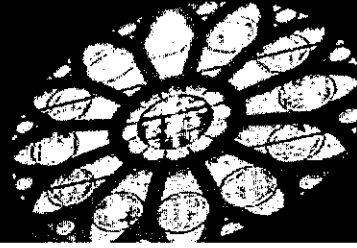

FROM BISHOP RICHARD G. HENNING

GOD IS LOVE

Each year in June, the Church observes the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. The devotion was originally proposed by Fr. John Eudes in the 1600's and spread far and wide through the witness of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque.

The devotion is founded upon the biblical truth that God is Love. Notice that the holy scriptures go beyond saying that God loves to proclaim that God is in Himself a communion of love. This is part of the same mystery that we celebrated last week on Trinity Sunday.

The Sacred Heart devotion also personalizes this truth. Our Lord is the revelation of the Heart of God. Miraculously, the only begotten Son has loved us with a heart of flesh – a heart wounded to deliver us from sin and death.

The artistic expressions of the Sacred Heart draw upon the biblical language and imagery. Sometimes they are images of Jesus pointing to his radiant and wounded heart. At other times the image is of the Sacred Heart itself accompanied by imagery of the passion such as the crown of thorns. There is a particularly beautiful work of art of this kind in the sanctuary of St. Patrick's Church on Smith Hill. The images are actually a part of the devotion as the Church encouraged the faithful to put such images in their homes and workplaces.

The other two major components of the devotion are the novena prayers and the First Friday devotions. All of these prayers invoke the loving mercy of the Divine Savior. The devotions are a beautiful way to seek particular petitions, to pray for others, and to implore that mercy when we have offended the Lord's most beautiful, gracious and loving heart. Sometimes the offenses are our own and sometimes we seek to do reparation for the sins of the world.

I remind us of these gifts of the Lord in part because of the approaching feast, but I also wish to express some specific ways in which the novena, feast, and devotions might help our own particular circumstances. During the month of June, there are many young people celebrating milestones and graduating from school. This devotion is a beautiful way to give a spiritual gift by praying for them by name or even thinking of particular intentions or graces that might aid them in their lives. The young have so many challenges and too much sadness in our culture and I believe that we should support and encourage them in every way possible – including our prayers.

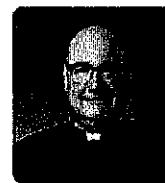
I also encourage us to consider the mercy of God and the value of reparation for sin. Certainly we would personally benefit from the humble admission of our faults, the grace of a good confession, and a profound trust in the loving mercy of the Lord.

We may also wish to consider the need for God's mercy for our world where violence, exploitation and selfishness abound. In

April, I wrote to you about the suffering of survivors of sexual abuse. I pray the Sacred Heart Novena for their healing and to ask the Lord to cleanse the Church and the world of that terrible sin and to renew and heal survivors.

There is also the sad fact that since 2020 some 300 Catholic Churches have been vandalized in the United States. Many of those attacks involved damage to images of Our Lady or Our Lord. Most tragically there have been some instances of the desecration of the Blessed Sacrament. These offenses along with the wider contempt for faith and the frequent crude mockery of the faith and of the Lord require us to do spiritual reparation and hope in that Divine Love that radiates from the Sacred Heart.

Perhaps you already pray these devotion regularly. Maybe you remember them from childhood or never had the opportunity to learn them. In whatever circumstances I encourage us to embrace this beautiful feast, its efficacious devotions and the truth of the Lord's healing love. Let this month of June, the month of the Sacred Heart, be our time to proclaim that GOD IS LOVE!

Dear Parishioners,

This Monday (June 24th) is the **Solemnity of the Birth of Saint John the Baptist**. On Sunday, we will gather together for a luncheon as a parish community, to celebrate our Patron Saint. **Who was Saint John the Baptist?**

First, *he was the miracle child* of Zechariah and Elizabeth. He was a “miracle” because his mother Elizabeth became pregnant with him when she was elderly. John was sanctified in his mother’s womb when our Blessed Mother Mary visited her while pregnant with Jesus. This beautiful meeting between the two pregnant mothers shows us *the joy of motherhood with the sacredness of life in the womb*.

Secondly, *John the Baptist clearly knew his purpose in life*. His entire life was a preparation for Jesus - his cousin and his Lord. As soon as Jesus began His public ministry, John the Baptist pointed others towards Him, saying: “*Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world*”. With great humility, John the Baptist led others to Jesus and away from himself. *The greatest gift that we can give another person is to point them to Jesus and the Kingdom of Heaven*. Thirdly, *Saint John the Baptist was not afraid to speak the truth*. John the Baptist was killed for standing up for *the truth about Marriage*. He told King Herod *the truth* - that his adulterous relationship with his brother’s wife was wrong. The king did not want to hear the truth, and so he had John killed. The truth about Marriage is that it is permanent, only between one man and one woman, and must be blessed by the Lord in a Sacrament in the Church (i.e. a civil “marriage” is not a marriage before the eyes of God). We live in a society that does not always want to hear the truth, and yet as disciples of Jesus Christ who is the Way, the *Truth*, and the Life, *we must never be afraid to speak the*

truths of our faith with courage and love. The sacredness of every human life, our purpose on earth in getting to Heaven, and courageously speaking the truth - these are three lessons that we can learn from our Patron Saint. *Saint John the Baptist, pray for us!* God bless!

A STORMY RELATIONSHIP

“The Lord addressed Job out of the storm.” — Job 38:1

You're in a veritable hurricane of difficulty, and all you can see of Jesus is that He's asleep. You want to scream, “Jesus, don't You care?” (see Mk 4:38) However, Jesus “cares for you” (1 Pt 5:7). “Indeed He neither slumbers nor sleeps, [your] Guardian” (Ps 121:4). Since Jesus never sleeps on the job of guarding you, His sleeping in the boat of the Church and of your life must carry another meaning. Possibly, Jesus' act of sleeping in the boat is yet another case of Him giving us an example (see Jn 13:15).

The disciples, accustomed to the storms of the sea, finally experienced a storm they couldn't handle. Jesus was in the same storm and the same boat, but was asleep. He had perfect peace in the raging storm. What an Example! (1 Pt 2:21) Facing death, Jesus yawns, arises, and stops the chaos (Mk 4:39).

Jesus has shared His Eucharistic Body (Lk 22:19) and divine nature with us (2 Pt 1:4). He wants to give us His own peace (Jn 20:19). He expects us to follow His example and trust Him in the worst times. This is evident, because instead of comforting His panicked disciples, He challenges them, exclaiming: “Why are you so terrified? Why are you lacking in faith?” (Mk 4:40)

Jesus states that we, His disciples, will undergo storms and trials (Mt 7:25). “It is a test for you, but it should not catch you off guard” (1 Pt 4:12). When Jesus the Good Shepherd judges it to be the proper time, He will lead you from the stormy waters to the still waters (Ps 23:2; Ps 107:30). Trust Him and do not fear (Mk 5:36). Jesus is Lord over all storms.

Prayer: Jesus, You are my Refuge. I will not be afraid (Ps 27:1).

Promise: “If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation.” —2 Cor 5:17

Praise: Praise Jesus, Whom the winds and waves obey. Presentation Ministries

UNA RELACIÓN TEMPESTUOSA

“El Señor respondió a Job desde la tempestad, diciendo” (Job 38:1).

Estás en un verdadero huracán de dificultad, y todo lo que puedes ver de Jesús es que está dormido. Quieres gritar, “Jesús, ¿no te importa?” (ver Mc 4:38) Sin embargo, Jesús “se ocupa de ustedes” (1 Pe 5:7). “No, no duerme ni dormita el guardián de Israel” (Sal 121:4). Como Jesús nunca duerme en el trabajo de custodiarte, dormirse en la barca de la Iglesia y de tu vida debe tener otro significado. Posiblemente, el acto de Jesús de dormir en la barca es otro caso más de Él dándonos un ejemplo (ver Jn 13:15).

Los discípulos, acostumbrados a las tormentas del mar, finalmente experimentaron una tormenta que no pudieron manejar. Jesús estaba en la misma tormenta y en la misma barca, pero estaba dormido. Tenía perfecta paz en medio de la tormenta furiosa. ¡Qué ejemplo! (1 Pe 2:21) Ante la muerte, Jesús bosteza, se levanta y detiene el caos (Mc 4:39).

Jesús ha compartido Su Cuerpo Eucarístico (Lc 22:19) y la naturaleza divina con nosotros (2 Pe 1:4). Él quiere darnos Su propia paz (Jn 20:19). Él espera que sigamos Su ejemplo y confiemos en Él en los peores momentos. Esto es evidente, porque en lugar de consolar a Sus aterrorizados discípulos, los desafía, exclamando: “¿Por qué tienen miedo? ¿Cómo no tienen fe?” (Mc 4:40)

Jesús afirma que nosotros, Sus discípulos, pasaremos por tormentas y pruebas (Mt 7:25). “No se extrañen de la violencia que se ha desatado contra ustedes para ponerlos a prueba” (1 Pe 4:12). Cuando Jesús, el Buen Pastor, juzgue que es el momento adecuado, te conducirá de las aguas tempestuosas a las aguas tranquilas (Sal 23:2; Sal 107:30). Confía en Él y no temáis (Mc 5:36). Jesús es Señor sobre todas las tormentas.

Oración: El Señor es mi luz y mi salvación, ¿a quién temeré? (Sal 27:1)

Promesa: “El que vive en Cristo es una nueva criatura” (2 Co 5:17).

Alabanza: Alabado sea Jesús, a Quien obedecen los vientos y las olas. Presentation Ministries

DIOS ES AMOR

Cada año, en junio, la Iglesia observa la Solemnidad del Sagrado Corazón de Jesús. La devoción fue propuesta originalmente por el Padre Juan Eudes en el siglo XVII y se difundió por todas partes a través del testimonio de Santa Margarita María Alacoque. La devoción se basa en la verdad bíblica de que Dios es Amor. Notese que las Sagradas Escrituras van más allá de decir que a Dios le encanta proclamar que Dios es en sí mismo una comunión de amor. Esto es parte del mismo misterio que celebramos la semana pasada el Domingo de la Trinidad. La devoción al Sagrado Corazón también personaliza esta verdad. Nuestro Señor es la revelación del Corazón de Dios. Milagrosamente, el Hijo unigénito nos ha amado con un corazón de carne, un corazón herido para librar-nos del pecado y de la muerte. Las expresiones artísticas del Sagrado Corazón se basan en el lenguaje y las imágenes bíblicas. A veces son imágenes de Jesús señalando su corazón radiante y herido. En otras ocasiones la imagen es del Sagrado Corazón acompañada de imágenes de la pasión como la corona de espinas. Hay una obra de arte de este tipo particularmente hermosa en el santuario de la iglesia de San Patricio en Smith Hill. Las imágenes son en realidad parte de la devoción, ya que la Iglesia animó a los fieles a colocarlas en sus hogares y lugares de trabajo. Los otros dos componentes principales de la devoción son las oraciones de la novena y las devociones del primer viernes. Todas estas oraciones invocan la amorosa misericordia del Divino Salvador. Los devocionales son una hermosa manera de buscar peticiones particulares, de orar por los demás, he implorar esa misericordia cuando hemos ofendido el corazón más hermoso, misericordioso y amoroso del Señor. A veces las ofensas son nuestras y otras veces buscamos reparar los pecados del mundo. Yo les recuerdo estos dones del Señor en parte debido a la fiesta que se acerca, pero también deseo expresar algunas maneras específicas en las que la novena, la fiesta y las devociones podrían ayudar a nuestras circunstancias particulares. Durante el mes de junio, hay muchos jóvenes que

celebran logros y se gradúan de la escuela. Esta devoción es hermosa y es un regalo espiritual, orando por ellos por nombre o incluso pensando en intenciones o gracias particulares que podrían ayudarlos en sus vidas. Los jóvenes tienen tantos desafíos y demasiada tristeza en nuestra cultura y creo que debemos apoyarlos y alentarlos en todas las formas posibles, incluidas nuestras oraciones. También los animo a considerar la misericordia de Dios y el valor de la reparación por el pecado. Ciertamente, nos beneficiaríamos personalmente de la humilde admisión de nuestras faltas, de la gracia de una buena Confesión y de una profunda confianza en la amorosa misericordia del Señor. Quizás también deseemos considerar la necesidad de la misericordia de Dios para nuestro mundo donde abundan la violencia, la explotación y el egoísmo. En Abril, escribí sobre el sufrimiento de los sobrevivientes de abuso sexual. Rezo la Novena del Sagrado Corazón por su curación y pido al Señor que limpie a la Iglesia y al mundo de ese terrible pecado y que renueve y sane a los sobrevivientes. También está el triste hecho de que desde 2020 unas 300 iglesias católicas han sido vandalizadas en Estados Unidos. Muchos de esos ataques involucraron daños a imágenes de Nuestra Señora o Nuestro Señor. Lo más trágico ha sido que se hayan producido algunos casos de profanación del Santísimo Sacramento. Estas ofensas junto con el desprecio más amplio por la fe y las frecuentes y crudas burlas de la fe y del Señor exigen que hagamos reparación espiritual y esperanza en ese Amor Divino que irradia del Sagrado Corazón. Quizás ya rezas estos devocionales con regularidad. Quizás los recuerdes desde pequeño o nunca tuviste la oportunidad de aprenderlos. En cualquier circunstancia, los animo a abrazar esta hermosa fiesta, sus eficaces devociones y la verdad del amor sanador del Señor. ¡Qué este mes de junio, mes del Sagrado Corazón, sea nuestro tiempo para proclamar que DIOS ES AMOR!

Décimo Segundo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

23 de Junio, 2024

Queridos feligreses,

Este lunes (24 de Junio) es la Solemnidad del Nacimiento de San Juan Bautista. El domingo nos reuniremos para un almuerzo como comunidad parroquial, para celebrar a nuestro Santo Patrono. **¿Quién fue San Juan Bautista?**

Primero, *fue el hijo milagroso de Zacarías e Isabel. Fue un "milagro" porque su madre Isabel quedó embarazada de él cuando era anciana. Juan fue santificado en el vientre de su madre cuando nuestra Santísima Madre María la visitó mientras estaba embarazada de Jesús. Este hermoso encuentro entre las dos madres embarazadas nos muestra **la alegría de la maternidad con lo sagrado de la vida en el vientre.** En segundo lugar, *Juan el Bautista claramente conocía su propósito en la vida.**

Toda su vida fue una preparación para Jesús - su primo y su Señor. Tan pronto como Jesús comenzó su ministerio público, Juan el Bautista señaló a otros hacia Él, diciendo: *"Este el Cordero de Dios que quita los pecados del mundo".* Con gran humildad, Juan el Bautista llevó a otros a Jesús y lejos de sí mismo. **El mayor regalo que podemos darle a otra persona es señalarle a Jesús y al Reino de los Cielos.** En tercer lugar, *San Juan Bautista no tenía miedo de decir la verdad.*

Juan el Bautista fue asesinado por defender *la verdad sobre el Matrimonio.* Le dijo la verdad al rey Herodes: que su relación adúltera con la esposa de su hermano estaba mal. El rey no quería escuchar la verdad, y por eso hizo matar a Juan. La verdad sobre el Matrimonio es que es permanente, solo entre un hombre y una mujer, y debe ser bendecido por el Señor en un Sacramento en la Iglesia (es decir, **un "matrimonio" civil no es un matrimonio ante los ojos de Dios**). Vivimos en una sociedad que no siempre quiere escuchar la verdad y, sin embargo, como discípulos de Jesucristo, que es el Camino, la Verdad y la Vida, *nunca debemos*

tener miedo de decir las verdades de nuestra fe con valentía y amor. La santidad de cada vida humana, nuestro propósito en la tierra al llegar al Cielo y decir la verdad con valentía: estas son tres lecciones que podemos aprender de nuestro Santo Patrón. **¡San Juan Bautista, ruega por nosotros!** ¡Dios los bendiga!

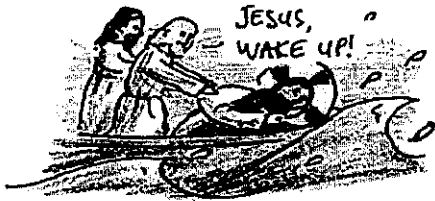

Trust in God



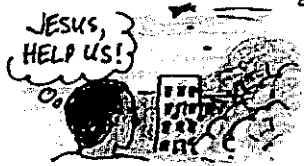
In today's Gospel reading the apostles became very afraid when a storm came up and the boat they were in started to sink.
