Second Sunday of Lent

March 1, 2026

Peace and all good! Dear brothers and sisters in our Lord Jesus Christ.

Introduction

The Transfiguration reveals to us who Christ is, but also who we are: beloved children, called to let ourselves be illuminated and transformed by his presence. Lent is that time when God touches us, as he did the disciples, to lift us from fear and help us discover what shadows prevent his light from shining in our lives. We ascend the mountain to see his glory; we descend to let that glory transform our story, and the stories of those around us.

Biblical Reflection

The account of Abraham's calling (*Gen. 12:1-4*) opens the readings for this second Sunday of Lent. It is a story that reveals God's promise that he will never abandon humanity. Abraham is invited to set out on a journey toward the new and the unknown.

With this call, Abraham is invited to leave behind his polytheistic past (the worship of multiple gods) and begin the journey toward encountering the one God (monotheism). Divine pedagogy, reflected through-out the Bible, invites us to consider very complex aspects; for example, Abraham's path was slow, marked by doubts, searching, and purification, all in order to be faithful to God who called him.

The expression *"through your name all nations of the world will be blessed"* reflects and summarizes the full meaning of Abraham's call. He has been chosen as a **"sign,"** as a point of reference for all peoples invited, according to God's plan and design, to participate in salvation and the promise.

In the second reading (*2 Timothy 1:8-10*), Paul, in this epistolary text, recommends to his disciple Timothy that he take on the mission and vocation he has received from God: **to proclaim the gospel.** Paul reminds his disciple that the apostolic path is a

model to imitate and that it entails suffering for preaching the gospel of Jesus Christ.

The Apostle to the Gentiles (Saint Paul) tells Timothy that evangelizing is presenting God's work in Jesus to all people. It fulfills his word, announced and promised from time immemorial, that is, from the very beginning. Jesus opened a new path, and now he continues on it when his Gospel is proclaimed, which is the firmest sign of our faith in the Resurrection of Jesus.

Every year, on the second Sunday of Lent, we read the account of the Transfiguration (*Mt 17:1-9*). **But what does the Transfiguration mean?** It is the luminous transformation of Jesus before his disciples, on his way to Jerusalem for his Passion (death and resurrection). Jesus reveals his own story to us in the light of his obedience to God in order to carry out this plan of salvation for all people. The disciples accompany him, but they can only perceive a kind of peace that leads them to ask and desire to "settle down" there, to build tents on the mountaintop: *"Lord, it is good for us to be here. If you wish, I will put up three tents: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah."*

However, they must descend from the mountain, because others live on earth and must receive this good news: *"This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased. Listen to him."* The heavenly voice from the Father is a solemn declaration: Jesus is his beloved Son; in whom he is well pleased. The revelation leads us to another central event in the life of Jesus, which is his baptism (another important element for understanding the meaning of Lent: a time of preparation and baptismal experience). *Blessed are those who hear the word of Jesus!*

Finally, should one go up the Mount of Transfiguration? Absolutely. This story speaks to us of the search for God and His will in *contemplation and prayer.* This is one of the reasons why the Transfiguration is included in the Lenten liturgy. However, the lesson is this: *what is contemplated must be applied to the daily life of every person.*

Just as Abraham had to leave his land, the disciples must leave the “*infinite heights*” of the mountain to humble themselves, because the Gospel they have lived must be proclaimed to all people when Jesus rises from the dead.

Reflection

The Transfiguration invites us to examine what prevents God's light from shining in our lives. What shadows need to be surrendered? What attachments keep us from moving forward? What fears paralyze us? Prayer is that encounter of transparency where God looks at us with love and helps us see ourselves through His eyes.

Segundo Domingo de Cuaresma

¡Paz y Bien! Estimados hermanos y hermanas en nuestro Señor Jesucristo.

Introducción

La Transfiguración nos revela quién es Cristo, pero también quiénes somos nosotros: hijos amados, llamados a dejarnos iluminar y transformar por su presencia. La Cuaresma es ese tiempo en el que Dios nos toca, como a los discípulos, para levantar-nos del miedo y ayudarnos a descubrir qué sombras impiden que su luz brille en nuestra vida. Subimos al monte para ver su gloria; bajamos para dejar que esa gloria transforme nuestra historia, y la de aquellos que nos rodean.

Reflexión bíblica

El relato de la vocación de Abrahán (*Gen. 12, 1-4*) abre las lecturas de este segundo domingo de cuaresma. Es un relato que viene a manifestar la promesa de Dios que nunca abandonará a la humanidad. Abrahán es invitado a ponerse en camino hacia lo nuevo y lo desconocido.

Con esta llamada Abrahán es invitado a dejar todo su pasado politeísta (adorar a varios dioses) y comenzar el camino hacia el encuentro con el Dios único (monoteísmo). La pedagogía divina, reflejada a lo largo de toda la Biblia, nos invita a considerar aspectos muy complejos; por ejemplo el camino de Abrahán ha sido lento, no falto de dudas, de búsquedas y de purificaciones, para ser fiel a Dios que le ha llamado.

La expresión "*con tu nombre se bendecirán todas las naciones del mundo*" refleja y sintetiza todo el sentido de la llamada de Abrahán. Ha sido elegido como un "**signo**", como un punto de referencia para todos los pueblos invitados, según el proyecto y plan de Dios, a participar en la salvación y en la promesa

La segunda lectura (*2Tim. 1, 8-10*), Pablo en este texto epistolar, recomienda a su discípulo Timoteo que se haga cargo de la misión y vocación que ha

recibido de parte de Dios: **anunciar el evangelio**. Pablo le recuerda a su discípulo que el camino apostólico es un modelo a imitar y que conlleva el sufrimiento por predicar el evangelio de Jesucristo.

El apóstol de los gentiles (san Pablo), le dice a Timoteo que Evangelizar es presentar ante los hombres la obra de Dios en Jesús. Cumple su palabra, anunciada y prometida desde tiempo inmemorial, es decir, desde los orígenes. Jesús ha abierto un nuevo camino, ahora sigue adelante cuando se anuncia su Evangelio que es la señal más firme de nuestra fe en la Resurrección de Jesús.

Todos los años, en el segundo domingo de cuaresma, leemos el relato de la transfiguración (*Mt. 17, 1-9*). Pero **¿Qué significa la transfiguración?** La transformación luminosa de Jesús delante de sus discípulos, ya camino de Jerusalén para su pasión (muerte y resurrección). Jesús nos revela su propia historia a la luz de su obediencia a Dios con objeto de llevar adelante ese plan de salvación para todos los hombres. Los discípulos le acompañan, pero no pueden percibir más que una especie de sosiego que les lleva a pedir y desear "plantarse" allí, construir tiendas en lo alto del monte: *«Señor, ¡qué bueno es que estemos aquí! Si quieres, haré tres tiendas: una para ti, otra para Moisés y otra para Elías»*.

Sin embargo, se debe descender del monte, porque en la tierra habitan los demás y deben recibir esta buena noticia: *«Este es mi Hijo, el amado, en quien me complazco. Escuchadlo»*. La voz celeste procedente del Padre es una solemne declaración: Jesús es su Hijo amado, en quien se complace. La revelación nos remite a otro acontecimiento central en la vida de Jesús que es su bautismo (otro elemento importante para centrar bien el sentido de la cuaresma: tiempo de preparación y experiencia bautismal). *¡Dichosos los que escuchan la Palabra de Jesús!*

Por último, **¿Se debe o no se debe subir al monte de la transfiguración?** Desde luego que sí. Este relato nos habla de la búsqueda de Dios y de su vo-

luntad en la *“contemplación”* y en la *“oración”*. Esta es una de las razones por las que el relato de la transfiguración figura en la liturgia de la Cuaresma. No obstante, la enseñanza: *lo contemplado debe ser llevado a la vida de cada día, de cada hombre*. Como Abrahán tuvo que dejar su tierra, los discípulos deben dejar la *“altura infinita”* del monte para abajarse, porque ese evangelio que ellos han vivido, deben anunciarlo a todos los hombres cuando Jesús resucite de entre los muertos.

Reflexión

La Transfiguración nos invita a revisar qué impide que la luz de Dios brille en nuestra vida. ¿Qué sombras necesitan ser entregadas? ¿Qué apegos nos impiden caminar? ¿Qué miedos nos paralizan? La oración es ese encuentro de transparencia donde Dios nos mira con amor y nos ayuda a vernos con sus ojos.

In today's Gospel reading Jesus took three of His apostles up a mountain and gave them a vision of His true glory. He shone as bright as the sun- so bright they could hardly look at Him. But did you know that what they saw was only a tiny bit of the true glory of God?

It was so beautiful that Peter wanted Him to stay that way. He offered to build tents for Jesus and Moses and Elijah, who appeared with Him. But the joy of that moment wasn't meant to last forever. It was just a little taste of Heaven.

Jesus gave this experience to the three apostles just a little while before He went to Jerusalem to suffer and die on the cross. He knew that they would be terrified and very sad when He died so He gave them a preview of the glory He would go back to after He rose from the dead. That way they knew they had a reason to hope even when He was killed.

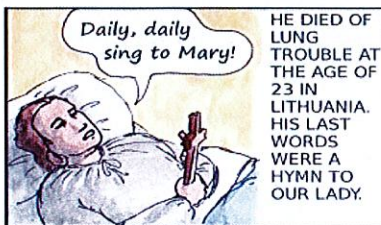
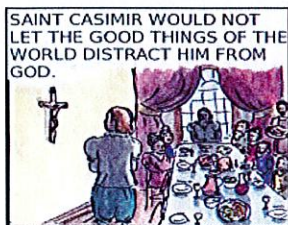
