Fifth Sunday of Easter

May 3, 2026

Peace and Good! Dear brothers and sisters in our Lord Jesus Christ.

Introduction

The Gospel for this Fifth Sunday of Easter reveals to us the intimate union between the Son and the Father—a union that allows us to delve into the knowledge of the mystery of God and His saving work.

Jesus presents Himself to us as "*the Way, the Truth, and the Life. No one comes to the Father except through me.*" If we wish to know the Father—who raised Jesus from the dead and who will raise us as well—we must listen to His Son. It is He who reveals the Father to us. He is the Way that leads us to the true God, the Giver of Life for all of humanity—the Father of all, without distinction of race, social status, or gender.

Biblical Commentary on the Readings

The First Reading from the *Acts of the Apostles* (6:1–7) illustrates the emergence of new ministries in response to the needs of the nascent Church (specifically, caring for widows). This led to the election of seven leaders—known as ***deacons*** (meaning "servants")—to minister to those converts who had come from the Hellenistic diaspora; these were Christians who spoke Greek and possessed a distinct mindset, culture, and perspective regarding the religious traditions of Israel. We must recognize here a shift in direction—one that would undoubtedly shape the future relationship between Christians and Judaism—paving the way for the Church to embrace universality (that is, to become ***catholic***).

This is not merely a matter of "*deacons*" who serve at the tables of the poor—though that was indeed one of their responsibilities—but rather of representatives of the Apostles who receive a specific ministry within the Church dedicated to the service of God's holy people (a ministry of service).

The Second Reading, taken from the *First Letter of the Apostle Peter* (2:4–9), also offers us a sense of identity; drawing upon theological teaching, it affirms that all Christians constitute a people of kings, a

priestly people, and a consecrated nation. Drawing near to Jesus—the Lord who died for us and rose again to give us life—signifies that the cultic religion of Judaism ceases to be elitist (no longer limited solely to the people of Israel), so that we, too, may enjoy the prerogatives of the most holy and sacred. Thus is born a new people, a new holy and priestly community that embodies a spiritual—rather than merely cultic—fullness.

Each of the baptized, therefore, receives both a personal and a communal inheritance. Consequently, one need not be born of a sacred lineage, nor be specifically consecrated, in order to commune with God or to experience His salvation. For through baptism, we all become part of the People of God—a holy nation and a people of kings.

Today's Gospel reading from *John* (14:1–12) is situated within Jesus' testament to His disciples at the Last Supper (it is a farewell discourse). On that night, as John understands it, Jesus imparted to His own the most profound truths regarding His life and His very existence. Jesus reveals Himself as the Way that leads to God; He presents Himself as equal to God—equal to God who is Father. The central theme of this passage is Jesus' affirmation of Himself as the "*Way, the Truth, and the Life.*"

We know that a *path* is meant to be walked, leading one to a destination; *life* is meant to be lived, savored, and enjoyed; and *truth* is meant to be experienced as goodness—standing in contrast to falsehood, which breeds disquiet and unhappiness. In the biblical world, truth (***emet***) is not merely an idea, but a reality that is actively created, realized, and put into practice. And for the Christian, Jesus is the "*Way, the Truth, and the Life.*"

No one can come to the Father except through Jesus ("*through Me*"). Human beings seek God; they have a need for God—yet not just any god, but the Father. Jesus has revealed Him in this very manner, and upon this revelation, He has staked both His word and His life: this is His truth. Saint John, therefore, affirms that it is not possible to experience God except through Jesus; for this reason, He is the only path that leads to the Father—who is our Father.

For this reason, brothers and sisters, I invite you to contemplate the path of the Church—which is Jesus—the only One who leads us to the Father. Let us not be like the Apostle Philip, who asked to be shown the Father ("...and that will suffice for us"); for by contemplating Him in the Eucharist, we will behold the face of God the Father. Furthermore, every brother and sister who has received the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ in Holy Communion will carry the face of the Father to their brothers and sisters through their kindness, prayer, and service, lived out in accordance with their own vocation.

I exhort you, brothers and sisters, to pray for our young people who will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation this coming May 9th at the Cathedral, conferred by Monsignor Bruce Lewandowski; and for our children who will receive the Holy Eucharist for the first time this coming May 16th here at our parish. May the Lord bless our catechists, who—with such diligence, passion, and personal witness—have poured themselves out to reveal "*the Way, the Truth, and the Life*" (Jn 14:6), just as the Evangelist Saint John teaches us this Sunday. Finally, I remind you to continue supporting the parish through the \$5 raffle, the proceeds of which will help fund the celebration of the Feast of Saint John the Baptist.

Quinto Domingo de Pascua

3 de Mayo, 2026

¡Paz y Bien! Estimados hermanos y hermanas en nuestro Señor Jesucristo.

Introducción

El Evangelio de este V Domingo de Pascua nos revela la íntima unión del Hijo y el Padre que nos permite adentrarnos en el conocimiento del misterio de Dios y de su obra salvadora.

Jesús se nos presenta como *“El Camino, la Verdad y la Vida. Nadie va al Padre sino por mí”*. Si queremos conocer al Padre que resucita a Jesús de entre los muertos y que nos resucitará también a nosotros, debemos escuchar a su Hijo. Es quien nos lo revela. Es el camino que nos conduce al Dios verdadero y dador de vida para toda la humanidad. El Padre de todos, sin distinciones de razas, condición social o género.

Comentario bíblico de las lecturas

La Iª Lectura de los *Hechos (6, 1-7)* muestra la apertura de nuevos ministerios según la necesidad la naciente iglesia (atender a las viudas), dándose la elección de siete responsables (diáconos que significa servidores), para los cristianos que se habían convertido, provenientes de la diáspora del mundo helenista, que hablaban griego, que tenían otra mentalidad, otra cultura y otros planteamientos sobre las tradiciones religiosas del Israel. Se debe reconocer un cambio de rumbo, que sin duda marcará el futuro de los cristianos frente al judaísmo, para abrirse a la universalidad (es decir a ser católico).

No se trata simplemente de *“diáconos”* que sirven a las mesas de los pobres, aunque ésta era una de sus responsabilidades; se trata de representantes de los Apóstoles, que reciben un ministerio dentro de la iglesia para el servicio del pueblo santo de Dios (ministerio de servicio).

La IIª Lectura de la *Carta del Apóstol Pedro (2, 4-9)* ofrece también una identidad, recurriendo a la teología (enseñanza), de que todos los cristianos

somos un pueblo de reyes, un pueblo sacerdotal, una nación consagrada. Acercarse a Jesús, el Señor que ha muerto por nosotros y ha resucitado para darnos la vida, significa que la religión cultural del judaísmo deja de ser elitista (no sólo el pueblo de Israel), para que podamos gozar de las prerrogativas de lo más santo y sagrado. Por eso nace un nuevo pueblo, una nueva comunidad santa y sacerdotal que entraña una plenitud espiritual y no cultural.

Cada uno de los bautizados, pues, recibe una herencia personal y comunitaria. No se necesita, pues, nacer de estirpe sagrada, ni ser consagrado específicamente, para comunicarse con Dios, para sentir su salvación. Pues con el bautismo todos entramos a formar parte del pueblo de Dios, nación santa y pueblo de reyes.

El evangelio de hoy de *Juan (14, 1-12)*, está inserto en el testamento de Jesús a los discípulos en la última cena (es un discurso de despedida). Aquella noche, entiende Juan, Jesús comunicó a los suyos las verdades más profundas de su vida y de su existencia. Jesús se auto-revela, como el camino que lleva a Dios; se presenta igual a Dios, igual a Dios que es Padre. El centro del mismo es la afirmación de Jesús como *«camino, verdad y vida»*.

Ya sabemos que el *camino* es para andar y llegar a una meta; la *vida* es para vivirla, gustarla y disfrutarla; la *verdad* es para experimentarla como bondad frente a la mentira, que engendra desazón e infelicidad. En el mundo bíblico la verdad (emet) no es una idea, sino una realidad que se hace, se realiza, se lleva a la práctica. Y para el cristiano Jesús es el *«camino, verdad y vida»*.

Nadie puede llegar al Padre sino por Jesús (*“por mí”*). Los hombres buscan a Dios, necesitan a Dios; pero no a cualquier Dios, sino el Padre. Jesús lo ha revelado de esa forma y en ello ha empeñado su palabra y su vida: ésta es su verdad. San Juan, pues, está afirmando que no es posible experimentar a Dios sino por medio de Jesús y por esta razón es el único camino que lleva al Padre, que es nuestro Padre.

Por esta razón hermanos y hermanas, les invitó a contemplar el camino de la Iglesia, que es Jesús, el único que nos lleva al Padre. Que no seamos como el apóstol Felipe, que pide que le muestre al Padre (... y nos basta), pues al contemplarlo en la Eucaristía, veremos el rostro de Dios Padre y cada hermano y hermana, que haya comulgado del Cuerpo y la Sangre, de nuestro Señor Jesucristo, llevará el rostro del Padre a los hermanos con su bondad, oración y servicio desde su vocación.

Les exhorto hermanos a orar por nuestros jóvenes que recibirán el sacramento de la Confirmación el próximo 9 de mayo en la Catedral por Mons. Bruce Lewandowski y nuestros niños que recibirán por primera vez la Santa Eucaristía, el próximo 16 de mayo, en nuestra parroquia. Que el Señor bendiga a nuestros catequistas, que con tanto esmero, pasión y testimonio, se han desgastado para mostrar el *camino, la verdad y la vida (Jn. 14, 6)*, como nos enseña este domingo el evangelista San Juan. Por último, les recuerdo seguir apoyando la parroquia con la rifa de \$5 dólares, para preparar la fiesta de San Juan Bautista.
