Dear Parishioners,

During this month of July dedicated to **Devotion to the Precious Blood of Jesus**, I would like to share the following reflection by Brian Smith, from the website: teachingcatholickids.com: “*Each of us has blood that flows through our body. Blood allows our body to work as God intended. Without blood we cannot run outside, play with our favorite toys, or even breathe! Blood, then, is what allows us to live each day to the fullest. Without blood, we could not live. Jesus desperately wants us to spend eternity in heaven. When we sin, we turn our backs to God. This makes God sad. And so, to redeem us in the eyes of God, Jesus chose to shed his own blood as a sacrifice for our sins! Jesus wants us to go to heaven so much that he was willing to suffer a long and harsh death. Jesus shed his blood seven times during his life for us: (1) *The Presentation of the Lord (Jesus was circumcised)*. (2) *The Agony in the Garden (Jesus' sweat turned into blood)*. (3) *The Scourging at the Pillar (Jesus was whipped)*. (4) *The Crowning of Thorns (thorns were pressed into Jesus' head)*. (5) *The Way of the Cross (onlookers punched and kicked Jesus)*. (6) *The Crucifixion (Jesus is nailed to the cross)*. (7) *The Piercing of His Heart (a soldier placed his sword through Jesus' side, causing all of Jesus' blood to spill out upon the ground)*. As Catholics, we recognize all of Jesus' suffering and believe that he truly died for us in hope that we might go to heaven one day. Just because Jesus died for our sins does not mean that we can live and do whatever we want. Every day, we must try to be pleasing to God. This includes our thoughts, words, and actions. Sometimes we make mistakes. God invites us to the Sacrament of Reconciliation to amend our sins. When we recognize our sins, we are joined with the Precious Blood of Jesus as we promise to God that we will try to live a better life.” As we prepare once again to receive the Body and Blood of Jesus at Mass, let us pray for the grace to follow Him more closely. God bless!*



PRIMARY SCHOOL

We should acknowledge Jesus as first in everything. When we wake up, the first word on our lips should be "Jesus." Our first activity each day should be praying in the name of Jesus. Before talking to anyone else, we first talk to Him. Before we pick up the phone, answer the doorbell, or put the key in the ignition, Jesus comes first. Before turning on the TV, opening the refrigerator, or pressing a button, Jesus is first. Before we pay any other bills, we pay our tithe. Jesus has the primacy in everything — financially, sexually, emotionally, physically, and spiritually.

Jesus is "the First and the Last" (Rv 1:17), "the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End" (Rv 21:6). Jesus is first chronologically. We seek first His kingdom and give Him prime-time (Mt 6:33). Jesus is first ontologically. "He is before all else that is...the Beginning, the First-Born of the dead" (Col 1:17, 18).

Jesus is God. He is not only Lord, but Lord alone. Therefore, we should love Him with all our heart, all our soul, all our strength, and all our mind (Lk 10:27).


Prayer: Jesus, Savior, Lord, and God, I decide to always live for You alone.

Queridos feligreses,

Durante este mes de Julio dedicado a la Devoción a la Preciosa Sangre de Jesús, me gustaría compartir la siguiente reflexión de Brian Smith, del sitio web: teachingcatholickids.com: “*Cada uno de nosotros tiene sangre que fluye a través de nuestro cuerpo. La sangre permite que nuestro cuerpo funcione como Dios lo desea. ¡Sin sangre no podemos correr afuera, jugar con nuestros juguetes favoritos, o incluso respirar! La sangre, entonces, es lo que nos permite vivir cada día al máximo. Sin sangre, no podríamos vivir. Jesús quiere desesperadamente que pasemos la eternidad en el cielo. Cuando pecamos, damos la espalda a Dios. Esto pone a Dios triste. Y así, para redimirnos a los ojos de Dios, ¡Jesús eligió derramar su propia sangre como sacrificio por nuestros pecados! Jesús quiere que vayamos al cielo tanto que estaba dispuesto a sufrir una muerte larga y dura. Jesús derramó su sangre siete veces durante su vida por nosotros: (1) La Presentación del Señor (Jesús fue circuncidado). (2) La agonía en el jardín (el sudor de Jesús se convirtió en sangre). (3) La flagelación en el pilar (Jesús fue azotado). (4) La corona de espinas (las espinas fueron presionadas contra la cabeza de Jesús). (5) El Vía Crucis (los espectadores golpearon y patearon a Jesús). (6) La crucifixión (Jesús es clavado en la cruz). (7) La Perforación de Su Corazón (un soldado colocó su espada en el costado de Jesús, causando que toda la sangre de Jesús se derramara en el suelo). Como Católicos, reconocemos todo el sufrimiento de Jesús y creemos que realmente murió por nosotros con la esperanza de poder ir al cielo algún día. Solo porque Jesús murió por nuestros pecados no significa que podamos vivir y hacer lo que queramos. Todos los días, debemos tratar de agradar a Dios. Esto incluye nuestros pensamientos, palabras y acciones. A veces cometemos errores. Dios nos invita al Sacramento de la Reconciliación para enmendar nuestros pecados. Cuando reconocemos nuestros pecados, nos unimos a la Preciosa Sangre de Jesús cuando le prometemos a Dios que trataremos de vivir una vida mejor”.*

Mientras nos preparamos una vez más para recibir el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Jesús en la Misa, oremos por la gracia de seguirlo más de cerca. ¡Dios les bendiga!



Debemos reconocer a Jesús como el primero en todo. Cuando nos despertamos, la primera palabra en nuestros labios debería ser “Jesús.” Nuestra primera actividad cada día debería ser orar en el nombre de Jesús. Antes de hablar con alguien más, primero hablamos con él. Antes de levantar el teléfono, contestar el timbre de la puerta o poner la llave en el encendido del carro, Jesús es lo primero. Antes de encender la televisión, abrir el refrigerador o presionar un botón, Jesús es el primero. Antes de pagar cualquier otra cuenta, pagamos nuestro diezmo. Jesús tiene la primacía en todo: económica, sexual, emocional, física y espiritualmente.

Jesús es “el Primero y el Último” (Ap 1:17), “el Alfa y la Omega, el Principio y el Fin” (Ap 21:6). Jesús es el primero cronológicamente. Buscamos primero Su reino y le damos la máxima importancia (Mt 6: 33). Jesús es el primero ontológicamente. “Él existe antes que todas las cosas y todo subsiste en Él. El es también la Cabeza del Cuerpo, es decir, de la Iglesia. Él es el Principio, el Primero que resucitó de entre los muertos” (Col 1:17, 18).

Jesús es Dios. Él no es solo Señor, sino El Señor. Por lo tanto, debemos amarlo con todo nuestro corazón, con toda nuestra alma, con todas nuestras fuerzas y con toda nuestra mente (Lc 10:27).

Oración: Jesús, Salvador, Señor y Dios, decidido vivir siempre solo para Ti.

Promesa: “Porque Dios quiso que en Él residiera toda la Plenitud. Por Él quiso reconciliar consigo todo lo que existe en la tierra y en el cielo, restableciendo la paz por la sangre de Su cruz” (Col 1:19-20).

Alabanza: “El Señor libera a los cautivos, abre los ojos de los ciegos y endereza a los que están encorvados, y ama a los justos” (Sal 146:8). ¡Jesús resucitado, en Ti confiamos!

Loving God and Our Neighbour

In today's Gospel reading we learn that the greatest commandment is to love God with all our heart and soul and strength, and to love our neighbour as ourselves.

The most important thing you do in your life is loving God. If you really love God then you will do what is right and love other people as well. The Samaritan in the story loved God even though he didn't worship Him in the proper way like the Jews did. But because he loved God he wanted to please Him by being kind to his enemy.

If you don't love God then you will not be able to make good decisions about other things either. You can't even love other people properly if you don't love God the most. The priest and Levite in the parable probably cared more about themselves than about God. That is why when they saw their own countryman injured and lying by the roadside they just walked past.

Is God the most important person in your life? Talk to Him every day and you will grow to love Him. You can be a good neighbour to everyone by being a good friend of God.


