Fourth Sunday of Easter

Dear Parishioners,

In last weekend's bulletin, I wrote about the importance of the Sacrament of Baptism, its effects on our new life in Jesus Christ, and the responsibilities of parents and godparents in raising the child in the Catholic Faith. As we prepare for the First Holy Communion of our children in the parish next Saturday, May 6th, at 11am, I would like to share about the **Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist** - Jesus in Holy Communion, Jesus truly present in His Body and Blood. The following reading is from **Saint Justin, Martyr**, who lived from 100 - 165 (1900 years ago!). It is from "the first apology in defense of the Christians", entitled "**The Celebration of the Eucharist**": *"No one may share the eucharist with us unless he believes that what we teach is true, unless he is washed in the regenerating waters of baptism for the remission of his sins, and unless he lives in accordance with the principles given us by Christ. We do not consume the eucharistic bread and wine as if it were ordinary food and drink, for we have been taught that as Jesus Christ our Savior became a man of flesh and blood by the power of the Word of God, so also the food that our flesh and blood assimilates for its nourishment becomes the flesh and blood of the incarnate Jesus by the power of his own words contained in the prayer of thanksgiving. The apostles, in their recollections, which are called gospels, handed down to us what Jesus commanded them to do. They tell us that he took bread, gave thanks and said: Do this in memory of me. This is my body. In the same way he took the cup, he gave thanks and said: This is my blood. The Lord gave this command to them alone. Ever since then we have constantly reminded one another of these things. The rich among us help the poor and we are always united. For all that we receive we praise the Creator of the universe through his Son Jesus Christ and through the Holy*

Spirit." These words from Saint Justin truly express what we believe, that Jesus Christ is truly present in His Body and Blood, and therefore, in order to receive Him at Mass, we should be living in the state of grace (free from serious/mortal sin in our lives) - in "communion" with Him. To prepare for their First Holy Communion, all of the children received the Sacrament of Confession to have their sins forgiven by Jesus. May we follow their example. God Bless!

PROMISE-KEEPERS

"You must reform and be baptized, each one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ."

—Acts 2:38 "Those who accepted his message were baptized; some three thousand were added that day." —Acts 2:41

Three weeks ago, at Easter Sunday Mass, the Church led us to renew our baptismal promises. We prepared for this renewal by forty days of Lenten penance through almsgiving, prayer, and fasting (see Mt 6:3, 6, 17). The Lord wants these baptismal promises to be the center of our year and the foundation of our life in Him.

How aware (see Rm 6:3) are you of having renewed your baptismal promises three weeks ago? Have you turned off the TV and set down your phone after remembering you had rejected all of Satan's empty promises? Have you decided not to buy something because you had rejected all of Satan's works? When you are tempted to be manipulated by fear, do you resist because you believe God is your Father? (see Is 41:13) Has your faith in Jesus' lordship affected your decision-making? Has your belief in the Holy Spirit noticeably affected your lifestyle?

On Easter Sunday, when we renewed our baptismal promises, we repented from all our sins, accepted Jesus as Savior, Lord, and God, sold all that we had to enter God's kingdom (Mt 13:44-46), and surrendered our lives to the Holy Spirit. Now we must keep and apply the promises we've made.

Prayer: Father, may I help someone realize what they did when they renewed their baptismal promises.

Promise: "I came that they might have life and have it to the full." —Jn 10:10

Praise: "I will give thanks to the Lord for His justice, and sing praise to the name of the Lord Most High" (Ps 7:18). Risen Jesus, You are the Righteous One.


Presentation Ministries


Eucharistic Adoration

Queridos feligreses,

En el boletín del fin de semana pasado, escribí sobre la importancia del Sacramento del Bautismo, sus efectos en nuestra nueva vida en Jesucristo y las responsabilidades de los padres y padrinos en la crianza del niño en la Fe Católica. Mientras nos preparamos para la Primera Comunión de nuestros niños en la parroquia el próximo sábado 6 de Mayo a las 11am, me gustaría compartir sobre el **Sacramento de la Sagrada Eucaristía**: Jesús en la Sagrada Comunión, Jesús verdaderamente presente en Su Cuerpo y Sangre. La siguiente lectura es de **San Justino, mártir**, que vivió del 100 al 165 (¡hace 1900 años!). Es de “la primera apología en defensa de los cristianos”, titulada **“La celebración de la Eucaristía”**: “*Nadie puede compartir la eucaristía con nosotros a menos que crea que lo que enseñamos es verdad, a menos que se lave en las aguas regeneradoras del bautismo para la remisión de sus pecados, y a menos que viva de acuerdo con los principios dados por Cristo. No consumimos el pan y el vino eucarísticos como si fueran comida y bebida ordinaria, porque se nos ha enseñado que, así como Jesucristo nuestro Salvador se hizo hombre de carne y hueso por el poder de la Palabra de Dios, así también la comida que nuestra carne y sangre asimilan para su alimento se convierte en la carne y la sangre de Jesús encarnado por el poder de sus propias palabras contenidas en la oración de acción de gracias. Los apóstoles, en sus memorias, que se llaman evangelios, nos transmitieron lo que Jesús les mandó hacer. Nos dicen que tomó pan, dio gracias y dijo: Haced esto en memoria mía. Este es mi cuerpo. Del mismo modo tomó la copa, dio gracias y dijo: Esta es mi sangre. El Señor les dio este mandato solo a ellos. Desde entonces, nos hemos recordado constantemente estas cosas. Los ricos entre nosotros ayudan a los pobres y siempre estamos unidos. Por todo lo que recibimos, alabamos al Creador del universo por medio de su Hijo*


Jesucristo y del Espíritu Santo.” Estas palabras de San Justino verdaderamente expresan lo que creemos, que Jesucristo está verdaderamente presente en Su Cuerpo y Sangre, y por lo tanto, para poder recibirla en la Misa, debemos estar viviendo en estado de gracia (libres de pecado grave/mortal en nuestras vidas) - en “comunión” con Él. Para prepararse para su Primera Comunión, todos los niños recibieron el Sacramento de la Confesión para que Jesús les perdonara sus pecados. Que sigamos su ejemplo. ¡Dios los bendiga!



Promesa: “Yo he venido para que las ovejas tengan Vida, y la tengan en abundancia” (Jn 10:10).

Alabanza: “Daré gracias al Señor por su justicia y cantaré al nombre del Señor Altísimo” (Sal 7:18). Jesús resucitado, eres el Justo.

The Good Shepherd



The readings in today's Mass talk about Jesus the Good Shepherd. In Jesus' time, and still in some parts of the world today, there would be flocks of sheep grazing in the pastures. The shepherds were the people who looked after the flocks and made sure none of the sheep got lost or hurt or attacked by wild animals.

The Church is the flock of Jesus, and He is the Good Shepherd. He guides the people in the Church so that their souls will not be hungry- He gives us grace, just like a shepherd makes sure his sheep have lots of grass to eat!

Like the shepherd protects the sheep from danger, Our Lord also protects us from harm. In the "Our Father" we ask God to deliver us from evil. When our souls are hurt by sin, the Good Shepherd heals us with forgiveness in Confession.





