Dear Parishioners,

Last Saturday, we had the First Holy Communion for twenty-four of our children. It was such a beautiful Mass, as each of the children received Jesus for the first time in their lives, and many of them even received their second Holy Communion on Sunday. With our Religious Education classes completed, **I want to especially thank our teachers (catechists)** - Adelina Goncalves (*First Penance & First Holy Communion, Carolina Marroquin 3rd & 4th grades*), Cesar Zuleta (*5th & 6th grades*), Cecilia Hoyt (*First Year Confirmation*), and Jose De Barros (*RCIA in English*), as well as Sister Adriana (*our Director of Religious Education and RCIA Catechist in Spanish*). Every week, our catechists were here teaching our young people (and adults), about our beautiful Catholic Faith, and doing so voluntarily (without pay). As a priest, it is such a joy to be able to administer and witness the new spiritual life being given to all who have received the Sacraments. As your Pastor, it is my duty to remind everyone, and especially the parents of our youth in Religious Education, that the Sacraments are a “means to an end”. The “end” is making it to Heaven. The Sacraments help us make it to Heaven, specifically **attending Mass each and every weekend and going to Confession frequently. These Sacraments are necessary to remain spiritually alive.** Although there will be no more classes for Religious Education each Sunday until we began our new catechetical year in October, **it is expected that each child and their parents continue to attend Mass each weekend.** All of us who have been baptized are called to live holy lives, encouraging and supporting one another. My prayer for our parish is that each of us lead by example, following the example of our beautiful Mother Mary. This month of May is dedicated to Our Blessed Mother, who desires that we grow daily in our relationship with her Son - our Lord Jesus Christ. God bless!

ARSONIST

Peter and John “upon arriving imposed hands on them and they received the Holy Spirit.” —Acts 8:17

Near the end of Jesus’ public ministry, Samaritans would not allow Jesus and His disciples to pass through their town because they were headed toward Jerusalem. The apostle John was indignant. He asked Jesus for permission to call down fire from heaven to destroy those Samaritans (Lk 9:52-54). Jesus refused him, rebuking John on the spot (Lk 9:55).

Jesus did eventually allow John to call down fire from heaven onto the Samaritans. The deacon Philip had taken the Gospel in power to the unbelieving Samaritans, and they received the Word of God (Acts 8:5ff).

“When the apostles in Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them. The two...prayed that they might receive the Holy Spirit” (Acts 8:14, 15). John laid his hands on those whom he had earlier wished to incinerate, and the fire of God, the Holy Spirit, did fall upon them to consume them with the love of God (Acts 8:17). Jesus gave John his wish, but not in the way John had expected. Possibly, John had to undergo a bigger conversion than the Samaritans did.

Are there any people you wouldn’t mind having God remove from earth? Can you imagine Jesus eventually using you as His agent to bring these people into new life in the Spirit? If we are to love our enemies, we need that same gut-wrenching conversion John experienced. Repent! Forgive and love your enemies (Lk 6:35). “Receive the Holy Spirit” (Jn 20:22).

Prayer: Jesus, send the fire of the Holy Spirit to burn away the hardness in my heart. May I lead thousands to receive the Spirit.

Promise: “He who loves Me will be loved by My Father. I too will love him and reveal Myself to him.” —Jn 14:21

Praise: Praise the risen Lord Jesus, King of all heaven and earth, Who is with us (see Rv 19:16).


Presentation Ministries



PIRÓMANO

“Les impusieron las manos y recibieron el Espíritu Santo” (Hechos 8:17).

Cerca del final del ministerio público de Jesús, los samaritanos no permitieron a Jesús y a Sus discípulos el paso a través de su pueblo ya que ellos iban a Jerusalén. Juan el apóstol estaba indignado. Él preguntó a Jesús “Señor, ¿quieres que mandemos caer fuego del cielo para consumirlos?” (Lc 9:52-54), pero Jesús los reprendió (Lc 9:55).

Eventualmente Jesús permitió que cayera fuego desde el cielo sobre los samaritanos. Felipe, el diácono, llevó la Palabra a los samaritanos y ellos recibieron la Palabra de Dios (Hch 8:5ss). “Cuando los Apóstoles que estaban en Jerusalén oyeron que los samaritanos habían recibido la Palabra de Dios, les enviaron a Pedro y a Juan. Estos, al llegar, oraron por ellos para que recibieran el Espíritu Santo” (Hch 8:14, 15). Juan impuso sus manos a los que antes quería incinerar, y el fuego de Dios, el Espíritu Santo sí, cayó sobre ellos para consumirlos con el amor de Dios (Hch 8:17). Jesús hizo cumplir el deseo de Juan, pero no de la manera que Juan esperaba. Posiblemente Juan tuvo que hacer una conversión más grande que los samaritanos.

¿Hay algunas personas que no te molestaría si Dios los saca de la tierra? ¿Puedes imaginar que Jesús te usa como Su agente para traer a estas personas a la nueva vida en el Espíritu? Si amamos a nuestros enemigos, necesitamos esa misma conversión radical que tuvo Juan. ¡Arrepiéntete! Perdona y ama a tus enemigos (Lc 6:35). “Recibe al Espíritu Santo” (Jn 20:22).

Oración: Jesús, envía el fuego del Espíritu Santo para quemar la dureza en mi corazón, y que pueda llevar a miles a recibir el Espíritu.

Promesa: “Él que Me ama será amado por Mi Padre, y Yo lo amaré y me manifestaré a él” (Jn 14:21).

Alabanza: Alabanzas a Señor Jesús resucitado, Rey del cielo y de la tierra, Quien está con nosotros (Ap 19:16).



Sacrament of the Sick


