Dear Parishioners,
 Happy and Blessed **“World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly”!** Pope Francis celebrated the first World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly in 2021 and decreed that it be observed each year on the Sunday closest to the feast of Sts. Joachim and Anne, Jesus' grandparents, which is July 26th. As we prepare for the Holy Year 2025, Pope Francis has asked Catholics to focus on prayer, which is why he chose the prayer of an elderly person from Psalm 71 as the theme: ***“Do not cast me off in my old age”***. In a note announcing this theme, the Vatican said the choice was *“meant to call attention to the fact that, sadly, loneliness is the bitter lot in life of many elderly persons, so often the victims of the throwaway culture. By cherishing the charisms of grandparents and the elderly, and the contribution they make to the life of the Church, the World Day seeks to support the efforts of every ecclesial community to forge bonds between the generations and to combat loneliness”*. Cardinal Kevin J. Farrell, prefect of the Dicastery for Laity, the Family and Life, said that families and parishes, *“are called to be at the forefront in promoting a culture of encounter, to create spaces for sharing, listening, to offer support and affection: thus, the love of Gospel becomes concrete. Our communities, with their tenderness and affectionate attention that does not forget its most fragile members, are called to manifest the love of God, who never abandons anyone”*. When I think of my grandparents, I think of the faith that they had in the Lord, and then passed on to their children, which was then passed on to their children (myself, siblings, and cousins). Grandparents are truly a gift from the Lord, that should always be treasured and revered. **There is so much wisdom and life experience that we can learn from our grandparents and all of the elderly.** As a priest, I have had the privilege of being able to visit elderly parishioners in the nursing homes and at their homes, as well as getting to know them at the parish Masses. I have learned so much from them about the history of the different parishes that I have been assigned to, and have also benefitted tremendously from their personal holiness of life. I have also experienced their sadness and disappointment because of their children and grandchildren who no longer practice the Faith that they were taught. In a world that seems to lack respect for the elderly, viewing them many times as “unproductive members of the society”, we can counter that erroneous notion by always

revering our elderly and learning from their example. Let us learn from our Lord Jesus and His love for His Grandparents Saints Joachim and Anne, and thank God for the gift of our grandparents and elderly. ***Saints Joachim and Anne, pray for us!***

POPULATION EXPLOSION AND EVANGELISM EXPLOSION

“There is a lad here who has five barley loaves and a couple of dried fish, but what good is that for so many?” —John 6:9

The Lord’s first words to newly created human beings were: “Be fertile and multiply” (Gn 1:28). His will is to multiply people. There are over seven billion people on planet earth. The Lord also intends to multiply disciples. He commanded us: “Full authority has been given to Me both in heaven and on earth; Go, therefore, and make disciples of all the nations” (Mt 28:18-19).

To get us into the multiplication business, Jesus will multiply loaves and fish. He will take our little everyday lives and miraculously make them more than sufficient to feed the masses both physically and spiritually. The multiplication of our loaves-and-fish lives is the transition from multiplying people to multiplying disciples. The Lord wants an evangelism explosion greater than the population explosion. Jesus promises: “I solemnly assure you, the man who has faith in Me will do the works I do, and greater far than these” (Jn 14:12). His “power now at work in us can do immeasurably more than we ask or imagine” (Eph 3:20). Let Jesus light your fuse.

Prayer: Jesus, as I worship You in Mass today, multiply the effect of my life to win the nations to You.

Promise: “There is but one body and one Spirit, just as there is but one hope given all of you by your call. There is one Lord, one

faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all.” —
Eph 4:4-6

Praise: Praise Jesus, Who was broken so that we may experience the power of multiplication in our everyday lives. Glory be to the Lamb of God.

Wedding Anniversary Celebration

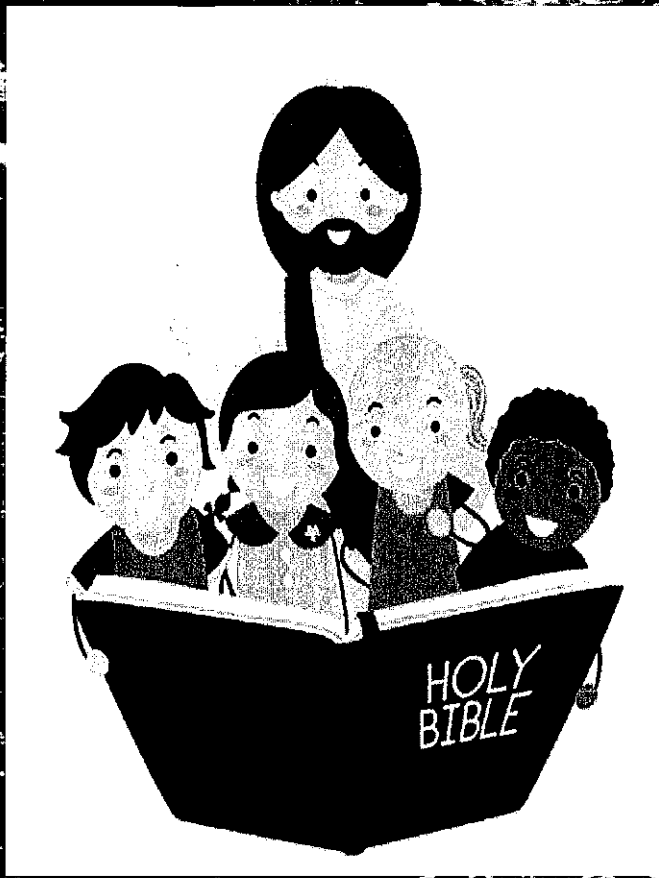

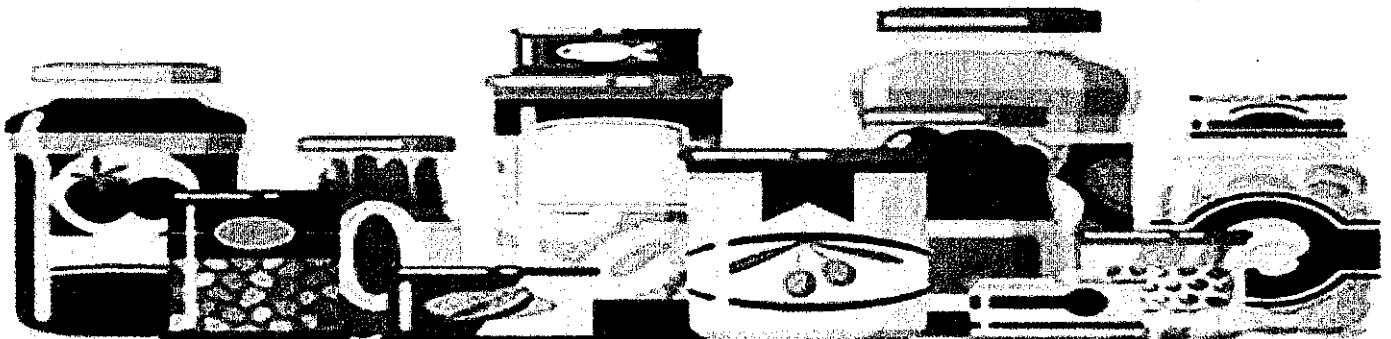

Décimo Séptimo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

28 de Julio, 2024

Queridos feligreses,

¡Feliz y bendita **“Jornada Mundial de los Abuelos y las Personas Mayores”!** El Papa Francisco celebró en 2021 la primera Jornada Mundial de los Abuelos y las Personas Mayores y decretó que se celebrara cada año el domingo más cercano a la fiesta de los Santos Joaquín y Ana, los abuelos de Jesús, que es el 26 de julio. Mientras nos preparamos para el Año Santo 2025, el Papa Francisco ha pedido a los Católicos que se centren en la oración, por eso eligió como tema la oración de un anciano del Salmo 71: **“No me deseches en mi vejez”**. En una nota anunciando este tema, el Vaticano decía que la elección *“tenía como objetivo llamar la atención sobre el hecho de que, lamentablemente, la soledad es la amarga suerte en la vida de muchas personas mayores, a menudo víctimas de la cultura del descarte. Al valorar los carismas de los abuelos y de los ancianos, y la contribución que dan a la vida de la Iglesia, la Jornada Mundial busca apoyar los esfuerzos de cada comunidad eclesial para forjar vínculos entre generaciones y combatir la soledad”*. El Cardenal Kevin J. Farrell, prefecto del Dicasterio para los Laicos, la Familia y la Vida, afirmó que las familias y las parroquias, *“están llamadas a estar en primera línea en la promoción de una cultura del encuentro, a crear espacios para compartir, escuchar, ofrecer apoyo y afecto: así, el amor del Evangelio se vuelve concreto. Nuestras comunidades, con su ternura y atención afectuosa que no olvida a sus miembros más frágiles, están llamadas a manifestar el amor de Dios, que nunca abandona a nadie”*. Cuando pienso en mis abuelos, pienso en la fe que tenían en el Señor, y que luego transmitieron a sus hijos, que a su vez transmitieron a sus hijos (a mí, a mis hermanos y a mis primos). Los abuelos son verdaderamente un regalo del Señor, que siempre debe ser atesorado y reverenciado. **Hay tanta sabiduría y experiencia de vida que podemos aprender de nuestros abuelos y de todos los ancianos.** Como sacerdote, he tenido el privilegio de poder visitar a feligreses ancianos en las casas de ancianos y en sus hogares, así como conocerlos en las Misas parroquiales. He aprendido mucho de ellos sobre la historia de las diferentes parroquias a las que me han asignado, y también me he beneficiado enormemente de su santidad de vida personal. También he experimentado su tristeza y decepción por sus hijos y nietos que ya no practican la Fe que les enseñaron. En un mundo que parece carecer de respeto por los ancianos, viéndolos muchas veces como *“miembros improductivos de la sociedad”*, podemos contrarrestar esa

noción errónea reverenciando siempre a nuestros ancianos y aprendiendo de su ejemplo. Aprendamos de nuestro Señor Jesús y Su amor por Sus abuelos, los Santos Joaquín y Ana, y agradezcamos a Dios por el regalo de nuestros abuelos y ancianos. **Santos Joaquín y Ana, ¡ruegen por nosotros!**

EXPLOSIÓN DEMOGRÁFICA Y EVANGELISMO EXPLOSIVO

“Aquí hay un niño que tiene cinco panes de cebada y dos pescados, pero ¿qué es esto para tanta gente?” (Juan 6:9)

Las primeras palabras del Señor a los seres humanos recién creados fueron: “Sean fecundos, multiplíquense” (Gn 1:28). Su voluntad es de multiplicar gente. Hay más de siete mil millones de personas en el planeta Tierra. El Señor también quiere multiplicar el número de discípulos. Él nos mandó: “Yo he recibido todo poder en el cielo y en la tierra. Jesús nos promete: “Les aseguro que el que cree en Mí hará también las obras que Yo hago, y aún mayores” (Jn 14:12). “A aquel que es capaz de hacer infinitamente más de lo que podemos pedir o pensar por el poder que obra en nosotros” (Ef 3:20). Deja que Jesús encienda tu mecha.

Oración: Jesús, mientras te adoro en la santa Misa hoy, multiplica el efecto que tiene en mi vida para poder ganarte naciones.

Promesa: “Hay un solo cuerpo y un solo Espíritu, así como hay una misma esperanza a la que ustedes han sido llamados. Hay un solo Señor, una sola fe, un solo bautismo. Hay un solo Dios y Padre de todo” (Ef 4:4-6).

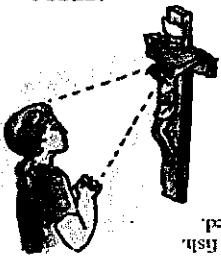

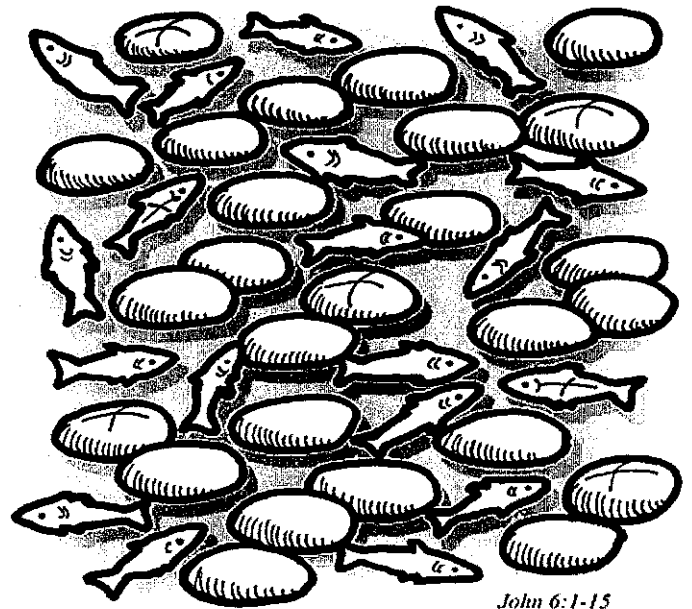
Jesus still multiplies what we give Him today. At Mass we offer to God some bread and wine and He turns it into the Body and Blood of Jesus!

Loaves and Fishes Word-Find

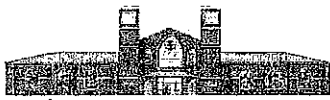


See if you can find all the words in CAPITALS. Use the leftover letters to fill in the blanks at the end.
