# 14TH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

## JULY 5, 2020

Dear Parishioners,

As we celebrate Independence Day this weekend, I would like to share with you the following reflection entitled "Celebrating the Fourth of July as a Christian", by Nick Rabiipour (7/2/2016): "Soon we will celebrate the most important day in American history. On this supremely significant day 240 years ago, fifty-six British land-owning men signed a watershed document, the Declaration of Independence, in a little-known Pennsylvania colony. And this document would pave the future of what would arguably become the greatest nation in the world, the United States of America. *How are we as Catholic Christians and Americans supposed to celebrate this great day?* John Adams, one of the Founding Fathers of our country, wrote this about how to celebrate the fourth of July: '*It ought to be commemorated as the Day of Deliverance by solemn Acts of Devotion to God Almighty. It ought to be solemnized with Pomp and Parade, with shews, games, Sports, Guns, Bells, Bonfires and illuminations from one End of this Continent to the other from this Time forward forever more.*' Well, let's see how we're doing in celebrating the fourth of July the way one of the greatest Founders envisioned. Parades? Check. Pomp? Check. Sports? Backyard games count, right? Check. Bonfires? Check. Illuminations? Double check. Solemn Acts of Devotions to God Almighty? Um...I don't know about you, but I don't typically live up to that calling on the Fourth of July. But John Adams set an example for us. After everything's said and done, we owe God more than anyone else for what occurred 240 years ago. In fact, the most famous part of the Declaration of Independence explicitly points to God as the source of our freedom: '*We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights, that among these are life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness.*' Not our parents, or politicians, or government, is the source of our most important rights. Only God.

As the source of our rights, he deserves the highest praise, honor, and glory on Independence Day (and every day). There are many ways to honor God on this special day. Perhaps you can read a passage from the Catholic Bible with your family to kick off the festivities, or pray a family rosary with the special intention for our political leaders and our country's future. Or you could pray this simple prayer for our nation written by George Washington, our first President: '*Almighty God, who has given us this good land for our heritage: We humbly beseech you that we may always prove ourselves a people mindful of your favor and glad to do your will. Bless our land with honorable industry, sound learning, and pure manners. Save us from violence, discord, and confusion; from pride and arrogance, and from every evil way. Defend our liberties, and fashion into one united people the multitudes brought hither out of many kindreds and tongues. Endue with the spirit of wisdom those to whom your Name we entrust the authority of government, that there may be justice and peace at home, and that, through obedience to your law, we may show forth your praise among the nations of the earth. In the time of prosperity, fill our hearts with thankfulness and in the day of trouble, do not allow our trust in you to fall; all this we ask through Jesus Christ our Lord.*' AMEN!"

## IMPOSSIBLE CHRISTIANITY

"Come to Me, all you who are weary and find life burdensome, and I will refresh you." — Matthew 11:28 The Lord has made living the Christian life humanly impossible. We must be made perfect as our heavenly Father is perfect (Mt 5:48). We must become holy in every aspect of our conduct (1 Pt 1:15) or we will not see God (Heb 12:14), that is, we will not see Jesus face to face in heaven (see 1 Cor 13:12). Furthermore, we must be compassionate as our Father is compassionate (Lk 6:36) and pure as Jesus is pure (1 Jn 3:3). If we fall into sin on one point of God's law, we become guilty on all counts (Jas 2:10). Because living the Christian life is humanly impossible, many people don't even try. Some are honest enough to admit that they don't try. Others try to water down Christianity to make it more humanly possible, and then rationalize their lukewarmness (see Rv 3:16). Some even try to live Christianity by their own power. They eventually get frustrated and burn out. At this point, they are tempted to dismiss Christianity completely. Instead, they should come to Jesus and learn from Him (Mt 11:28-29). Jesus will teach us that Christianity is not a do-it-yourself religion, but one in which we let it be done to us (see Lk 1:38). Then the burden of Christianity, while still humanly impossible, is easy and light (Mt 11:30).

**Prayer:** Father, may I give up trying to do the impossible and let You do it.

**Promise:** "You are not in the flesh; you are in the Spirit, since the Spirit of God dwells in you."

—Rm 8:9

**Praise:** The Lord Jesus, after He rose, was "taken up into glory" (see 1 Tm 3:16).

## CRISTIANISMO IMPOSIBLE

"Vengan a mí todos los que están afligidos y agobiados, y yo los aliviare" (Mateo 11:28).

El Señor ha hecho que vivir la vida cristiana sea humanamente imposible. Debemos ser perfectos como nuestro Padre celestial es perfecto (Mt 5:48). Debemos llegar a ser santos en cada aspecto de nuestra conducta (1 Pe 1:15) o no veremos a Dios (Heb 12:14), es decir, no veremos a Jesús cara a cara en el cielo (ver 1 Co 13:12). Además, debemos ser compasivos ya que nuestro Padre es compasivo (Lc 6:36) y puros como Jesús (1 Jn 3:3). Si caemos en pecado en un precepto de la ley de Dios, nos hacemos culpables en todos los aspectos (Stg 2). Debido a que vivir la vida cristiana es humanamente imposible, la mayoría de las personas ni siquiera lo intentan. Algunos son lo suficientemente honestos como para admitir que no lo intentan. Otros intentan diluir el cristianismo para que sea más humanamente posible, y luego racionalizan su tibieza (ver Ap 3:16). Algunos intentan vivir el cristianismo por su propia cuenta. Eventualmente se frustran y se consumen. En este punto, están tentados a desechar completamente el cristianismo. En lugar de eso, deberían acercarse a Jesús y aprender de Él (Mt 11:28-29). Jesús nos enseñará que el cristianismo no es una religión de "hágalo usted mismo", sino una en la que dejamos que se haga la voluntad de Dios (ver Lc 1:38). Entonces, la carga del cristianismo, aunque humanamente imposible, es fácil y ligera (Mt 11:30).

**Oración:** Padre, que deje de intentar hacer lo imposible y Te permita actuar.

**Promesa:** "Ustedes no están animados por la carne sino por el espíritu, dado que el Espíritu de Dios habita en ustedes" (Rom 8:9).

**Alabanza:** El Señor Jesús, después de resucitar, fue "elevado a la gloria" (ver 1 Tim 3:16). ¡Alabado seas, Jesús!

## *Domingo 14 del Tiempo Ordinario*


Queridos feligreses,

Mientras celebramos el Día de la Independencia este fin de semana, me gustaría compartir con ustedes la siguiente reflexión titulada **"Celebrando el cuatro de Julio como cristiano"**, por Nick Rabiipour (7/2/2016): "Pronto celebraremos el día más importante en la historia americana. En este día sumamente significativo hace 240 años, cincuenta y seis hombres propietarios de tierras británicos firmaron un documento crucial, la Declaración de Independencia, en una colonia poco conocida de Pensilvania. Y este documento abriría el camino de lo que posiblemente se convertiría en la nación más grande del mundo, los Estados Unidos de América. ***¿Cómo se supone que los cristianos Católicos y los estadounidenses debemos celebrar este gran día?*** John Adams, uno de los Padres Fundadores de nuestro país, escribió esto acerca de cómo celebrar el 4 de julio: 'Debe ser conmemorado como el Día de la Liberación por actos solemnes de devoción a Dios Todopoderoso. Se debería de celebrar con paradas, con exhibiciones, juegos, deportes, armas, campanas, hogueras e iluminaciones de un extremo de este continente al otro desde este tiempo en adelante y para siempre. Bueno, veamos cómo nos va en la celebración del 4 de Julio de la forma en que uno de los mejores fundadores imaginó. ¿Desfiles? ¿Fiestas? ¿Deportes? Hogueras. ¿Luces? ¿Solemnes actos de devoción a Dios Todopoderoso? Um ... no se ustedes, pero normalmente casi nunca hago todas estas cosas el 4 de Julio. Pero John Adams nos dio un ejemplo. Después de todo lo dicho y hecho, le debemos a Dios más que a nadie por lo que ocurrió hace 240 años. De hecho, la parte más famosa de la Declaración de Independencia señala explícitamente a Dios como la fuente de nuestra libertad: 'Sostenemos que estas verdades son evidentes, que todos los hombres son creados iguales, que su Creador los ha dotado de cierta derechos inalienables, entre los que se encuentran la vida, la libertad y la búsqueda de la felicidad.' Nuestros padres, políticos o gobierno no son la fuente de nuestros derechos más importantes. Solo Dios. Como fuente de nuestros derechos, merece el mayor elogio, honor y gloria en el Día de la Independencia (y todos los días). Hay muchas maneras de honrar a Dios en este día especial.

Quizás pueda leer un pasaje de la Biblia católica con su familia para comenzar las festividades, o rezar un rosario familiar con una intención especial orando por nuestros líderes políticos y el futuro de nuestro país. O podría rezar esta simple oración por nuestra nación escrita por George Washington, nuestro primer presidente: *'Dios Todopoderoso, que nos ha dado esta buena tierra para nuestra herencia: te suplicamos humildemente que siempre demostremos que somos personas conscientes de tu favor y contento de hacer tu voluntad. Bendice nuestra tierra con una industria honorable, un aprendizaje sólido y modales puros. Sálvanos de la violencia, la discordia y la confusión; del orgullo y la arrogancia, y de todo mal camino. Defiende nuestras libertades y conviértelas en un pueblo unido que las multitudes trajeron aquí de muchas familias y lenguas. Dales espíritu de sabiduría a aquellos a quienes tu Nombre confiamos la autoridad del gobierno, para que haya justicia y paz en el hogar, y que, mediante la obediencia a tu ley, podamos mostrar tu alabanza entre las naciones de la tierra. En tiempos de prosperidad, llena nuestros corazones de agradecimiento y en los días de problemas, no permitas que nuestra confianza en ti caiga; todo esto lo pedimos por Jesucristo nuestro Señor.'* ¡AMÉN!"






