Dear Parishioners,

Last weekend in my homily, I mentioned about a woman from Colombia who wanted to be euthanized, because she was suffering from a degenerative disease. Thankfully, the government decided not to allow the euthanasia. I spoke about praying for this woman and all those who are suffering in different ways, that they look to Jesus and His Suffering on the Cross as a source of hope and strength for them. On such example of a person that is doing just that, is Fr. Dana Ambrose Christensen, Obl. OSB. Fr. Christensen has the same degenerative disease as the woman from Columbia, which is called ALS, also known as Lou Gehrig's disease. The following is from Fr. Christiansen's blog (<https://alivingsacrifice.blog/about-fr-dana-christensen/>): *"Praise be Jesus and Mary! I am a priest of the diocese of Sioux Falls, SD ordained on June 3rd, 2005. I have served in many parishes and other assignments in the diocese. I am an Oblate of the Monasterio di San Benedetto in Monte, in Norcia, Italy. The name I received when I became an Oblate was Ambrose, in honor of St. Ambrose of Milan, a fierce defender of the faith. After a pilgrimage to Fatima, where I asked our Lady to make me a saint no matter what it takes, I learned that I likely had ALS. That diagnosis was confirmed in late 2019. Since then, I have retired from active ministry. I now spend most of my time praying before the Blessed Sacrament, writing, and providing commentary on current events on various social media platforms. Since I no longer am able to use my arms or hands, I write using an eye gaze computer, which is controlled by my eyes. Since I am no longer able to speak, writing is my way to preach the gospel to, quite literally, all nations. Even though I can no longer offer the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, I offer myself as a living sacrifice in union with the sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross. I offer myself through the hands of Mary in reparation for the sins which so wound the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. I also offer my sufferings for the Church and for my brother priests. Please pray for me, and know that I pray for all who read my writings."* Let us pray for Fr. Christiansen and all who are suffering, that they may continue to be strengthened by our Lord, and may all of us embrace our crosses in life, giving ourselves as an offering to the Lord. God Bless! Saint Joseph, pray for us!



BLIND FAITH

"Be on your way. Your faith has healed you."
—Mark 10:52 The blind beggar Bartimaeus had faith, and Jesus immediately healed him of blindness (Mk 10:52). Bartimaeus expressed his faith in Jesus vocally, publicly, and repeatedly, even after he was scolded and told to keep quiet (Mk 10:47-48). Bartimaeus also expressed his faith when "he threw aside his cloak, jumped up and came to Jesus" (Mk 10:50). When a blind man throws away his cloak, he had better be healed, or he may never find his cloak. Moreover, a cloak was worth much more in Biblical times, for it was used as collateral and shelter (Dt 24:12-13). Bartimaeus expressed his faith by fearlessly (Mk 10:49) coming to Jesus (Mk 10:50), accepting Jesus as his Rabboni, that is, Teacher (Mk 10:51), and following Jesus, that is, becoming His disciple (Mk 10:52).

To please God, we must live in faith (Heb 11:6). To live for Jesus and to love Him with all our hearts, we need faith. To move mountains (Mt 17:20) and to conquer the world, we must have faith (1 Jn 5:5). To accept the grace of salvation, we must have faith (Eph 2:8). Have faith as Bartimaeus had faith.

Prayer: Lord, I have faith. Help my lack of faith (Mk 9:24, our transl).

Promise: "They departed in tears, but I will console them and guide them." —Jer 31:9

Praise: Praise Jesus of Nazareth (Mk 10:47), Son of David (Mk 10:47, 48), Rabboni (Mk 10:51), "the Resurrection and the Life" (Jn 11:25), Lord, and God! Presentation Ministries

FE CIEGA

"Vete, tu fe te ha salvado" (Marcos 10:52). El mendigo ciego Bartimeo tenía fe y Jesús de inmediato lo sanó de su ceguera. (Mc 10:52). Bartimeo expresó su fe en Jesús vocalmente, pública y repetidamente, aun después de que fuera amonestado y se le dijo de mantenerse callado (Mc 10:47,48). Bartimeo también expresó su fe cuando "arrojando su manto, se puso de pie de un salto y fue hacia Él" (Mc 10:50). Cuando un ciego arroja su manto, más vale que este sanado de lo contrario, nunca encontrara su manto. Además, un manto tenía mucho más valor en tiempos bíblicos, porque se usaba como aval y como albergue (Dt 24:12,13). Bartimeo expresó su fe sin miedo (Mc 10:49) llegando a Jesús (Mc 10:50), aceptando a Jesús como su Rabino, esto es, Maestro (Mc 10:51), y siguiendo a Jesús, esto es, volviéndose su discípulo (Mc 10:52). Para agradar a Dios, tenemos que vivir en fe (Heb 11:6). Para vivir por Jesús y para amarlo con todo nuestro corazón, necesitamos fe. Para mover montañas (Mt 17:20) y conquistar el mundo, tenemos que tener fe. (1 Jn 5:5). Para aceptar la gracia de la salvación, tenemos que tener fe (Ef 2:8). Ten fe como Bartimeo tuvo fe. **Oración:** Señor, tengo fe. Ayúdame con mi falta de fe. (Mk 9:24, nuestra traducción).

Promesa: "Habían partido llorando, pero yo los traigo llenos de consuelo; los conduciré" (Jer 31:9).

Queridos feligreses,

El fin de semana pasado, en mi homilía, mencioné a una mujer de Colombia que quería terminar su vida por medio de la eutanasia porque padecía una enfermedad degenerativa. Gracias a Dios, el gobierno decidió no permitir la eutanasia. Hablé de orar por esta mujer y todos los que están sufriendo de diferentes formas, para que vean a Jesús y su sufrimiento en la cruz como una fuente de esperanza y fortaleza para ellos. Un ejemplo de una persona que está haciendo precisamente eso, está el Padre Dana Ambrose Christensen, Obl. OSB. Padre Christensen tiene la misma enfermedad degenerativa que la mujer de Columbia, que se llama la enfermedad de ALS, también conocida como enfermedad de Lou Gehrig. Lo siguiente es del blog del Padre Christiansen (<https://alivingsacrifice.blog/about-fr-dana-christensen/>): *"¡Alabado sea Jesús y María! Soy sacerdote de la diócesis de Sioux Falls, SD, ordenado el 3 de junio de 2005. He servido en muchas parroquias y otras asignaciones en la diócesis. Soy oblato del Monasterio de San Benedetto en Monte, en Norcia, Italia. El nombre que recibí cuando me convertí en oblato fue Ambrosio, en honor a San Ambrosio de Milán, un feroz defensor de la fe. Después de una peregrinación a Fátima, donde le pedí a Nuestra Señora que me hiciera santo sin importar lo que cueste, supe que probablemente tenía ALS. Ese diagnóstico se confirmó a fines de 2019. Desde entonces, me retiré del ministerio activo. Ahora paso la mayor parte de mi tiempo orando ante el Santísimo Sacramento, escribiendo y proporcionando comentarios sobre eventos actuales en varias plataformas de redes sociales. Como ya no puedo usar mis brazos o manos, escribo usando una computadora de mirada, que es controlada por mis ojos. Dado que ya no puedo hablar, escribir es mi manera de predicar el evangelio, literalmente, a todas las naciones. Aunque ya no puedo ofrecer el Santo Sacrificio de la Misa, me ofrezco como sacrificio vivo en unión con el sacrificio de Jesús en la Cruz. Me ofrezco por las manos de María en reparación por los pecados que tanto hieren al Sagrado Corazón de Jesús y al Inmaculado Corazón de María. Ofrezco también mis sufrimientos por la Iglesia y por mis hermanos sacerdotes. Por favor, oren por mí y sepan que yo oro por todos los que leen lo que escribo".* Oremos por el Padre Christiansen y todos los que sufren, para que sigan siendo fortalecidos por nuestro Señor, y que todos abracemos nuestras cruces en la vida, entregándonos como ofrenda al Señor. ¡Dios les bendiga! San José, ruega por nosotros.







Jesus Cures Our Blindness




In today's Gospel reading, a blind man called Bartimaeus called out to Jesus to cure him.



