenta domar los poderes ocultos, para ponerlos al servicio de uno y tener un poder sobrenatural sobre los demás. incluso si esto fuera por el bien de restaurar su salud, es gravemente contrario a la virtud de la religión. Usar amuletos también es reprobable. El espiritismo (canalización) a menudo implica adivinación o prácticas mágicas; la Iglesia, por su parte, advierte a la gente contra eso. El recurso a las llamadas curas tradicionales no justifica ni la invocación de poderes malignos ni la explotación de la credulidad de otro (# 2117)."* Como Católicos, siempre debemos estar atentos a las muchas formas en que podemos mezclarnos en estas prácticas mencionadas arriba, incluso cuando algunas cosas parecen tan inocentes. Como Católicos, no creemos que nuestros sacramentales proporcionen ningún tipo de poderes mágicos, energía, etc. No nos suscribimos a la idea de "Karma", y ciertamente no consideramos a los Santos como una especie de hechiceros que de alguna manera entregan nosotros a la "iluminación".

El Santo Sacrificio de la Misa, la Adoración Eucarística, el Rosario, la oración personal diaria con nuestro Señor, ir a la Confesión: estas prácticas espirituales y devociones son todo lo que necesitamos para convertirnos en Santos. Esto es lo que celebramos en "All Hollows Eve" y en el día de Todos los Santos. Celebramos a los hombres y mujeres que vivieron aquí en la tierra, y a pesar de sus propios defectos, debilidades y pecados, cooperaron con la gracia de Dios para vivir el llamado a la santidad. Los Santos fueron canonizados por la Iglesia debido a su efecto generalizado que tuvieron en tantas personas con su amor a Dios y al prójimo. Siguen siendo una inspiración y un ejemplo para imitar al seguir a nuestro Señor Jesús más de cerca, así como a los intercesores ante el trono de Dios para ayudarnos en nuestro viaje de regreso al Señor en el Cielo, donde esperamos reinar también como "santos". ¡Dios los bendiga!

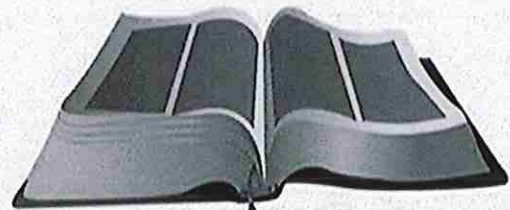

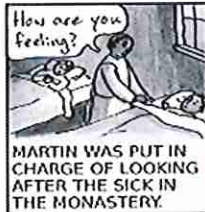
BECAUSE THEY WERE SO POOR MARTIN WENT TO WORK FOR A DOCTOR-BARBER WHEN HE WAS 10.

MARTIN WAS PUT IN CHARGE OF LOOKING AFTER THE SICK IN THE MONASTERY.



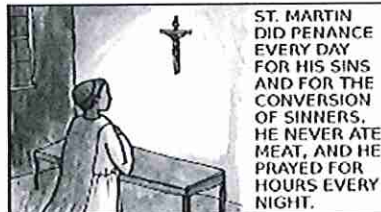
MIRACLES STARTED HAPPENING. PEOPLE EVEN SAW HIM GO INTO LOCKED ROOMS TO HELP THE SICK.
