Epiphany of the Lord, January 3, 2021

Dear Parishioners,

The Magi have finally arrived at the Creche! As you may have noticed over the past week in the church, the three kings have been inching closer and closer to the Manger. Today, as we celebrate **the Feast of the Epiphany** (meaning "manifestation"), their journey ended as they were led by the star to where Joseph and Mary were with their newborn Child. The Magi from the East had an "epiphany" as Jesus was "manifested" to them. They came to the Creche with their three gifts of frankincense, gold, and myrrh for the Child Jesus. The gold represented the Divinity of Jesus, the frankincense represented the Kingship of Jesus, and the myrrh represented Jesus' humanity. **There is so much to contemplate on this Feast of the Epiphany**, as we continue to celebrate our Lord's Birth. *First and foremost, we contemplate the fact that we are all still on a journey back to our Father in Heaven.* Even the Magi were still on a journey after the initial meeting with Baby Jesus. Daily, they had to renew their relationship with Him, just like we must do everyday, until we finally arrive Home. *Secondly, on this Feast of the Epiphany, we contemplate the fact that Jesus is the Savior for all.* When He was manifested to the Magi, who were Gentiles, the Lord showed that salvation is a gift for anyone who truly accepts Jesus into their lives, which happens through the Sacraments of our Catholic Church. *Finally, on this Feast of the Epiphany, we contemplate those three gifts that the Magi brought before the Lord.* We bring the Lord our three gifts of "time, talent, and treasure", as we worship Him as a parish community. Spiritually, physically, and financially, we can show our love for God and one another. May we continue to draw closer to Jesus our Newborn King as we begin this new year of 2021. God bless!

Epiphany Blessing of the Home

It has been a tradition in the Catholic Church to bless chalk at the Masses for Epiphany, and then use the blessed chalk as part of blessing one's home in the New Year. The home blessing can be done as follows: Use the blessed chalk to write 20+C+M+B+21 above the doorways. 2021 for the year; C, M, B for the Magi—Casper, Melchior, and Balthasar—and for "Christus Mansionem Benedicat", Latin for "May Christ Bless this House." As you are writing, pray the following prayer: "*May all who come to our home this year rejoice to find Christ living among us; and may we seek and serve, in everyone we meet, that same Jesus who is Lord, forever and ever. Amen.*"

The Annual Respect for Life Mass




THE GIFT OF SELF

"Then they opened their coffers and presented Him with gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh." — Matthew 2:11 For most of the world, today's feast of Epiphany is the most important day of the Christmas season. It's the day when many people exchange gifts and imitate the wise men who gave gifts to Jesus. Today the Lord is calling us to give Jesus the present of ourselves, to prostrate ourselves before Him and do Him homage (Mt 2:11). Like the wise men, we should express our giving of everything to Jesus by giving Him something — a gift that would represent our all. Some of us should give Jesus gold. We should give money to God's work to the degree that our lifestyle is significantly affected. Others should give frankincense. In the Bible, our prayer is represented by incense (Ps 141:2). We should commit ourselves to a time of prayer and fasting that will in effect be giving our lives to the Lord. Finally, we should give the Lord myrrh. Myrrh is associated with death since it is a perfume used to prepare a dead body for burial. We should give a gift that would force us to die to ourselves. On this great feast of Epiphany, let's be wise enough to give Jesus our all.

Prayer: Jesus, in this season celebrating Your birthday, I give myself and my life to You forever.

Promise: "Rise up in splendor! Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you." —Is 60:1

Praise: "The Gentiles were delighted when they heard this and responded to the word of the Lord with praise. All who were destined for life everlasting believed in it" (Acts 13:48). Praise Jesus, King of the universe! Presentation Ministries



PRESENTARSE COMO REGALO

"Luego, abriendo sus cofres, le ofrecieron dones, oro, incienso y mirra" (Mateo 2:11). Para la mayoría del mundo, la fiesta de Epifanía de hoy es el día más importante de la temporada navideña. Es el día en que muchas personas intercambian regalos e imitan a los sabios que le dieron regalos a Jesús. Hoy el Señor nos llama para ofrecernos nosotros mismos a Jesús como presentes, postrarnos ante Él y rendirle homenaje (Mt 2:11). Al igual que los hombres sabios, deberíamos expresar nuestra entrega total a Jesús dándole algo, un regalo que representaría todo lo nuestro. Algunos de nosotros deberíamos darle a Jesús oro. Deberíamos dar dinero a la obra de Dios, en la medida en que nuestro estilo de vida se vea significativamente afectado. Otros deberían dar incienso. En la Biblia, nuestra oración está representada por el incienso (Sal 141:2). Deberíamos comprometernos a un tiempo de oración y ayuno, que en efecto estará dando nuestras vidas al Señor. Finalmente, debemos darle al Señor mirra. La mirra está asociada con la muerte, ya que es un perfume utilizado para preparar un cuerpo muerto para su entierro. Deberíamos dar un regalo que nos obligaría a morir a nosotros mismos. En esta gran fiesta de la Epifanía, seamos lo suficientemente sabios como para darle todo a Jesús.

Oración: Jesús, en esta temporada cuando celebramos Tu cumpleaños, te entrego mi vida para siempre.

Promesa: "¡Levántate, resplandece, porque llega tu luz y la gloria del Señor brilla sobre ti!" (Is 60:1)

Alabanza: "Al oír esto, los paganos, llenos de alegría, alabaron la Palabra de Dios, y todos los que estaban destinados a la vida eterna abrazaron la fe" (Hch 13:48). ¡Alabado sea Jesús, rey del universo!

La Epifanía de Nuestro Señor

Enero 3, 2021

Queridos feligreses,

¡Los magos finalmente han llegado al pesebre! Como habrás notado en la última semana en la iglesia, los tres reyes se han acercado cada vez más al pesebre. Hoy, cuando celebramos la **Fiesta de la Epifanía** (que significa "manifestación"), su viaje terminó cuando fueron conducidos por la estrella a donde estaban José y María con su hijo recién nacido. Los magos de Oriente tuvieron una "epifanía" cuando Jesús les fue "manifestado". Llegaron al pesebre con sus tres regalos de incienso, oro y mirra para el Niño Jesús. El oro representaba la Divinidad de Jesús, el incienso representaba el reinado de Jesús, y la mirra representaba la humanidad de Jesús. **Hay mucho que contemplar en esta Fiesta de la Epifanía**, mientras continuamos celebrando el Nacimiento de nuestro Señor. *En primer lugar, contemplamos el hecho de que todavía estamos en un viaje de regreso a nuestro Padre Celestial.* Incluso los Magos todavía estaban en un viaje después de la reunión inicial con el Niño Jesús. Diariamente, tenían que renovar su relación con Él, tal como lo debemos hacer todos los días, hasta que finalmente lleguemos a casa. *En segundo lugar, en esta Fiesta de la Epifanía, contemplamos el hecho de que Jesús es el Salvador para todos.* Cuando se manifestó a los Magos, que eran Gentiles, el Señor mostró que la salvación es un regalo para cualquiera que realmente acepte a Jesús en sus vidas, lo que sucede a través de los Sacramentos de nuestra Iglesia Católica. *Finalmente, en esta Fiesta de la Epifanía, contemplamos esos tres dones que los Magos trajeron ante el Señor.* Traemos al Señor nuestros tres dones de "tiempo, talento y tesoro", mientras lo adoramos como comunidad parroquial. Espiritual, física y financieramente, podemos mostrar nuestro amor por Dios y los demás. Que sigamos acercándonos a Jesús, nuestro Rey recién nacido, a medida que comenzamos este año nuevo de 2021. ¡Dios les bendiga!




